When my parents passed, Paul reached out with his condolences and we reconnected like no time had gone by. I still have the heart felt note he sent more than 20 years ago.

He was always worried that being my friend would tarnish the way people thought of me. Like I cared.

He'd almost always be good for an hour long phone call to catch up. And if I called him after midnight to say a drunken "Hello" - he would answer and I'd hear about it the next day.

He would go out of his way to try and take care of things for you if he could. He loved his food, that's because his mom was a hell of a cook. And don't even get me started about his dogs, he would turn into a different man in their presence. And he absolutely loved the square dance activity and the people in it.

I could continue to babble on but right now, I'm still in a little bit of shock. I'm sure there will be more emotions headed my way. Let me just say, he was a hard guy to love, but love him I did.

I'm going to miss you old friend. The old songs will never be the same. I hope peace is finally yours to embrace. Love ya big guy. Safe travels...
