Florida Federation Announces 2025 Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention Theme

With great fanfare at the 2024 Florida State Convention, Dawn DeWitt and Charles Tharp, 2025 Florida State Convention Chairpersons, introduced the theme for the next convention – *Spin the Big Top*. Yes, it's a circus theme. It already sounds like a fun time, doesn't it?

Dawn and Charles are from the Southeast Association and have just completed two years as assistant convention chairman for the 2024 convention. Stay tuned for a lot of new ideas!

First, and most important, the convention will be January 17 – 18, 2025, with the Trail-End Dance on Thursday, January 16, 2025. We will return to the Center at Deltona. We heard numerous good comments about the Center this year and the Center was pleased to have us.

NO REGISTRATION RIBBONS! That's right; no registration ribbons. Dancers interested in registering are given a convention button along with an info sheet containing a QR code. Using that QR code, you can register online as well as purchase fundraising items and your ticket to the dinner show on Friday night. Even if you just register for the convention and then decide later to purchase items or tickets for the dinner show later, you can still go online and order them later. The goal is to have all registrations completed online, but if you still prefer that pen and paper way of doing things, a committee member will assist you with data entry.

When you arrive at the convention, go to the registration desk to check in and receive a ribbon as proof of purchase.

Campers – make arrangements for a special square dance rate at the local campgrounds; promote the convention to the campers

Dangle Dances – establish themes for each of the dangle dances, coordinate with the badge vendor to create dangles for each theme, collect any needed props

Entertainment (Dinner Show): identify caterer and coordinate signing of a contract with a caterer, identify entertainment and negotiate contract, ensure adherence to BMI/ASCAP/SESAC rules by the entertainment, promote the dinner show

Assistant Facilities Chairman – assist Facilities Chairman, coordinate with the Center, be able to answer all questions regarding the Center, negotiate special square dance rate with local hotels

Assistant Lodging Chairman – assist the Lodging Chairman; make contact with the local hotels in an effort to negotiate special square dance rates

Photographer – photograph all convention and related activities, video tape various activities i.e. the kick-off, award presentations, etc., candid shots of dancers, etc. to document for historical value

Publicity – publicize the convention in all Florida publications and various other square dance publications, coordinate with border states to exchange convention flyers for the convention program books

Vendor – schedule vendors for the convention, collect booth rental, be available when the vendors arrive to assist with set-up


