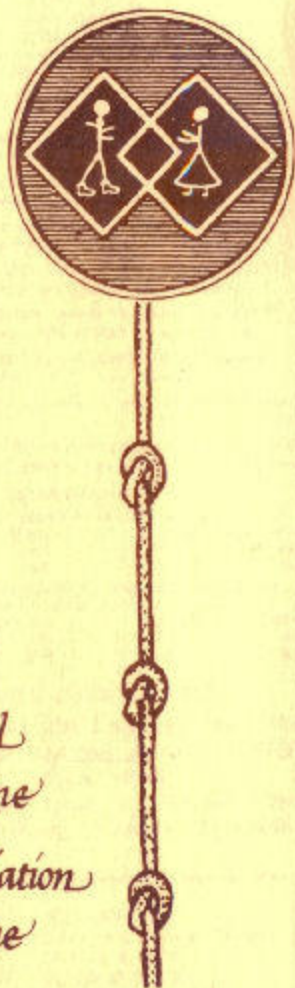

**Testimony of Malcolm R. ("Mac") MacKENZIE
BEFORE THE HOUSE SUBCOMMITTEE
ON CENSUS AND POPULATION
FOR A NATIONAL FOLK DANCE
HR 1706**

My name is Malcolm R. ("Mac") MacKenzie. I am the Past President of the Pensacola Special Steppers and current Co-Chairman of the Committee for Handicapable Dancers of the United Square Dancers of America. The Pensacola Special Steppers, Inc. is a square dance club composed of young adults who are mentally retarded. The Committee for Handicapable Dancers is an organization dedicated to increasing opportunities to learn square dancing for all individuals with handicaps or disabilities. I am not a square dancer, but am the parent of a mentally retarded 25-year-old son, Kenneth, who has been with the Special Steppers since the group was organized. Also, I am an Advocate for handicapped/disabled persons serving as the President Elect of the Association for Retarded Citizens-Escambia County, Florida; as a Board Member of Pensacola (FL) Pen Wheels; as a member of the Committee for Scouting for the Handicapped, Gulf Coast Council; and as a former member of the Florida Governor's Committee on Employment of the Handicapped and the District I Human Rights Advocacy Committee.

The purpose of my Testimony is to show that square dancing is a universal recreation activity which is enjoyed by both the "able-bodied" and the so called "disabled", and deserves positive consideration as our National Folk Dance.

The Pensacola Special Steppers club was started by our Caller, Frank Cherry and his wife, Nancy, in 1978 as a "fun" activity for his Down's Syndrome daughter, Janet, and her friends who were clients of the Escambia County Association for Retarded Citizens (ECARC). Although he and his wife were square dancers, Frank had never had any experience as a "Caller". So with the kind support of the professional Callers in the Florida Panhandle, he learned this activity and proceeded to train a group of 16 young retarded men/women to dance. After a successful performance at the Annual Dinner of the ECARC, the Club received a number of invitations to dance at other community activities during the year.

Based on this experience, a decision was made

in January, 1979 to expand the group and organize it into a Club—the Pensacola Special Steppers. With "Angel Helpers" from a number of the square dance clubs in the Pensacola area, the Club was able to expand to some 65 members. Three different levels of dancers were developed based on demonstrated ability — the Fun Bunch for the more profound dancers; the Promenadors for the intermediate level; and the Exhibition Squares for the highest level dancers.

While the Club's name includes the word "Special", similar to "Special Olympics", (in which *all* of our dancers participate!), the steps which they are taught are the same ones which may be learned in any square dnce club in the world. In fact, the Exhibition Squares perform a number of the movements which are considered to be "Mainstream", a higher level of square dancing.

In April, 1982, the Special Steppers travelled to Washington, D.C. to dance for the President's Committee on Employment for the Handicapped. While in Washington, they joined with square dancers from throughout the country to dance on the West Terrace of the Capitol and at a Congressional Reception in support of the Bill to designate the square dance as the National Folk Dance, which was passed by the House on May 11, 1982, and signed into law on June 1, 1982. This trip also proved to be productive for square dancing for the handi-capped since it resulted in the initiation of a club in North Alabama for a retarded group, and in three invitations for the Pensacola Special Steppers to perform at functions in 1983.

In 1983, these three invitations resulted in the Exhibition Squares travelling some 4,000 miles by bus to perform at:

Lakeland, FL, for 4,000 dancers and spectators at the Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention.

Louisville, KY, for over 30,000 dancers and spectators of the National Square Dance Convention.

DANCING AT THE CAPITOL AND NATIONAL CONVENTION

Dancing at the Capitol on June 27th was the real high point of our 3-week vacation. It was very impressive to see the whole West Terrace of the Capitol covered with brightly-dressed square dancers from all over the country. The turnout was terrific, even in 85° sunshine. There were enough dancers so there was no need to dance every tip, as space was limited; and the heat of the day dictated dancing a tip, and then sitting one out. The terrace was almost filled with dancers for every tip. Several Congressmen were recognized in the sizeable audience present.

The Callers, Cuers, and Clogging Leaders outdid themselves, and they, too represented every part of our country. With the Mall and Washington Monument at your back, the Capitol in front, and a Caller singing "America the Beautiful", you had to get goose pimples.

My first trip to Washington and dancing at the Capitol really made me feel like part of our country's history in the making. (See Page 55 for pictures of this event.)

On to Baltimore — Florida was represented by almost 600 dancers. With Florida Callers and Cuers on the program in every hall every day, the rest of the country got a good chance to see that the Sunshine State has a lot of to offer.

Our Showcase of Ideas was super. The best thing about it was that Florida's display was the first one everyone saw as they entered the Showcase area. How we got that place of honor I'm not sure, but it did give Florida an advantage as no one could miss it, especially with the beautiful "Come Dance Under the Palms" banner prominently displayed.

As the *Bow & Swing* Editors could not get away, Jerry and I represented the magazine at the Press Breakfast. It was interesting to meet other media people and exchange ideas over a delicious breakfast with a ragtime band for entertainment. That is really starting the Convention on an UP note.

With dancing available continuously for 3 days, it's impossible not to enjoy oneself. When our feet needed a rest, there were demo teams to watch. Florida's own "Reflections" were among the best, even under pressure. Having no dressing rooms in the Convention Center and having to make most of their changes in the restrooms, they still did three different demos several times a day and found time for some dancing for fun too. The Blackford's group deserves a pat on the back for their professionalism. They are a credit to Florida.

One thing Baltimore has is good food. Jerry and I sampled seafood, Greek, Oriental, and good old home cooking while there, and it was all *the best!* The Harbor place had everything any taste buds could want, PLUS square dancing. Every day dancers were out in 85°+ heat, dancing and showing Baltimore how to have fun. We danced one tip at the harbor with a German caller who was outstanding. We were surprised when he called "Square Thru 3 hands—ein, zwei, drei". Not what we're used to hearing—but we listened even closer to catch any more German creeping in.

"Civilian" visitors and natives were curious about our costumes and it was commonplace to have some come up and ask if petticoats were hot to wear; why do all the men wear long sleeved shirts in the heat; or do you always dress like that or just at conventions. The City knew we were there. If they didn't see us live, they watched us on TV as we made every newscast for 3 days.

There was so much more to the Convention—from seminars for callers, cuers, dancers, sewing, Legacy—you name it and they offered it. Shopping in the Vendor area offered something for everyone, even photographs against a Baltimore backdrop.

Sunday night came with the Grand Parade of States. Florida's new State Outfits were there and *do* they show up in a large group!

AN IDEA TO EXPAND THE "TAG THE LINE" ENDINGS

The experimental *Linear Cycle* which recently was dropped by the Mainstream QS folks and added to the PLUS program as a part of the program has provided me with the following idea:

the ending action of a "peel to the right" of the Linear Cycle could be added to the Tag the Line endings !!! For example, we could call a Tag The Line...Peel Right. The ending formations would be lines facing or couples facing or Eight Chain Thru formations. At first you would have to review the Peel Right action as many of the dancers who know how to do a Linear Cycle well have been doing it by "ROTE" and not really remembering all the individual parts. While this idea is not going to set the world on fire, it could add another way to use Tag the Line and its variety of ending formations.

DANCING TAG THE LINE .. PEEL RIGHT:

Zero Box: Do Sa Do to an Ocean Wave...Girls Run...Tag the Line...Peel Right...Slide Thru...Left Alle...(zero)

Zero Box: Swing Thru...Boys Run...Tag the Line...Peel Right...Box the Gnat...Right & Left Thru...Pass the Ocean...Recycle...Left Alle...(zero)

Heads Pass Thru...Separate Around One to a Line...Pass Thru...Tag the Line...Peel Right...Pass Thru...U Turn Back...Centers Square Thru Four...Ends Star Thru...Pass the Ocean...Recycle...Slide Thru...Left Alle...(zero box)

Zero Line: Swing Thru...Boys Trade...Boys Run...Tag the Line...Peel Right...Box the Gnat...Square Thru 3/4...Left Alle...

USING THE PLUS QUARTERLY "CHASE THE TAG" WITH THE PEEL RIGHT ENDING:

Zero Line: Pass Thru...Chase the Tag...Peel Right...Touch 1/4...Boys Run...Pass Thru...Left Alle...

Zero Line: Pass Thru...Tag the Line In...Pass Thru...Chase the Tag...Peel Right...(zero line)...Load the Boat...Square Thru 3/4...Left Alle...

Zero Line: Turn Thru...Chase the Tag...Peel Right...Sweep 1/4...Pass the Ocean...Fan the Top...Recycle...Sweep 1/4...Left Alle...

Keep in mind that this is an experimental idea but one which many dancers will be able to pick up and use with a very minimum of workshopping. The Peel Right idea is very danceable and smooth so it just may catch on as another Tag ending action.

TIPS FOR NEWER CALLERS

The first thing I would like to do this month is to give you a sort of break-down on this lovely location. Prescott Valley is just 8 miles out of Prescott proper, on Highway 69, heading for Phoenix, about 90 miles away. Prescott is one mile high in elevation, being 5,300 feet up, practically atop some mountains, and there are beautiful mountains around in any direction you look. There are several lakes that are wonderful for fishing, boating, and picnicking. They are wonderful for family outings, and Winnie and I, with our daughter, her husband and our grandson visited all of them one weekend. Seems that our favorite lake is going to be Goldwater Lake, named after Arizona State Senator Barry Goldwater. There is good fishing there and that's my favorite sport, so it's only natural that I would pick it as my favorite.

I should add that our reason for moving to this area is the fact that our two daughters live within 300 miles of us, so do all of our grandchildren, and being this close to them they can visit us often, and we love being with our family.

I am sure some of you are wondering about Square Dancing which has been my vocation for more than half a century so — yes, there is Square Dancing here. There are several clubs in the area. One of the larger clubs is the 'Mile High Swingers' and they are very active. I will, very soon, be starting classes in the Valley where we live and I will also start working in the school program here. Prescott Valley is one of those places

where schools do not close for the summer. They have school 12 months a year, shorter school days, going on 5 days a week, 52 weeks a year, so there is plenty of work to be done here in the school program, and I have always enjoyed working with youngsters. They learn so fast.

So much for our new home here in Arizona. I'll give you some news from here from time to time but for right now, let's get into some tips for the 'Newer Callers'.

TIPS ON WALK-THRUS -

Over the last half century I have had occasion to watch many new Callers at work, and to them it really was work, simply because they were trying to show off before someone and first thing they knew they were in way over their heads, and the heads of the dancers also.

This comes from trying to call something that they are not sure of themselves. Don't do it! Know your limitations and stay within those limitations. So many of these newer Callers get into some figure and the first thing they know the floor has been thrown and the Caller is as puzzled as the dancers are. In many cases I have seen Callers start to walk something, not knowing exactly where the break-down came, and they walk the entire (memorized) figure, plus the opening and even the breaks. This is something a veteran caller would never do.

NEW PLUS QUARTERLY CHOSEN

Jerry Schatzer, Chairman of the CALLERLAB Plus Quarterly Selections Committee, has announced that the Plus Quarterly Selection for the three month period beginning August 1, 1984 is **LOAD THE TOP**. The definition, timing and dancing examples for this call are as follows:

LOAD THE TOP - Jerry Rash, Author

Starting Formation: Facing Lines of Four - From facing lines, start as in Load the Boat — the Ends move around the outside passing two people and meet the third person with a right Cast Off *Full* around; meanwhile, the Centers Pass Thru, Turn their backs to their partners, Partner Trade with their new partners, step to a momentary (right-hand) wave and Spin the Top; on each side now, the new foursomes Fan the Top, ending in parallel right-hand waves. Ending Formation: Parallel right-hand Ocean Waves. Timing - 20 beats.

Dancing Examples:

Heads Lead to the Right, Circle to a Line (Zero Line), Load the Top, Recycle and Sweep a Quarter, Square Thru $\frac{3}{4}$, Left Allemande.

Heads Square Thru, Slide Thru, Load the Top, Double Swing Thru, All 8 Circulate, Box the Gnat, Right & Left Grand.

Heads Lead to the Right, Circle to a Line (Zero Line), Half Square Thru, Trade By, Slide Thru, Load the Top, Swing Thru, Girls Circulate and Boys Trade, Turn Thru, Left Allemande.

Heads Half Square Thru, Slide Thru, Right & Left Thru, Box the Gnat, Load the Top (a) Right & Left Grand OR (b) Turn Thru, Left Allemande.

THE LANGUAGE OF SQUARE DANCE PROGRAMMING

There seems to be a great deal of variety, and some confusion, regarding the designation of dance programs throughout the square dance world. At conventions, festivals, and club dances; and in various publicity releases and publications, one sees program designations such as MS+, MS Plus, MSQS, Soft Plus, etc. What do these terms mean? Does MS+ indicate that the dancers should know some of the Plus Program? If so, which part? Or does it mean that, in addition to Mainstream Program dancing, there will be some sort of added attraction? The MS Plus designation is similarly vague and confusing.

Terms such as Soft Plus really tell us nothing, since the "soft" part, like beauty, is in the eye of the beholder (or, probably, the caller for the evening). When one sees the MSQS designation, he probably assumes that the dancer will be expected to know something about Quarterly Selections. However, does that mean all Quarterly Selections, only the current Quarterly Selection, or something else? Even more important is the fact that the Quarterly Selection Program was never intended to be a regular dance program. The latest publication of the CALLERLAB Basic and Mainstream Programs makes that clear with this statement: "There is no program called Mainstream Quarterly Selections Program. Those experimental calls are intended for use in Mainstream Workshops. No dancer is required to know the QS calls to attend a MS open dance. If such calls are used, the caller is to teach them if necessary. Please advertise dance programs as MS *not* MSQS.

Proper program designations help dancers to find that dance where they can be most comfortable and can have the greatest enjoyment. They also tell callers the program they are expected to call. We need to be more specific and careful in designating

In the first place he would most likely never call something that far over the heads of the dancers. However, if he did happen to get himself into something like this, he would know instantly what threw the dancers and would simply give a quick walk-thru on that particular figure.

Should you happen to be a guest caller at some dance, resist the temptation to show the regular Caller how fancy you can get, mostly at the expense of the dancers.

Here are a few suggestions:

Have your Liaison Officer (spouse) on the floor, and look at her/him occasionally for

None of that old 'guess we better walk that part', implying that the dancers need help. You may fool the poor beginner, who thinks everything is his fault anyway, but the old hands know what you did. Just a simple 'I goofed' makes everybody happy.

0Hollywood, FL, for the Annual Civitan International Convention.

The reception accorded our dancers was heart-warming with standing ovations given after each "Tip" (dance). These performances and all of those by the Club are for the specific purposes in our Charter, i.e. "To promote public awareness of what mentally retarded persons can learn and achieve", and to provide the Club members with a wholesome kind of recreation to help them develop their social and communication skills.

At the "National" in Louisville last year, we had our first opportunity to watch square dancing by individuals in wheelchairs. Among the spectators observing their performance, no one was more impressed and moved by it than our retarded dancers who watched with much empathy. It was also this performance which moved Frank Cherry and me to develop the concept of a national organization to provide oversight to square dancing activities on behalf of handicapped/disabled persons and to promote the expansion of the opportunities for square dancing to all of these individuals who desire to learn. The organization will work with square dance groups; organizations serving the handicapped/disabled; and the various fraternal and social organizations which are dedicated to helping the handicapped/disabled. We submitted a proposal to the United Square Dancers of America (USDA) to establish a *Committee for Handicapable Dancers* within the structure of that organization which has a nationwide structure of member organizations which serve the interests of square dancers. They approved the organization in January, 1984 with Frank & Nancy Cherry, and my wife, Chieko, and me appointed as Committee Co-Chairmen. Please note that we have selected a title of our Committee which emphasizes the positive aspects of all of the individuals whom we intend to serve.

We are in the initial organizing and publicity phase of the Committee. Today (June 28, 1984), I will have the pleasure of serving on a Panel at the National Square Dance Convention in Baltimore on "Working with

the Handicapped", and will have the opportunity to brief all USDA members during the Convention. We have received statements of support from Bob Osgood, The Sets in Order, American Square Dance Society, and the "Lloyd Shaw Foundation", a non-profit organization dedicated to recalling, restoring, and teaching the folk dances of the American people. In response to the letter about the Committee, Ms. Enid Cocke, President of the Lloyd Shaw Foundation said, in part:

"... I was impressed to read about the accomplishments of the Pensacola Special Steppers and to learn of the steps you have taken to establish a national organization. I hope you won't be disappointed if my response is "right on" rather than a list of suggestions. I think that you have taken some excellent steps to create a place in the modern square dance movement for the disabled and handicapped. The U.S.D.A. is the most appropriate organization for your committee because they have contacts and members throughout the country..."

On behalf of current and future *Handicapable Dancers*, we sincerely and squarely recommend approval of the Bill, HR 1706, by your Committee, and support of its passage in the House. The President's Proclamation of November 28, 1983 designated the years 1983 through 1992 as the "National Decade of Disabled Persons", but let's pass this legislation and make it the "Millennium of the National Folk Dance—The Square Dance!!

dance programs, and club officers and dancers need to be more insistent that callers adhere to the advertised program. Use of vague and incorrect programming language leads to confusion and frustration.

Use of the proper terms aids both dancers and callers.

Credible Accreditation??? Incredible !!!

Accredit - to give credit or authority; to bring into credit or favor; to authorize; give credentials to (Second College Edition New World Dictionary).

Members of a number of different professions are accredited so that those who seek their services will have an indication of their competence. The CALLERLAB caller accreditation program operates in this vein. Any qualified caller may seek and obtain accreditation regardless of whether he or she is a member of CALLERLAB. Members and subscribers are required to become accredited within 2 years after affiliation and re-accreditation is required every 6 years.

A caller must be accredited as a general caller and may also opt to become accredited in any or all of 4 specialty areas: one night stands, rounds, contras, and advanced dancing. Accreditation is accomplished by obtaining signatures of 3 CALLERLAB members in good standing and is based upon a point system, with 20 points required for accreditation. The areas in which a caller can acquire points are: Primary Calling Skills, Specialty Calling Skills, and Experience. A caller who qualifies in the Primary Calling Skills area may earn an additional point for training by having a CALLERLAB accredited Caller-Coach certify that he or she has completed a program of caller training based upon the recommended curriculum.

In the Experience category, the accreditator certifies that he or she has personal knowledge that the applicant has been an active caller (an average of at least 50 dances a year) for the number of years indicated. Re-accreditation requires the signature of only one accreditator to verify that the applicant has continued his standing as

an active caller during the 6 years since his or her last accreditation.

Accreditors cannot exchange signatures. That is, a caller cannot sign the application of another caller if that other caller has been one of his accreditors. The accreditation process is meant to be taken seriously and without any "you scratch my back, I'll scratch yours" implications. Callers are encouraged to seek CALLERLAB accreditation, and those who sign accreditation applications are reminded that their signatures should be valuable and carefully controlled commodities, not given lightly.

Categories of Affiliation

CALLERLAB has several types of membership as well as a number of ways in which non-members can become affiliated with the organization. In some instances, the difference from one category to another may be quite small. That, and the fact that the word "member" sometimes is tacked on incorrectly to the name of a non-member category, causes confusion.

A **MEMBER** must be an active caller, subscribe to the CALLERLAB Code of Ethics, pay dues, and attend the annual Convention at least once every 3 years (6 years for overseas members). An active caller is defined as one who calls an average of at least one full dance each week and at least 50 dances each year. To qualify, a caller must have been an active caller for the 3 most recent years.

Other categories of membership are: *Associate Member*, and *Gold Card Member*. There are no other categories of membership. The category closest to that of a member is the **SUBSCRIBER**. This caller meets all requirements of full membership except physical attendance at an annual CALLERLAB convention.

A recognized callers' organization may become an **AFFILIATE** organization of CALLERLAB through a chartering process. Within 3 years of joining, at least one of the members of the affiliated organization must be or become a CALLERLAB member who attends an annual CALLERLAB convention once every 3 years.

The categories other than **MEMBER** will be more fully defined in the September issue of *Bow & Swing*.
