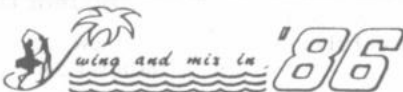

THE PLUS PROGRAM

A Look at Teaching Ping to a Diamond

When we reported the Quarterly Selection *Ping to a Diamond*, the definition given to us included the use of a 1/2 Split Circulate action. I have found that not only is this an unnecessary way to teach the call, it is very confusing to many of the Plus dancers. I have revised my teach of the call to make it much easier for the dancers to grasp and dance the action.

First, as I suggested, start from the 1/4 tag formation with the wave made up of 4 girls or 4 boys. Let's start with the girls in the wave:

Step 1. I tell the girls to extend to a wave; then tell all to extend to have the boys form the center wave and have the girls make one right face turn and the Diamonds will be formed.

Step 2. I then explain the action will follow in the starting pattern of a Ping Pong Circulate. The wave (girls) will extend and with the boys Pass Thru without stopping. The boys will step into the wave as the girls 1/4 right face.

Step 3. I further explain that when starting in the center wave you will end up as the **POINTS** of the diamond. When starting as the outside couple you will end as the centers of the forming diamond. Then let the action develop with several dance examples with the girls starting in the 1/4 tag wave then switch the boys into the starting 1/4 tag formation as the wave dancers and repeat the teaching sequence.

Exploring Track II

Most plus dancers have very little difficulty dancing Track II once they catch on to the teach presented by the caller. I would like to share my method of presenting Track II and how I follow up with some DBD to provide the variety of positions available when used from a variety of dancer relationships available from the completed Double Pass Thru Formation.

I start in the normal boy-girl partner setup in the completed double pass thru formation. I have the number two girl and boy place their arm on the shoulder of the leader. I explain this is an "engine and caboose" position. I then explain that we are doing a "railroad" type call that calls for us to switch tracks. I tell the boys in their engine and caboose position that they will walk single file to the right around the girls beside them—as soon as they reach the other side, the engine will uncouple the caboose and circulate one position while the caboose simply stands still. Boys, you will become the ends of a wave that will be formed at the end of the call. I then say to the girls that they will switch tracks by walking single file to their left INTO the boys' tracks. Once around the turn, the engine will let go of the caboose and circulate one spot as the girl caboose stands still. Girls, you will become the centers of the

TIPS FOR NEWER CALLERS

Les Gotcher

PAIR OFF HOW & WHERE TO USE IT

I have found that Pair Off works beautifully when teaching a beginner class how to Square While Pair Off is not on the Basics List, it is a handy tool when teaching beginner dancers. I teach Pair Off ahead of Square Thru so that I can use it to show where they will end the Square Thru. For instance, I have "Heads Pair Off". Then I explain that this is exactly where the Square Thru will end. After the dancers do the Pair Off a few times, then I go ahead and teach the Square Thru. I then, of course, teach the same thing to the sides, showing where the Square Thru ends. After working the heads awhile, then working the sides awhile, so that everyone understands, I get everyone working by using something like this:

**Heads Pair Off - Pair Off again -
California Twirl - Pair Off again -
California Twirl - Pair Off Again -
California Twirl - Pair Off again -
California Twirl - (back to zero) -**

Each time I have them do the Pair Off, I stop and explain to them that this is exactly where they would be if we used a Square Thru instead of using the Pair Off. They get this set in their minds and then we start doing the same thing by using the Square Thru instead of the Pair Off. Call everything exactly the same except you will have them do a Square Thru everywhere you had been doing the Pair Off. Something like this:

**One and Three will Square Thru
Count four hands and when you do
Square Thru with the outside two**

Count four then -
California Twirl
Now Square Thru
four hands 'round
Count four hands -
California Twirl
Now Square Thru
four hands 'round
Count to four then -
California Twirl
Now Square Thru
just one more
time

Then California Twirl You're doin'
fine
You're lookin' at corner, Left
Allemande . . .



After they are doing this with ease, they are ready for just about anything you want to do with the Square Thru, four hands. I have found that it really helps beginners to show them where they should be when a call is completed. I explain to them that it is just as important to know where the call ends as it is to learn how to do it. I have shown them where the 'four' hand Square Thru ends. Now I am ready to show them where the 3/4 Square Thru ends. Instead of using Pair Off here, I use a California Twirl. This lets them know where they should be at the end of the 3/4 Square Thru. First I have the Heads do the California Twirl. Then I have them Square Thru 3/4, explaining to them that they *MUST* know where it ends and that they are not to go any further. Then I work the sides doing the same thing. Next I lead them to lines of four and we work the same thing. After we have them doing this, and knowing where to stop, I get into something like this:

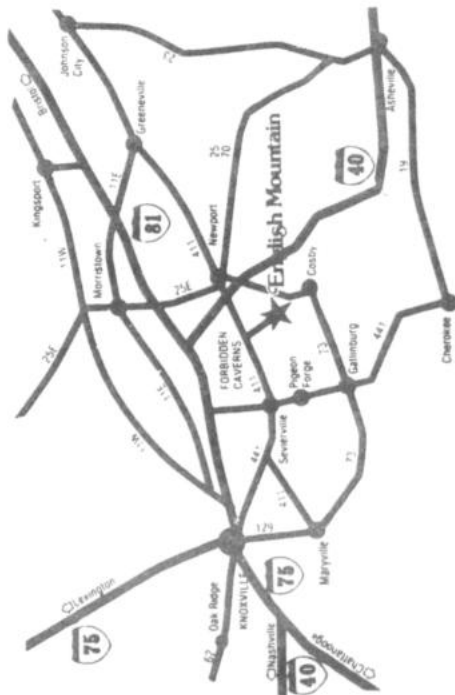

FLORIDA FEDERATION OF SQUARE DANCERS

BANNER STEALING GUIDELINES

PURPOSE: The object of banner stealing is to promote friendly visits between clubs. Do not over-patronize a select few but spread your club around. If you are going to be a banner bandit, be a good one, abiding by the guidelines and make a practice of retrieving your banner before stealing someone else's. In applying these guidelines, use good judgment at all times.

1. A banner may be stolen or retrieved by a minimum of one full square, displaying club badges of the club they are representing and by paying guest admission.
2. A club cannot steal a banner or retrieve its banner when their club caller is a guest caller of the club they are visiting, nor can a caller or his partner participate as part of the banner stealing/retrieving party.
3. Recommend that not more than 3 traveling banners be available. Banners cannot be reserved. However, as a courtesy to the host club, it is highly recommended that a stealing club contact the intended host club prior to going to steal a banner. This will preclude disappointment of no banner being available. IOU's or "substitute" articles are not recommended as being permissible in lieu of the banner.
4. Banners should be available to any open dance on the host club's regular dance night and location unless advertised as a special dance.
5. Recommend that travel be limited to a maximum of 100 miles round trip unless mutual agreement is made with intended host club.
6. A banner raiding party, regardless of size, should not retrieve and steal banners at the same dance.
7. The first FULL banner stealing party to sign the host club's guest register should be awarded the traveling banner. It is recommended that not more than one banner by "stolen" per dance.
8. Banners should not be stolen from clubs whose dances are scheduled for the same night as the club dance of the stealing club.
9. A club should not steal a banner from another club more often than once every 90 days. It is discourteous for a banner to remain in limbo more than 90 days.
10. The banner stealing party should dance for at least three full square dance tips to be eligible to steal the banner.

The 3rd successful Beach Bash was planned and coordinated by Seaside Stompers Presidents Virginia and Al Cook. The club extends a big "yellow rock" to them for all their time and effort on this dance—the Seaside Stompers' biggest fund raiser for the year.

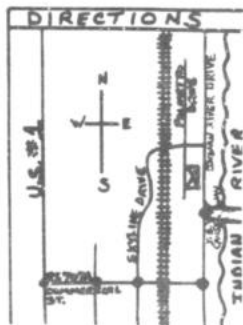

forming right hand wave. READY, let's try—TRACK II: The action can be broken into two separate parts by having the boys go first then the girls doing their part but usually I try it all together, and, if necessary, break it down further. This method will work well from any makeup of the completed double pass thru formation.

Dancing Track II From the Four Major Starting Positions

Standard boy-girl completed double pass thru formation: *Zero Line: Pass Thru; Wheel & Deal; Double Pass Thru; Track II; Swing Thru; Boys Trade; Boys Run; Wheel & Deal; Pass Thru; Left Alle. . .*

1/2 Sashayed Couples: *Zero Line: Pass Thru; Wheel & Deal; Centers Right & Left Thru; All Rollaway 1/2 Sashay; Double Pass Thru; Track II; Boys Trade; Turn Thru; Left Alle . . .*

Completed Double Pass Thru with boys as leaders in each column: *Heads Pass Thru; Separate around one to a line; Pass Thru; Wheel & Deal; Zoom; Double Pass Thru; Track II; Boys Run Right; Right & Left Thru; Dixie Style to a Left Alle . . .*

Completed Double Pass Thru with the girls as leaders: *Zero Line: Pass Thru; Wheel & Deal & Spread; Pass Thru; Wheel & Deal; Double Pass Thru; Track II; Scoot Back; Boys Run; Star Thru; Pass Thru; Trade By; Box the Gnat; Grand Right & Left . . .*

Once these basic four are easily danced, you can add to the fun of Track II. (NOTE: The completed double pass thru formation is also set up by calling a TAG THE LINE. It sometimes surprises dancers to hear a Track II after a Tag the Line, but it's there.)

Zero Line: Pass Thru; Tag the Line; Track II; Swing Thru; Walk & Dodge; Partner Trade; & Roll; Grand Right & Left.

CALLERLAB ADVANCED Quarterly Selection . . . CHECKOVER

Checkover is not a brand new idea. It goes back at least 5 or 6 years, which may tell us that the newer crop of experimentals are not of the same quality that we had years back.

Starting formation: Columns.

The Action: The lead two in each column will do a Checkmate the Column action; that is, walk single file around the adjacent column and move all the way down to the "foot" of the column then face into the center to form the in-facing couple. The trailing two circulate to form the "scoot back" box, then cast off three quarters and the very centers of that wave will slither (slide nose to nose) forming a two-faced line which will then extend to become the out-facing couple in the parallel two faced lines.

Ending Formation: Parallel two-faced lines.

Teaching Hints: The CALLERLAB release explains the call well for the A-2 dancer but the A-1 dancer is not familiar with Checkmate nor Slither. So you can teach the call without using these terms—as explained in the above paragraph.

I find it helps to start the action with two boys/girls as leaders of the columns so you can explain the action of the lead two boys do this as the trailing two boys do that. Also—tell the trailing two that as they move up to form the box, it is the one facing out of the box who will do the slide nose to nose part and they can anticipate this action to start the sliding or crossing portion as the cast off 3/4 nears completion. This will allow for the action to dance smoothly—not in segments as if you first completed the cast off 3/4 and formed the wave, then the centers slither.

Comments: The call can dance very smoothly and is not difficult to catch onto nor is it difficult to use from the DBD standpoint. The forming of the scoot back box by the trailing two is very much like the action by the trailers doing a transfer the column.

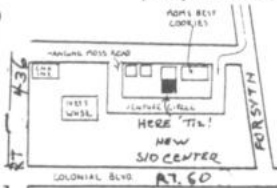

Convention Report

CALLERLAB, the International Association of Square Dance Callers, recently completed its 12th Annual Convention at the Phoenix Hyatt Regency April 1-3, 1985 with more than 1100 callers and partners in attendance. The theme of the convention was "Music - Our Greatest Ally".

At the opening session, the American Square Dance Society presented the prestigious "Silver Spur" award to Herb and Erna Egender of Aurora, Colorado.

The highlight of the Tuesday evening banquet was the presentation of CALLERLAB's most coveted award, the Milestone Award, to two members — Jon Jones of Arlington, Texas, and Dick Leger of Bristol, Rhode Island.

The Chairman's Award was presented by Chairman Bob Van Antwerp to John Kaltenthaler for his dedication and significant contributions to CALLERLAB. Awards of Excellence were presented to retiring Board members Jerry Haag, Dave Taylor, and Don Williamson. Those members from overseas attending for the first time were presented with a Small World Award, and Quarter Century certificates were presented to members who have been calling for 25 years.

Cal Golden, Hot Springs, Arkansas, was elected as Chairman of the Board, with Norm Cross, Milnor, North Dakota elected to serve as Vice-Chairman. Don Hanhurst, Fort Myers, Florida, Jon Jones, Arlington, Texas, and Martin Mallard, Saskatoon, Canada were elected to the CALLERLAB Executive Committee as well. John Kaltenthaler was re-appointed as Executive Secretary and Herb Egender was re-appointed Assistant Executive Secretary.

At the Convention, the members voted, almost unanimously, to add a new category of CALLERLAB affiliation - the **CALLERLAB APPRENTICE**.

For some time there has been concern that newer, and usually younger, callers who cannot qualify for member or subscriber

status do not have ready access to up-to-date information from CALLERLAB. Many of these callers have expressed a desire to receive CALLERLAB publications and even to attend the annual convention. The wisdom of providing these future leaders with proper training and guidance is apparent and the action of the membership is in the best interests of Square Dancing.

The **CALLERLAB Apprentice** is not a member and will not be referred to as such. Specific details are as follows:

The new category of affiliation will be called CALLERLAB Apprentice and will **NOT** be considered membership in any way.

He/she may be a caller who does not meet the requirements for membership such as calling 50 dances per year or once a week for the three most recent years.

He/she may attend the CALLERLAB Conventions in a **NON-VOTING** capacity upon request and payment of the current fees.

He/she gets **NO VOTE** and **MAY NOT SERVE** on committees.

Conversion to fullmember may be made when, and only when, **ALL** requirements for full membership are satisfied.

After attending a convention and subsequently meeting criteria for membership, he/she could convert to full membership upon written application.

Accreditation would not have to be completed until two years after becoming a subscriber or full member.

Dues would be the same as for a Member or Subscriber.

The identification badge would be similar but different than member/subscriber.

With this category, many additional callers will be able to take advantage of the experience of the outstanding leadership available through membership. The opportunity to attend conventions should result in an overall improvement in the teaching and calling skills of the newer callers. ALABAMA BOUND

FOR RV'S & CAMPERS

For those attending the 34th National Square Dance Convention in Birmingham, Alabama June 27-29, the Alabama State Fairgrounds located just 8 minutes from the Convention Center has been contracted for use by campers during the 34th National Square Dance Convention. The Fairgrounds is located on 3rd Avenue West, easily accessible from the Interstate system. A directional map is provided each camper upon confirmation of registration.

Camping fee of \$50.00 covers camping from Wednesday until noon Sunday. This is a flat fee with no extra charge for additional persons per unit. Early parking available at a cost of \$18.00 per day.

2000 spaces - some on grass, some on asphalt - are available on a first register basis.

Limited Full Hook-ups. Every effort will be made to provide electrical hookup to every unit. Many water hookups are available; easy access to water for units not on direct hookup. Limited shower facilities are available, as well as ample restrooms, refuse

containers and onsite dumping stations. Waste water will not be allowed to run onto the ground.

A separate area will be provided for those wishing to run generators.

For your convenience there will be an on-site restaurant, pay telephones, and a first aid station.

Around the clock security will be provided by fairground patrol and volunteers of the Convention Committee.

Metro transportation will be available from fairgrounds to Convention Center on a scheduled basis at nominal cost, Thursday through Saturday.

No ground fires permitted. However, grills may be used as long as the charcoal is disposed of properly, not dumped on the ground.

Pets will be permitted only when they are on a leash.

Trail-end party will be held on Wednesday evening in the Arena.

WHERE TO DANCE BY REGION

SOUTHEAST FLORIDA

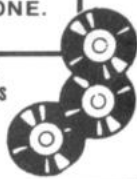
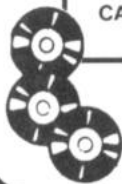
