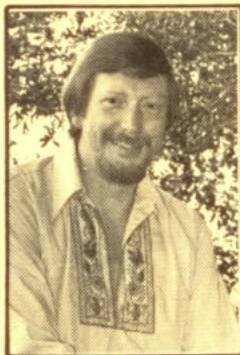

Publisher's Message

"A YELLOWROCK BY ANY OTHER NAME..."

I'm always a little amazed when someone comes up with a new idea on an old theme. Before the fact, who would have thought that running would have caught the public's fancy in the form of jogging; or that exercising to music could possibly have any mass appeal with an unusual name like aerobics; or that the old mountain-style buck and wing could "fly" in a tap dancer's shoe and become popular as clogging. Better yet, who, in their wildest dreams, would envision professional football as a summer sport. Yet, stranger things have happened.

Since Springtime, it's rumored, is known to dazzle a young man's fancy, some worthy, light-hearted thought follows. Lately, I have been wondering just what the next "biggie" will be that'll grab the boot straps of the American public — and it just might be (here it comes) — Hug Therapy!

Now, whether you know it or not, quite a bit is being said and written these days about the "lost art" of hugging and touching. Newspapers and magazines are giving space to the subject and talk shows are touting its' worth. Prof. E. Beier, University of Utah, states in a fairly recent issue of American Health magazine, "Hugging is so big these days that it even has a club with a newsletter, T-shirts and hugwork you do at home."

The professor goes on to say, "Studies have shown that hugging relieves the urge to be touched, eases stress, and when it comes to saying 'I love you,' is worth a thousand words." Hug Club founder John Thrash adds, in the same magazine article, "We have a formula: four hugs a day for survival,

eight hugs for status quo and twelve hugs for growth."

Hugging — a "lost art"? A Yellowrock by any other name is still a Yellowrock. Those of us who square dance sneak a sly smile when told hugging is a lost art. We've known for a long time that square dancing and the yellowrock eases stress, creates a sense of well-being, and conveys genuine friendliness not found in other walks of life.

Frankly, I like what I read and hear about hug therapy. The premise is simple enough for people to understand (who doesn't like a hug?) and the "practice" itself can easily fit into most people's daily schedule. It's an excellent example of a new variation from an old theme. It's salable.

It just may be the next big thing in America — not just because of the gimmick value, but because the simple fact is — we all want to like and to be liked by those around us.

Let's see, if someone could come up with a unique idea that would combine hugging and touching with physical and mental exercise, include some colorful outfits and add a dash of music to it — now, that would really be a winner!!

Wait a minute — did I just describe square dancing? I sure did. You mean we've got something that's salable? We sure do. Next time you sing the praises of square dancing to someone who hasn't been introduced to it — tell them we have a formula: 4 yellowrocks a night for survival, 8 yellowrocks for status quo, 12 yellowrocks for growth and 16 of them for — happiness!!

Yellowrock Therapy — it has a nice ring to it.

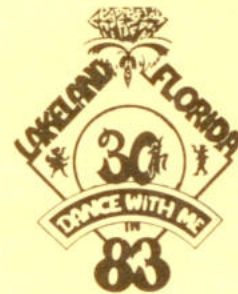

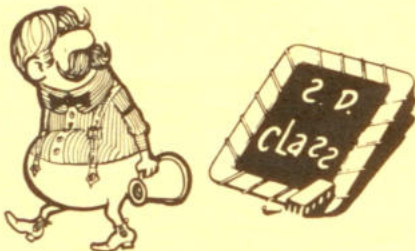

If, on the other hand, a club is labeled "P," then it will be dancing all calls in the Plus list, QS and MS lists. 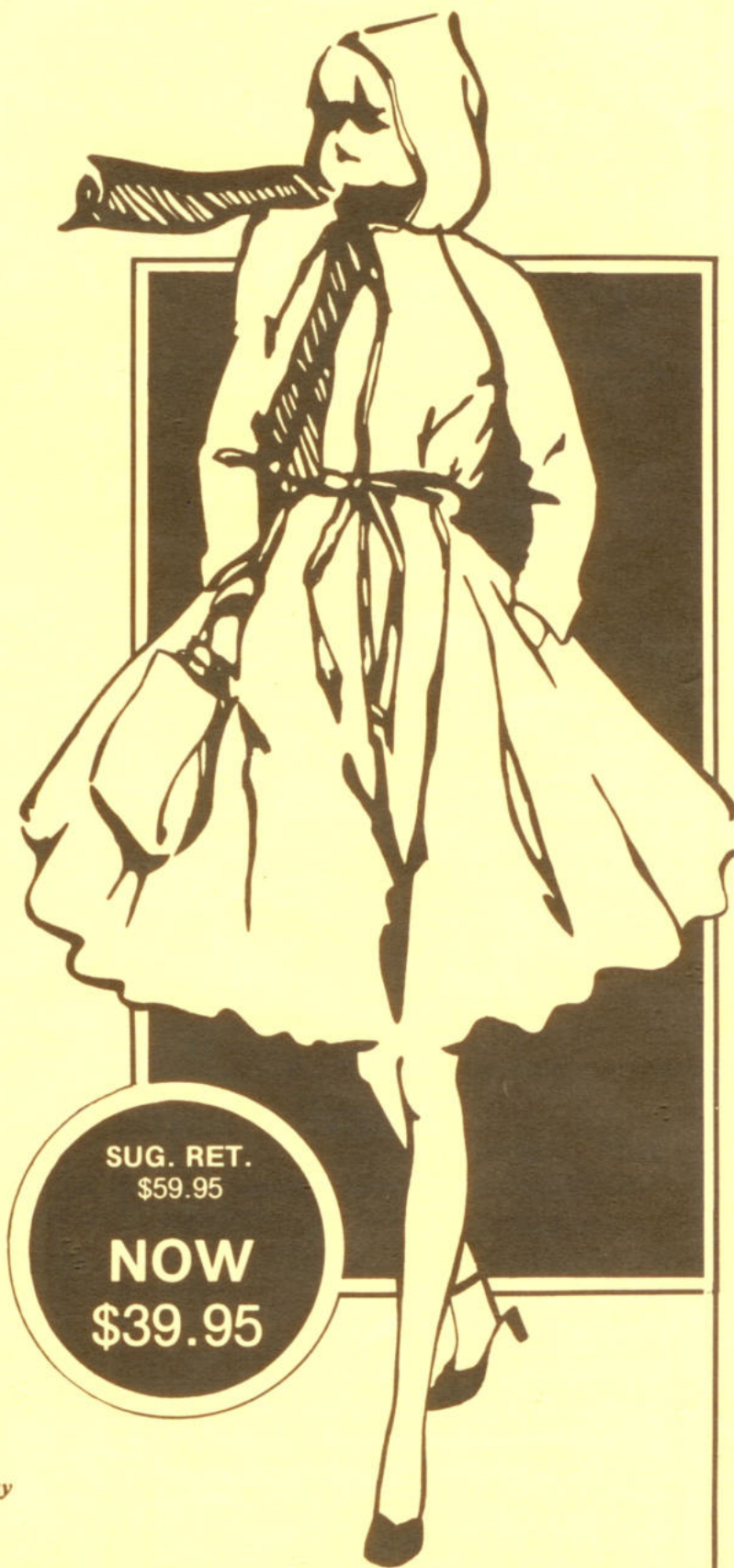

THE CALLER REPORT

by Whit Brown

With the coming of Spring also comes the time for those beginner square dance classes that started back in the fall of last year to graduate. A lot has been said about how that shiny new dancer should proceed as he moves into the world of Square Dancing. I think that some of it bears repeating in answer to the question that is so often asked, "Where do we go from here?"

Callers, clubs and dance leaders everywhere seem to be becoming more and more aware of the fact that Modern Western Square Dancing has become quite a complex animal. In years gone by, it was possible for some graduating dancers to move into the next level of dancing without spending a lot of time at their present level. With a few exceptions, it is not really possible or advisable for the new Mainstream dancer to start into Plus workshops right away. Floor time at the Mainstream level is needed to "burn in" what has been learned.

Callers and dance leaders have been learning the hard way (by watching new dancers drift away

from Square Dancing) that dancers rushing into the next level too soon is damaging to the activity.

Presently, in the Central Florida



area, there are many opportunities for Mainstream dancing. More and more clubs are offering dancing geared to the newly graduated dancer to provide the opportunity to file off the rough edges and just enjoy the newly developed skills. Hope-

fully, those opportunities will be taken advantage of by the new Mainstreamers.

We as callers sometimes seem to skip over the mainstream figures to get into more "meaty" material. As we all know however, there are more combinations and variations than we will ever be able to use within the Mainstream level. There are good useable ones there if we dig a little and do our homework.

So, where do we go from here? New dancers . . . experienced dancers finding they have problems at the Plus level . . . experienced dancers doing well at the Plus level . . . attend a Mainstream dance looking for the great joy and fun that exists there, as it does at all levels. Let us as callers show you the interesting and challenging and fun dancing available at the Mainstream level.

Dancing at different clubs and to a variety of callers, meeting other area dancers, along with practicing newly acquired skills should bring you to the reason we Square Dance.

**PART I: THE WHY AND HOW OF IT —
IN CENTRAL FLORIDA**

SQUARE DANCE WEEK '83

(This article is part one of a two-part informative series concerned with the advanced planning and promotion of a successful, effective format for Square Dance Week '83 in Central Florida. — The Editor.)

For some time now, there has been a growing feeling among callers and dancers in this area that Square Dance Week observed every year in September could be more productive; that we had a greater potential to reap greater rewards. With these thoughts in mind, the Central Fla. Callers Association and the Central Fla. Square & Round Dance Association joined hands last Fall to form a steering committee to plan and promote a coordinated program of all dance activities in the Central area during National Square Dance Week, September 19-25, 1983.

Danny Robinson was named coordinator of the committee, and recently an organizational and structural planning meeting was held. Named to serve on the committee were John and Esther Layne,

Orlando; Grady and Wanda Jones, Leesburg; Mike Ferguson, Clermont; Whit Brown, Casselberry; Bob and Carol Woodard, Deltona; George and Rita Deschambeau, Longwood; and Lorrie Sprigg, Casselberry. In the coming weeks, several other committee members will be named.

THE "WHY" OF IT

The Square Dance Week Steering Committee will provide a positive force in pulling together all dancers, callers, clubs, and associations to produce a concerted effort in drawing public attention to square dance activities in Central Florida. The "why" of this year's campaign is obvious — to enhance the public image of square dancing; to sharpen public awareness to the joy and rewards of the activity; and to attract new recruits into the Fall beginner classes.

THE "HOW" OF IT

The Steering Committee is really a "representative" committee. Realizing Central Florida covers a lot of

miles, the over-all area has been broken down into regions which encompass major towns and cities. Each member on the steering committee "represents" a region within Central Florida and serves as that region's chairman. Each chairman's duties include establishing a regional sub-committee which actually organizes and plans the week-long celebration at the local level.

Within the structure of the Steering Committee is a working crew of "communicators." Their job is to establish a two-way communication line between the regional sub-committees and the news media. In the weeks to come, before and during Square Dance Week, the Steering Committee through the collected efforts of many workers will "roll up its sleeves" in preparation for the biggest and most responsive square dance celebration ever. It's an opportunity we can't afford to miss.

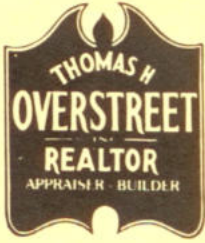

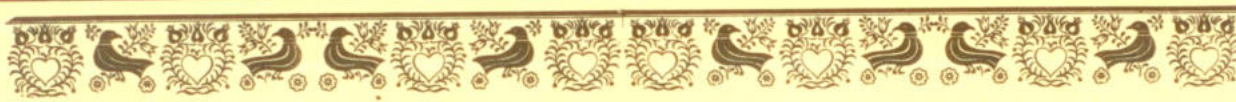
