CALLERLAB "O.K.'S" REVISED BASICS LIST

At its recent convention in Kansas City, Callerlab members sat down and ironed out a new revised list of Basics for Mainstream and Plus Programs. (Complete Basics List appears on page 11). Several changes reflect significant differences from previous lists.

The Mainstream lists consists of two segments. The Basic Program reflects a combination of the previous Basic and Extended Basic Programs. The calls are the same although there are some changes in suggested teaching order and there are some minor changes in the way in which the calls appear. The new Basics List has been designed to be taught in 29, two and one-half hour sessions and has been frozen for a period of three years. The Mainstream portion is also frozen for three years, but may have quarterly selections added during that period.

The Plus Lists reflect some major changes. Several Quarterly Selections were added to the Plus One list and two Plus Two calls were moved to the Plus One list. The end result is that the Plus One list is now 17 calls long. Three calls were dropped from the Plus Two list, i.e., swap around, curley cross, and all eight swing thru. Grand swing thru and 3/4 tag the line have been added. The Plus One and Plus Two plateaus, most likely, will be combined into a single Plus category at next year's Callerlab Convention in Reno, Nevada.

SQUARE DANCE WEEK: SEPT. 21-27

All Square dancers, clubs, classes and callers are invited to participate in the 1981 "official" Square Dance Week — September 21-27.

The dates starting with the third Monday and continuing through the following Sunday of September each year are timed to coordinate with the start of new-dancer classes throughout North America. With the combined efforts of all dancers, their clubs and associations, this unified week of celebration takes on the appearance of a mammoth promotional campaign. Proclamations of local, state and provincial leaders put square dancing into the view of millions.

One-night-stands, exhibitions before service groups and in shopping malls bring the non-dancing public into direct contact with this favor-

ite pastime with the result that many will be attracted into classes starting soon after Square Dance Week.

An official yearly project of LEGACY, the international square dance leaders' communications group, which represents all facets of the square dance activity, the goal of this year's observance is 100% participation by all square dancers and square dance groups with the ultimate goal of increasing the interest and participation in this great activity.

Information concerning Square Dance Week in the Central Florida area should be forthcoming in the next several weeks. Dancers are asked to check with their own local clubs and callers as to specific program plans.

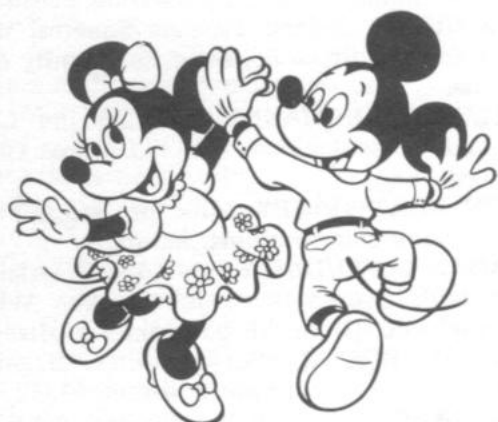

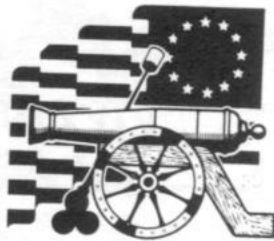

Your Guide To Better Dancing —

If you are planning a "dance-visit" to a square dance club in the area, it would be most helpful to you if you check the "dance level" of that club before you visit. Note that all levels include the calls from each of the previous (earlier) plateaus. For instance, if a club is labeled QS, then it will be dancing any call from the Mainstream Program (MS) and the current Quarterly Selections. If, on the other hand, a club is labeled +1 level, then it will be dancing all calls in the Plus One list, the QS list and MS list. The Dance Legend, herein listed, is designed to help you "match" your dance experience with the area clubs in order that each dance-visit will be more enjoyable.

DANCING'S REWARD — IT'S PEOPLE

I enjoyed the 28th Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention. WE (Dodie and I) were in Lakeland to have a week-end vacation. If you genuinely like people and their company then you will find that people will like you. That is when the joy will be there in dancing and being together. Try it — you'll like it.

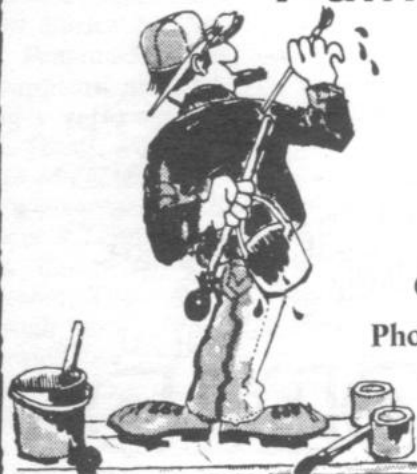
