1300 ATTEND CALLERLAB CONVENTION

It was the biggest ever! More than 1300 callers, partners and guests were in attendance. The location was Reno, Nevada's fabulous MGM Grand Hotel and the recent event was the 9th International Callerlab Convention. 48 states, six provinces of Canada and four foreign countries were represented. 19 individuals from foreign countries attended. Small World Awards were presented to 8 callers attending the convention for the first time from overseas locations.

57 Quarter Century Club Certificates were awarded to those Callerlab members who had completed twenty-five years of active calling. The Callerlab Milestone Award, the most prestigious award, was awarded this year to three individuals — Johnny LeClair of Mesa, Arizona, Jim Hilton of Concord, California and Art Shepherd of Christchurch, New Zealand.

Dave Taylor was elected to his second term as chairman of the board for the coming year along with executive committee members Orphie Eason, Jerry Haag, Frank Lane and Don Williamson. John Kaltenthaler and Herb Egender continue as executive secretary and assistant executive secretary respectively.

The theme for the Callerlab Convention was "Callerlab Is Mainstream" with a sub-theme of "Classes — The Lifeblood of Our Activity." Topics covering the

theme and sub-theme included many aspects of classes and dealt with the time frames before, during and after class.

Arden Hopkin, outstanding voice professor from Texas Christian University, addressed the group for the second year on the subject of "The Caller and The Use Of His Voice." Many delegates regarded Professor Hopkin's presentation a major highlight of the convention.

Some modifications were made to the Callerlab Basics List. The mainstream list remains unchanged. A resolution was passed recommending that mainstream dancer should dance for a period of one year past their first year of classes

before attending plus level dances.

Regarding quarterly selections, chain down the line, dixie derby, linear cycle, hinge & flutter, and red hot remain on the QS list. Ping pong circulate was moved to the plus list, all others were dropped.

The plus one and plus two lists have been combined into one list and is now called the Plus Program. It includes all of the calls that made up the plus one and two levels with ping pong circulate now added to make a total of 27 calls in that category. No additional calls will be added to this list for a period of one year. (Readers may turn to page 13 for complete up-dated Basics List).

Publisher's Message

DANNY ROBINSON

WHERE IS GRAYSON STILE?

I was walking toward the drink machine during one of the breaks of a beginner square dance session; she came up from behind me and asked, "Where is Grayson Stile?" I turned toward the voice. She repeated the question. I hesitated for a moment and said, "I don't know a Grayson Stile." With what seemed a devilish smile, she said, "You must know him, 'cause you're always talking about him."

"Okay," I countered, "What gives?" She began, "I'm only quoting you. You always tell us that a smooth dancer dances with Grayson Stile." She paused, looked at me with that same smile and said, "I want to dance with him. Where is he?"

The class dancer was having her fun. She knew quite well that I actually had said, "**Dance with grace and style.**" She knew also that smooth and graceful dancing is what square dancing is all about — that the true mark of a good dancer, and this includes all dance forms, is how well he moves in time with the music, and that his body carriage and movement complement the dance patterns.

Many times the new square dancer is so caught up in the mechanics of dancing, e.g., executing figures, that our good friend, Grayson Stile, suffers a bit. In other words, dancers tend to forget the fundamentals of smooth dancing. Basic things — like correct hand holds, courtesy turns, pivot points on arm turns, hand contact with adjacent dancer and other styling points — are put on the "back burner" as more emphasis is placed on **getting through** the dance routines. Given the opportunity to acquire "floor time," (ample nights to dance the basics) most dancers add

polish, style and a degree of finesse to their dancing.

We say "square dancing is fun," but it is an absolute JOY when all 8 dancers in a square have mastered some self-discipline and **per-spined a quart of dedication** to dancing the figures with graceful flow. If you want to get the most out of your square dancing, put forth that extra effort to "dance" it well.

Extra effort can come in many forms. One of them has to be the TIME factor. Given the time, a square dancer can hone his dance skills to a fine edge. Simply stated, this means that you shouldn't rush through each dance level hastily and plod on to the next plateau. Savor and stay at each dance level until you feel confident to move on.

Callerlab, the International Callers organization, appears to have underscored these same thoughts recently at the Reno convention when they went on record with the following recommendations: that dancers dance one full year or one year of dancing after class prior to attending a Plus Program workshop; and that six full months or thirty full sessions (be acquired) to complete the calls in a Plus Level workshop.

Grace, style and skill are enhanced by the time factor. All callers may not endorse Callerlab's recommendations for one reason or another, but most callers today are providing more instructional opportunities for dancers to become better and smoother dancers.

As the Fall season approaches, I hope you find the time to dance with **Grayson Stile**. You'll find it rewarding. You just might get an extra "yellowrock" from your corner.

That which is good or great makes itself known, no matter how loud the clamor of denial. That which deserves to live, lives. And those who deserve the lead, lead.

Legacy Survey

4,280 dancers from all over took time to fill out the 1981 LEGACY dancers questionnaire survey. The results have been tabulated and put on the computer. All comments have been extracted, categorized and assembled in bookform for review by interested persons.

The dancers' concern for the overall square dance activity is highly evident in their responses. Briefly, there is a strong demand for increased emphasis on square dance etiquette. "Callers sticking to the announced level of dance" and "fewer new figures" were second and third respectively among the dancers' concerns.

The 1981 questionnaire repeated the 1980 request asking dancers to

rate fourteen aspects of the activity on a +5 to -5 scale. By repeating this section in future surveys and comparing results, trends in dancers' attitudes may be spotted. "Learning new things" and "challenge" have dropped in the plus ratings, but "pleasure of dancing" still remains high.

In addition to the overall results and the comments, computer runs have been made to compile data for each state in an easy-to-read format. Organizations or editors desiring a copy of their state's report and/or the national figures should contact LEGACY executive secretaries Don & Vera Chestnut. These copies are available at cost.

LEGACY extends its appreciation to Jan Brown for the long hours spent at her computer and to her son, Sam, for writing the program. Special thanks also to the dancers who took the time to give LEGACY their input. LEGACY plans to continue conducting this survey every two years.
