10TH CALLERLAB CONFAB DEEMED SUCCESS

The 10th Annual **CALLERLAB** Convention, held the end of March in Philadelphia, attracted more than 495 callers. Including callers' partners and VIP guests, the total attendance came close to 800. Bob Van Antwerp took over the reigns of **CALLERLAB** from outgoing chairman Dave Taylor, who held the post for two years. Joining Bob on the executive committee are Cal Golden, Jerry Haag, Frank Lane and Bill Peters. John Kaltenthaler and Herb Engender continue to serve on the **CALLERLAB** staff.

Certainly one of the highlights of the convention was the presentation of the Milestone Award (Call-erlab's highest award) to veteran caller Arnie Kronenberger of California for his contributions of leadership to the square dance movement and his role as one of the founders of Callerlab.

Quarter Century awards for 25 years of calling were presented to 30 callers including Florida's Frank Bedell and Oscar Erwin, and Georgia's Rod Blaylock.

Some of the highlights of special note included the following: 1) A thought-provoking banquet message by out-going chairman Dave Taylor focusing on the convention's theme, "Dancers — Our Prime Consideration." 2) Acceptance of the definitions and a new teaching order for Plus movements. 3) "Program" (not level) is the new terminology for Mainstream, Plus and

Publisher's Message

DANNY ROBINSON

KEEPERS OF THE FLAME

We have always needed "Keepers of the Flame." From the early days of primitive man, where survival of the tribe depended upon the continual nurturing of the flame, to his counterpart of today, sentinels of vigil who fan the flame of progress in each and every field of endeavor; we look to the "Keepers" to light the way — to give us a sense of direction.

The fine folks of Legacy, an international organization dedicated to preserve and enhance all facets of square dancing, seem highly qualified to be the keepers of the square dance flame. We commend their vitality and efforts in maintaining a leadership resource center for the dance and pass along to you, our readers, the results of Legacy's 1983 Dancer Survey.

5,481 forms were received in Legacy's third square dancer survey with all states, Canada and several other nations participating. Comments were printed in book form for a detailed review and the results presented to Legacy Trustees during their meeting in St. Louis in May.

The average survey respondent danced between 4 and 5 times per month and had about 5 years experience. The largest group by frequency danced 4 times a month and the largest group by experience had been dancing 3 years. In Legacy's 1981 survey, the largest group of dancers by experience had been dancing 2 years and the average had been dancing four years. This fact suggests that new dancer retention was less than average between 1981 and 1983.

About two-thirds of all dancers had been club officers. One-fourth had attended a square dance leadership panel or seminar and two-

thirds of those found the information useful.

Respondents were asked what methods of teaching and/or emphasizing etiquette were most effective. Sixty-eight percent voted "caller in class" with "by example" and "experienced dancer in class" each receiving a little less than half as many checks. Dancers apparently deem "written material ineffective since it was checked on only 6% of the forms.

Dance "mixers" were appreciated more by the less experienced and less frequent dancers. Higher frequency dancers rated "clothes" more positively. Dancers with 4 to 5 years' experience had the lowest opinion of club leadership. The poorest overall attitude was scored by 6 to 7 year dancers.

Dancers were asked, "Of those you know who've dropped out of square dancing, what do you feel were the most significant reasons for their disappearance from our activity?" The 5,481 respondents checked their forms as follows:

- 38% Felt pressure — towards higher dance levels
- 28% Felt rushed — inadequate
- 21% Social — not accepted by group
- 13% Caller — inadequate in some way
- 11% Club — functions or responsibilities
- 11% Were bored — not enough variety
- 8% Styling — rough or non-standard moves
- 34% Other

A total of 2,195 "other" reasons were given. They broke down into three broad groups: personal (1,250), club related (408), and other dance related reasons, such as "no (continued on page 14)

Your Guide To Better Dancing —

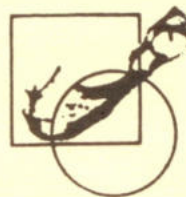

partners for singles" (82).

The attitude portion of the survey was designed to define changes in dancers' values regarding 14 different aspects of the square dancing activity. It has a +5 to -5 scale and has been used in the same format for all three ('80, '81, '83) LEGACY dancer surveys. Dancers rated the overall activity plus 2.4 in the first survey, plus 2.0 in the second and plus 2.1 in the third. Averages for 12 out of the 14 separate aspects followed the same profile or had no significant trend. The two that did not conform were "new acquaintances" and "pleasure

of dancing. Dancers have collectively rated these lower in each of the 3 successive surveys. "Pleasure of dancing" has always been the top scoring aspect, starting with a plus 4.5 in the first, plus 4.4 in the second and plus 4.3 in the third. However, the steady decline as scored by more than 10,000 dancers over 4 years should be a cause for concern by dancers and callers alike.

It is impossible to objectively summarize 1227 pages of comments and two hundred thousand data points from dancers with such a wide variety of goals. It would

seem, however, that most were saying, "Keep the fun and pleasure in dancing, teach them social as well as dancing skills, and reduce pressures wherever you can."

Some states did not have enough forms submitted to provide adequate data. Another survey is planned for distribution in late 1984.

THE CALLER REPORT

The question often comes up . . . "Which is better, a caller run club or a dancer run club?"

It seems to me that outside of some differences in financial areas, there is little difference. From the first night of class to the time when an individual might take office in the board of directors of a square dance club, we learn that square dancing is a cooperative effort. It has to be. Cooperation is certainly required to make a square "go" during a dance . . . and a caller would look kind of silly standing in the front of the room calling to a vacant floor.

A caller and his law would take a great exercise in frustration trying to operate a square dance club without the cooperation and help

So, be it a caller run club, or dancer run club . . . it takes everyone pulling together to make it a success. Try getting involved a little bit more in the success of your "family" . . . maybe you will enjoy yourself more than you think possible.

(This article is the second of a two-part informative series concerned with the planning and promotion of a successful format for Square Dance Week '83 in Central Florida. — The Editor.)

PART II: THE WHAT AND WHERE OF IT — IN CENTRAL FLORIDA

SQUARE DANCE WEEK '83

Part one of this two-part series appeared in the spring issue of this publication. The article explained the "Why" (our objectives) and "How" (master plan) of our project. To summarize: A Square Dance Week Steering Committee was formed, under the aegis of the Central Fla. Callers Association and the Central Fla. Square & Round Dance Association, to provide a positive force to produce a concerted effort, among callers and dancers, in drawing public attention to square dancing.

To this end, the steering committee established the **objectives** (to enhance the public image of square dancing, to sharpen public awareness to the joy and rewards of the activity, and to attract new recruits into the Fall beginner classes) and **master plan** (regional sub-committees formed to "produce" scheduled activities/celebration at the local level . . . and communicators appointed to tell our story).

Now to the "What" and "Where" of the campaign.

THE "WHAT" OF IT

From the very beginning, the steering committee has been concerned with **What** our project is all

about: promotion/publicity and programming. Through promotion and publicity we plan to tell our story through — proclamations and endorsements, information booths, fact sheets, press releases, articles/stories to the new media; marquee, talks and interviews.

Programming is of equal importance and where we should "shine" the best — a schedule of dazzling exhibition dances during Square Dance Week.

Exhibition Dancing: what is it? The word "exhibition," according to Mr. Webster, means "a public show or display, as of art." Exhibition Square Dancing should show us at our natural best; an artful display of movement and style. Keep in mind that when we dance before the public that it is a "show," our goal is to convey to the folks watching the "spirit and mood of the dance."

Programming for exhibition dances is of a different nature and intent than the programming that occurs at a club dance. Remember, we desire to entice viewers into the activity, not to scare them away. The following thoughts are recommended for exhibition programs: 1)

mainstream dancing only, 2) program segments consisting of approximately 20 minutes, 3) at least one segment designed for audience participation, and 4) intermission segments of 20 minutes or more as a rest break and informal sessions on "dance facts" with prospective recruits.

THE "WHERE" OF IT

Where is the action? During Square Dance Week and the few weeks preceding September 19, here are a few of the obvious scenes — shopping malls, community events, fairs and festivals, television, radio, service organization events, restaurants: dine/dance and fast food; in short, wherever people assemble. In fact, you, as a square dancer, are the best representative Square Dancing has. Where you are — is where the action is. During your daily routine of business and leisure, tell the folks around you to join us for Square Dance Week.

Square Dance Week is going to be "the best show in town" this September in Central Florida. The Steering Committee is ready. The square dance community is ready and the public needs to be enlightened. Let's do it!
