RECIPE OF THE MONTH

If you have ever tasted Margaret Smith's sour-cream cake, you have probably wanted the recipe. Here 'tis -- a delectably moist, light cake with a macaroon-like crust. Happy baking!

S O U R C R E A M C A K E

- 3 Cups sifted flour (sift twice more)
- 3 Cups sugar
- 1 Cup butter
- 1/4 teaspoon soda
- 6 eggs separated
- 1/2 pint commercial sour cream

Cream butter and sugar thoroughly. Add egg yolks one by one. Add soda to flour and sour cream to creamed mixture. Beat egg whites until stiff and fold in. (DON'T add any flavoring.)

Bake in a large tube-pan (greased and floured) at 300 degrees for 1 1/2 hours. Turn out of pan immediately upon taking from oven. No icing needed.
