A good attendance of delegates were on hand at the bi-monthly meeting of NEFSDA at the Mayflower Hotel, Jacksonville, on March 6. The meeting was presided over by President Chet Vetter.

Jim Whiteman, Chairman of the Spring Fling, reported that all preparations for this special event are being completed with enthusiasm and anticipation. The Fling will be held at the Ramada Inn, Gainesville, April 21 and 22, with featured callers, Bill Spiedel and Ken McCartney of Lincoln, Nebraska, and Ed and Kay Mack on the rounds.

back real soon.


Retrieved banner from the Grand Slammers on

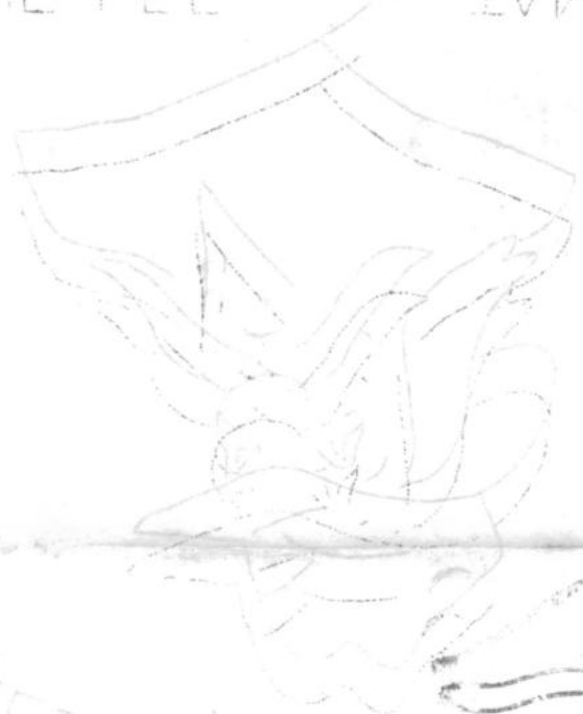
