NOTES FROM N.E. FLORIDA SQUARE DANCERS ASSOCIATION MEETING MARCH 9, 1969.

Several member clubs were again not represented at the meeting. Each club is entitled to one representative who should report back to his respective club. The association needs at least 50% present of all the member clubs to be able to do any business. All clubs should cooperate to the fullest extent to make these meetings successful and productive. The treasury report showed a balance of \$490.66.

Committee Reports - Fall Roundup chairman will be Harvey Chambers of the Jubileers with Bob Sinn, our NEFSDA president, acting as publicity chairman and advertising manager.

Ken Seefried reported on the State Federation. Balance in their treasury is \$995.00. Virgil Green has been appointed as Eason Officer for all the callers in the state. Any problem arising with the callers will be handled through him to the Federation. The Bow and Swing will be published by Mr. Al Cody for three more months and then taken over by the Florida Callers Association with Mr. Purcell as editor. The Golden Keys of Visitation, which have been circulating in several association clubs will all be brought in at the State Convention in Tampa in June. Barney Weatherford has been appointed by the Federation to try and get a ruling from the State tax department on the levying of sales tax on some of the square dance clubs in the state.

5th Saturday Dance - Bill Fleshman reported that \$25.00 deposit has been paid to the Cedar Hills Armory for the hall in May. It was voted to donate \$50.00 to the Gateway Callers Association for their services during this dance.

No report as yet from the committee appointed to investigate the idea of increasing gate prices at the dances.

Charlie Landiss of the Allemandarins raised the question: What are you going to do when you go to a dance, get squared up, and then find a guest caller all of a sudden is going to call the tip? Grin and bear it?

Mr. Gene Williams of the Golden Isles Swingers reported that now they make up schedules for visiting callers, so that each dancer will know who will call, what tip, and what night it will be. Paul Lane advanced the remark that we are furthering the advancement of new callers by having them call but this question is solely up to the individual club officers. Mr. Williams then further reported that before a guest caller is brought into a dance that they try to acquire a tape of this caller and play it between tips before the assigned dance night.

Joe McMath of the Allemandarins put forth a question that should create lots of discussion. There seems to be a lack of round dancing in many clubs. Why? Round dancing goes with square dancing as Julia Vetter put it and at Gainesville Tom and Sue McCrorie teach round dancing on the same night that the club has their dance, and, she stated, the dancers are increasing.

Some callers may not believe in having rounds or do not have the time to promote them. Bill Fleshman stated that the Roundoleers have offered clubs to have a couple from their club come into the dance and teach and play rounds. To know round dancing is like square dancing - it has a language of its own and a couple should go through classes to learn the basics.

After this rather informal discussion the meeting was adjourned.

AN IMPORTANT OCCASION

Julian Barrs of the recreation department of the city has made the announcement that Thursday April 3 will be All American City Day. That evening there will be square dancing and round dancing between 6 and 7 p.m. in the parking lot behind the City Hall. Some of the callers will be Bill Camp, Tom and Mariann Hidding. A firework display also is planned for the evening. All you square dancers and round dancers can have a good time celebrating All American City Day at this festivity.

Realizing that there are so many different lists of rules for stealing banners, the club presidents of the Northeast area got together in 1961 under the leadership of Virgil Green and formulated rules that they would follow in the Northeast area. The clubs were givent the opportunity to make their own decisions known. These rules have been published at various times and the clubs have had a lot of fun "stealing Banners".

1. Advance notice must be sent by the club that is going on a banner expedition to the club they intend to visit. This is to make it known that it is a club sponsored event.
2. Dual memberships are common in the area; therefore, it will be left up to the dancer involved to elect which of the clubs he will represent on any given night or visit. If he has one, the badge of the club he intends to represent should be worn.
3. Minimum of one square of visitors is needed to seize a banner.
4. Rules will apply only in the Greater Jacksonville area including Orange Park and other outlying points if they so desire.
5. Banner can only be taken at a regular club dance with a club caller calling the dance, not a guest caller.
6. A club can only take one banner at a time. If it visits a club that happens to have a third club's banner in its possession, it cannot seize both banners. If the club is on a visit to reclaim its own banner from a club, it can only obtain its own banner, not the host club's also.
7. In order to participate, a club must own or be in the process of making a banner.

If we will uphold the standards of square dancing we will all have a lot more fun.

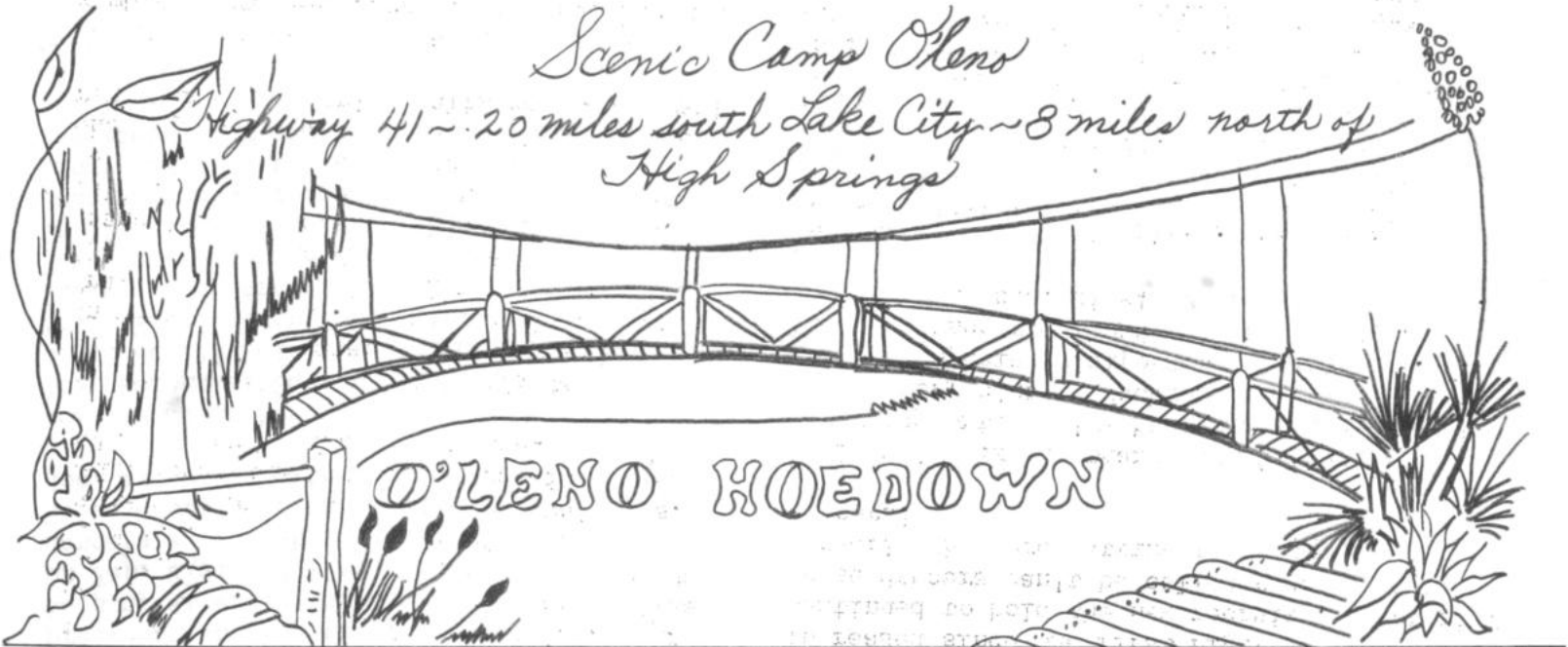

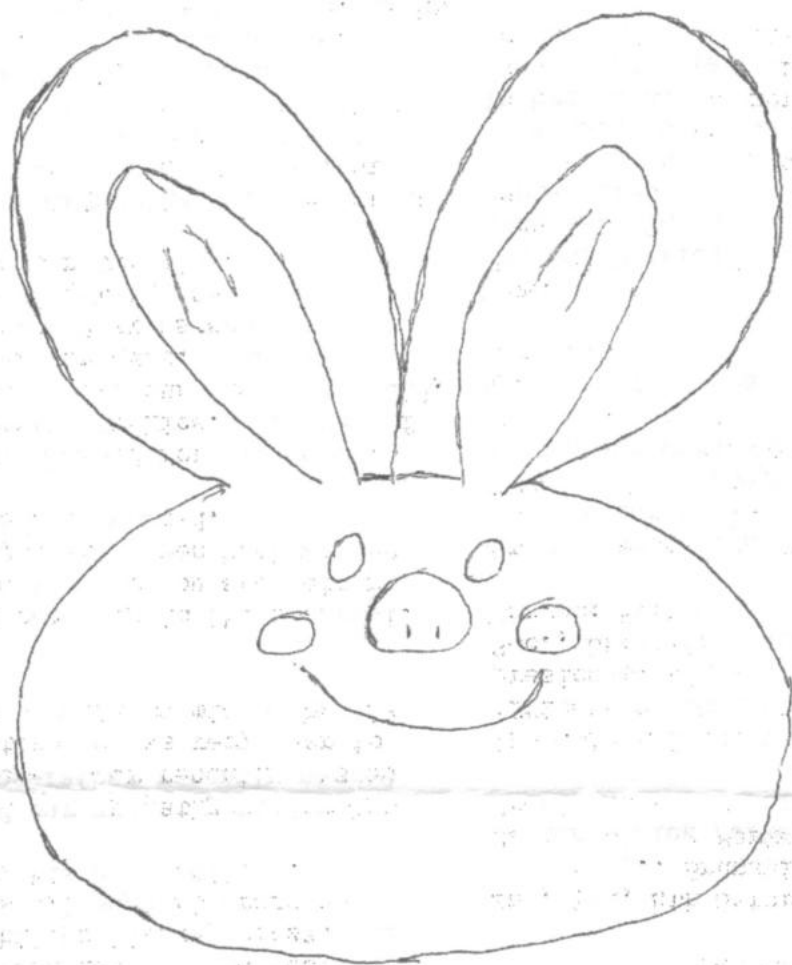

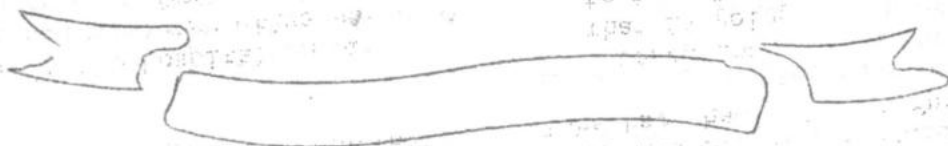
