CALLING TIPS - OFF BASS-OUT OF TREBLE

Harold Bensch, of Leigh, Nebraska, has this advice about equipment in his publication, THE REPORTER:

Most callers know that too much bass will have a tendency to make the caller's voice less sharp and distinct. Knowing this, then, some callers will go all the way the other direction and put on all the treble they can get. This too is a mistake (did you know that some people have trouble hearing treble tones?). It is best to balance the two to achieve a pleasant sound.

It isn't as important just what equipment you have as it is how you use it, so experiment a little and get the most out of your set.
