## WHAT IS THE ASSOCIATION ??

We frequently hear, "What is the Association, why do we have it, and what is in it for me as a club member, etc!" I am referring of course to the Northeast Florida Square Dancers Association.

Perhaps one way to answer is to quote from the NEFSDA, INC. BY-LAWS, article II - Purpose:

The purpose of the Association is to coordinate the several activities of the member clubs in functions they cannot perform individually, and to this end:

(a) To promote the growth of square and/or round dancing in this area and help insure its growth and progress as a wholesome family activity.

(b) To take advantage of opportunities for presenting to the public the fact that square dancing is one of the most enjoyable, wholesome and physically beneficial forms of recreation available.

(c) To affirm in the public's mind that drinking of intoxicants at square dances is not tolerated.

(d) To encourage the formation of new clubs and the development of new callers and to encourage and help them any way possible if so requested.

(e) To sponsor and promote Association dances and an annual roundup. Other than the annual roundup, Association dances will normally be held on Fifth Saturdays so as to cause the least interference with regular club dances.

(As a comment here, our annual Fall Roundup is now recognized as one of the top weekends in the entire Southeast area; thanks to those who have worked it out and most of all to the clubs who have backed it through the years.)

(f) To publish a monthly bulletin of clubs and Association news at a subscription rate set by the Board of Delegates.

(g) To organize area dancers for the purpose of hosting and conducting the State Square Dance Convention when it is assigned to the Northeast Area.

(Comment: Next to impossible to do without the performance of the Association; in the first place we would never have a chance without the Association as the State Federation would not let us host without a permanent Association to furnish the necessary leadership and manpower.)

(h) To maintain membership in and liaison with the Florida Federation of Square Dancers for mutual assistance in functions that area Associations cannot perform individually.

The above may be somewhat high sounding and inasmuch as the officers and delegates to the NEFSDA are human beings and subject to all the human frailties, the association has not & will not always function as it should in all of these areas. However, we do

have a viable organization, we have one of the finest area newspapers in the state in the Grapevine, we have well attended Fifth Saturday Dances, we do have the Fall Roundup, which has as I pointed out above, one of the finest weekends in the whole Southeast. This is from comments from dancers outside the area in Florida and from many other states that were represented at our last Roundup. We do have a good working arrangement with the State Federation and regularly host a good Convention every four years.

Over the years several things have been done to try and improve the Square dance picture. The last was the attempt at an area wide class under Association auspices. It did not work but it was an honest effort to improve the lot of the caller faced with very small classes and it did result in the formation of our newest Association club, the Rockin' Robins.

The Association does try and function as a force for good in square dancing, but it is only as good as the delegates and all too often the clubs do not bother to have a delegate at the meetings. This is bad, because we need input from all the clubs and we need your ideas. So instead of spending so much time in your clubs, asking what the Association does, come on down to the meetings every other month and find out what you can do to help the Association be a better organization. WE NEED YOU!!!!!!

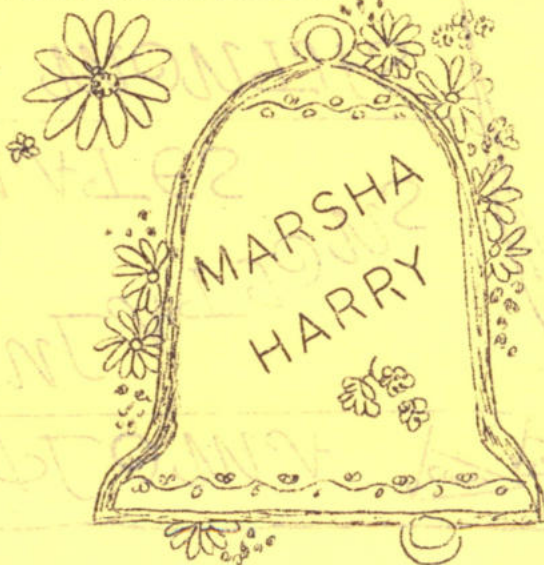

MINUTES OF MEETING - MARCH 10, 1974

\*\*\*\*

The regular bi-monthly meeting of the NEFSDA, INC. was held March 10, 1974, at the Robert Meyer Hotel with President, George Ephrem presiding.

Officers present were: George Ephrem, Joseph Smith, Hilton Lay, & Sandra Milligan.

Delegates answering to the roll call: Allemandarins, Calico Swingers, 441 Club, Friendly Frolics, Friendly Whirl A-Ways, Fun & Frolic, Jubileers, Roundoleers, Western Cutters, Westernaires, Rockin'Robins, Oceanwaves, & Swinging Squares.

Clubs NOT represented were: Ancient City Squares, Challengers, Belles & Beaux, Dixie Chain Gang, Gator Promenaders, Hicks & Chicks, Rhythmaires, Starlite Shufflers, & Sunshine Twirlers.

In the absence of the recording secretary, George Ephrem read the minutes of the last meeting, which was approved as read.

**TREASURER REPORT:** Hilton Lay, Treasurer, gave the statement of income & expenses for the past two months. The current balance as of this date is \$325.17. The report was accepted as read.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**STATE CONVENTION, 1974:** Herman Ibach presented the banner which advertises the 1974 State Convention in Orlando. Our association has been asked to finish selling the badges, which were then passed out to various delegates to sell within their clubs. This money helps pay the advertising expenses for the convention. George Ephrem read a letter concerning registration forms from the Orlando committee signed by Ralph & Helen Davis, Secretary. Mariann Hidding brought registration forms for campers. She indicated that there were only 60 spaces left for campers at this time. It was also pointed out that the management of the camp grounds was donating a recreation hall for after parties.

**FIFTH SATURDAY DANCES:** George Ephrem reminded everyone that MARCH 30 is our next 5th Saturday Dance with Ron Nelson of Norfolk, Virginia, calling. He urged everyone to support this dance which will be at Wolfson High School with the Allemandarins as hosts.

**STATE CONVENTION, 1975:** Herman Ibach, Chairman for the 1975 State Convention which will be held in Jacksonville, announced the other members of his state convention committee: Co-chairman-Virgil & Elsie Green; Registration Chairman-Ernie & Sally Doering; Secretary-Ken & Wanda Cornell; Treasurer-Hilton & Carolyn Lay; Program Chairman-Don & Bea Smith; Publicity-George & Judy Garland.

The slogan is "NORTHEAST, DIP 'N DIVE 'N 75". JERRY HAAG & JOHNNY WALTERS will be the callers. It is almost certain that DORIS & LaVERN RILEY will be on the rounds. Dates of the Convention will be MAY 23 24 & 25, 1975 at the

Civic Auditorium. Tom & Mariann Hidding will be working with the teenagers. Jack Pierson, Manager of the Bow & Swing was introduced to speak concerning the advertising & publicity for the 1975 Convention. He is now acting as publicity chairman for the 1974 Convention in Orlando. He emphasized the importance of placing registration forms in all publication & showed the different forms that had been used in the past two conventions. He further stated that all advertising materials must be made to fit the four state publications. Each association should receive 2500 advertising pieces & the Bow & Swing should have 4200, with a total of 24,000 pieces altogether to be printed. He insisted that the convention committee advertise in all state magazines. He will then print the programs for the convention free of charge. He further stated that \$450. will cover everything he has mentioned here as far as advertising is concerned. He also offered the first page of the May issue of the Bow & Swing to the NEFSDA, to promote the 1975 Convention.

**GRAPEVINE:** Editor, George Garland, indicated that over 75 new dancers were just graduated. He & Judy have attended most of these graduations. All clubs are urged to advertise their Special Dances with a flyer in the Grapevine.

**OLD BUSINESS:** George Ephrem asked that new club rosters be turned in, showing the new club officers.

The Delegate from the Calico Swingers asked for an explanation of the amendment concerning teenagers which was passed at the last meeting. This was explained by the President. Representatives from the Calico Swingers indicated that the fact that all children must pay the full adult price to the Fall Roundup would work an extreme hardship on families with several children who dance. Lou Connolly requested to get together a committee & look at the possibility of setting up a sliding scale for square dance families before the Fall Roundup. George Ephrem said that at present the current rule of children paying half price would be in effect. A committee will look into this later.

The President brought up the matter of Banner Stealing Rules which have been published in the Grapevine. Since the Association has no official banner stealing rules, George Garland, indicated that the Association should come up with its own suggested rules. Other discussion indicated a preference to just use those already printed in the Grapevine, & the clubs that so desire may use them. No action taken.

**SPECIAL MEETING WITH CALLERS:** A special committee consisting of Virgil Green, Lou Connolly, & George Garland was appointed at the last Association meeting to work toward better relations between the dancers association and the callers association. Virgil Green reported on said meeting. The follow-

ing is a list of the suggestions which came out of that meeting:

1. Articals of incorporation be placed in the Grapevine & the reasons for the Association being incorporated.
2. Publish minutes of the meeting in the Grapevine.
3. Publish a treasurer's report, plus statements of income & expenses of the 5th sat, dances & fall roundup.
4. If a delegate is not present at the association meeting, the president of that club should be notified.
5. Keep a calendar of coming special dances.
6. A poll should be taken of local dancers to determine just what they want in the way of association dances.
7. The association should set up an educational program for dancers, club leaders and delegates concerning duties, responsibilities, etc. involved in square dancing.

A motion was made by Virgil Green that the Grapevine list the names of clubs not represented at the association meetings. Motion carried. Another motion was made to send a card to the president of the club, stating delegate did not attend the meeting. Motion carried.

**MEMBERSHIP FEES:** George Ephrem brought up the question of raising the club dues. A motion was made by Bettye Smith that the Association keep the \$12. dues & let the individual clubs purchase its own listing in Bow & Swing if they so desire. At the present time the Association receives none of the \$12, but the entire amount is passed on to the Bow & Swing in payment for the individual club's listing. It was noted that the association will have more expenses this year for the Fall Roundup since the association is already obligated itself to hire two national callers for both nights of the roundup. Motion failed to carry.

**ANNOUNCEMENTS:** George pointed out that according to the NEFSDA BY-LAWS, no caller could serve as an officer in the association. However, any caller could come in and visit and express his views. Virgil Green introduced Bob & Sue Robinson who will be the delegates from the Quarter Mores after their dues are paid. Bettye Smith announced the Friendly Whirl-A-Ways special dance on April 22 at Ft. Caroline Jr. High with Gloria Roth calling. The Friendly Frolics, Mis Friendly Frolics Beauty Pageant on the 6th of April and the Westernaires April Fools dance on April 6th. Being no further business, motion was made to adjourn.
