ROUND DANCE NEWS

"Let's look at styling..Round Dancers today appear so busy concentrating on what to do, they have no time to worry about how to do it..The name of the game today must be to "learn every dance that comes out" instead of learning the better routines on a Styling-Conscious Basis. We should put more emphasis on doing the steps the right & correct way. Dancers who have just recently discovered styling, tell me the routines become easier & more enjoyable when the race to finish the dance steps ceases. You can concen-

trate on the nice music & you can actually feel the need to dance more smoothly & flow with the music. I would like to offer a challenge: Every dancer urge his or her teacher/instructor to pick one dance night per quarter to re-teach a dance routine that everyone in the club already knows. A new Festival based generally on the same format which has made the other Fontana events instantly successful, Spring Fling, offers a staff consisting of: Jean & Roy Green, Charlotte, N.C.; Bob & Vivian Bennett, Valdosta, Ga.; Bobby & Carol Hollis, Macon, Ga.; Bob & Betty Lepard, Aiken, S.C.; Dick & Bobbie McPherson, Winston-Salem, N.C.; Buddy & Beverly Odon, Columbia, S.C.; Gene & Ginny Record, Covington, Ky.; Harold & Fleeta Thomas, Rock Hill, S.C. & Al & Jean Brownlee, Fontana, N.C.. Al (Tex) Brownlee is recreation director of Fontana Village Resort & as such is host caller for all festivals.

The other Spring Festivals are Swap Shop, April 24-May 2; Rebel Roundup, May 9-16; Accent on Rounds, May 16-23; & Fun Fest, May 23-30, 1976.

Fontana Village pioneered western style square dancing at the time when it was virtually unknown in the Western North Carolina Mountains, although Appalachian style square dancing had been an integral part of Fontana's recreation program since the Village became a resort.

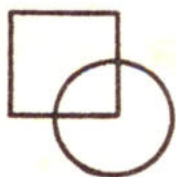

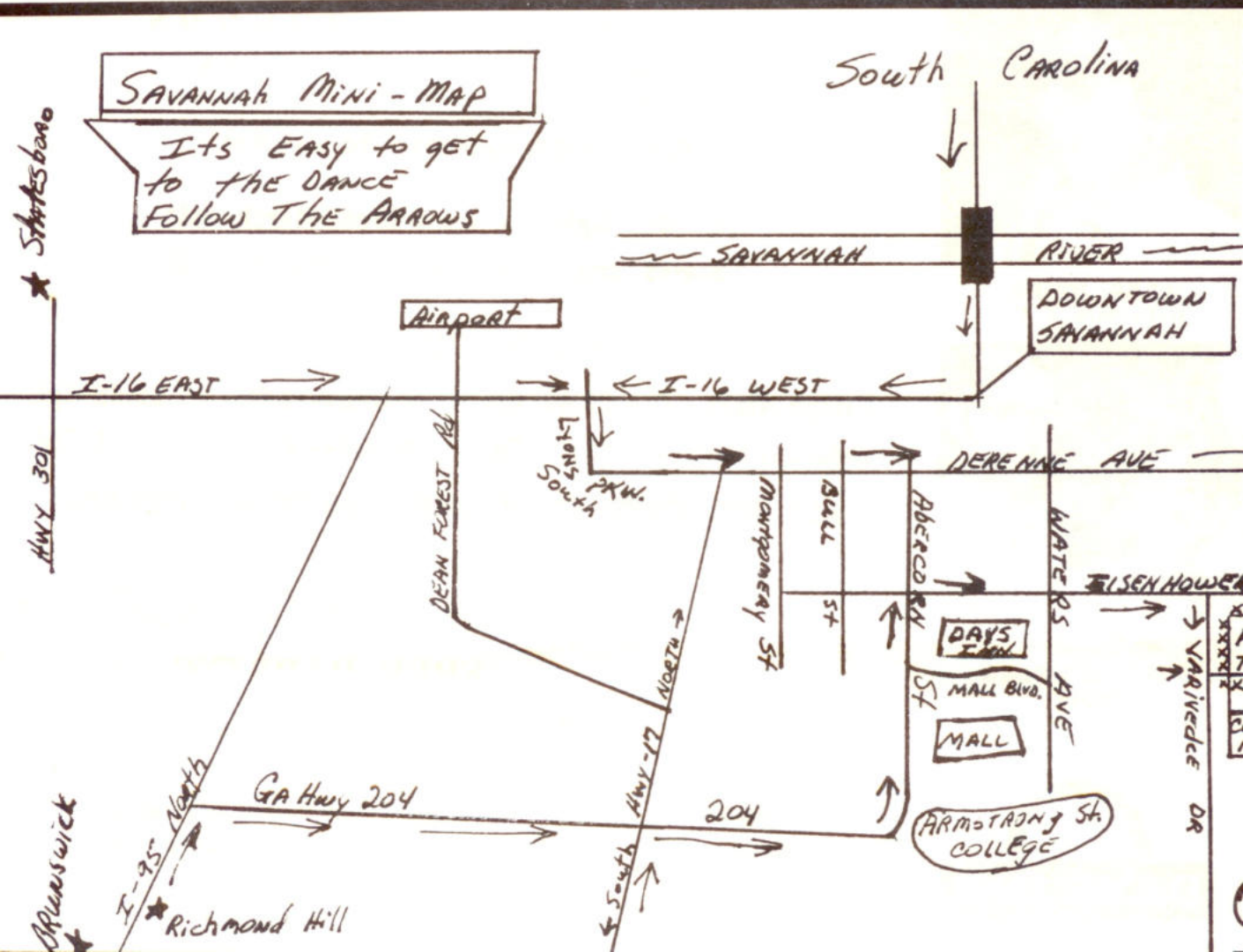
