33RD NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTIONWHERE TO STAY ON THE BAY:

Baltimore is now one of the most dynamic cities in the country. One bit of evidence for this statement is the number of conventions held here each year. During the past year our city hosted 75 conventions, and many more will convene here before ours in June 1984.

All these people use the same facilities -- hotels, motels, the transportation, restaurants and parking -- as will those attending the 33rd National Convention. They will do so in the time order that they are held. This is one reason we have not made housing assignments for our convention yet. We did not want the hotels to have to take on our housing requirements too early in the game.

However, WE ARE NOW MAKING HOUSING ASSIGNMENTS. After receiving the names of the convention registrants assigned to them, it is up to each hotel or motel to notify the persons involved and request a deposit to hold the room reservations. Since they are dealing with a number of conventions, it may take some time. PLEASE BE PATIENT AND DON'T WORRY.

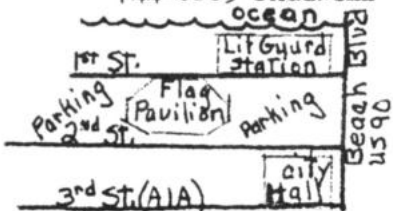

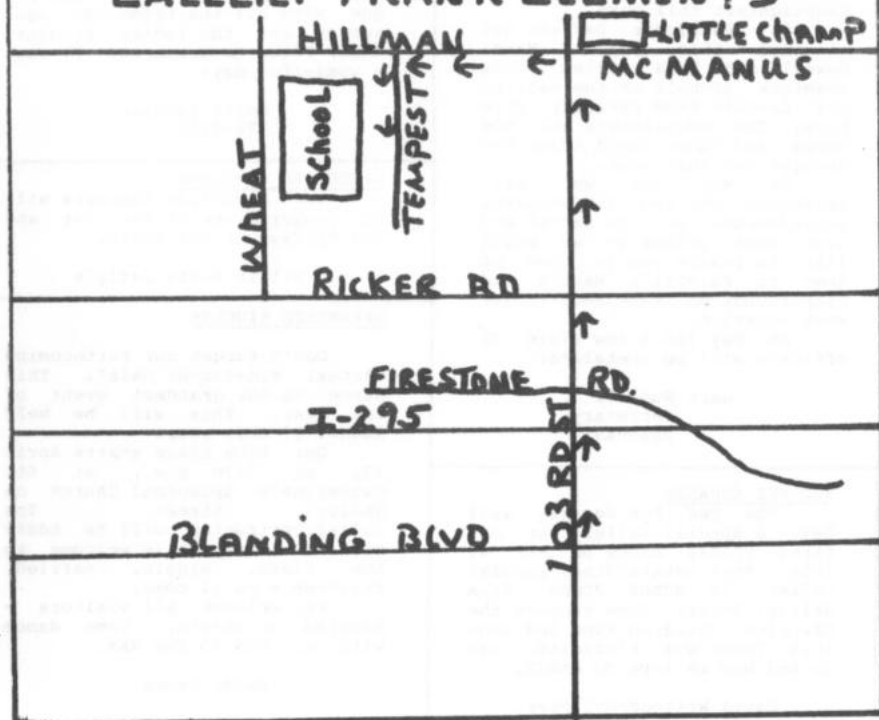

Skirt is 8-gore with the 8th gore being on the fold in the front for the logo. Use your own bodice pattern or Authentic pattern No. 275 (available at square dance shops). Outfit may be one-piece with green belt with Velcro closing or may be made two-piece with skirt band in green. Use yellow, green, white, or gold shoes and yellow, green, or white petticoat and Pettipants.

WHERE'S THE BEEF?

Or what's the hurry? Why do square dancers seem so intent on rushing to the next plateau? Are we, the callers and dancers, pushing our newer dancers too fast and therefore depriving them of the pleasure of dancing where they are comfortable? After all, what do they know of plus level, A1, A2, challenge, or whatever? Therefore they must hear of it from us.

Most everyone knows Callerlab suggests dancing at least one year at the mainstream level before going into a plus workshop. I'm sure all of us who teach plus and above suggest our class members have at least a year of dancing experience after mainstream before coming into our workshops, but do we insist on it? How about the dancers who are experienced in the higher levels? Do they insist that their friends whom they've tried for years to get into square dancing progress normally or do they drag them to dances that are above their heads, saying "we'll pull you through"?

Or how about the caller who is running a mainstream class or a plus workshop and has to read his material? How can he teach someone something that he does not know himself? I feel that in these cases the dancer is being cheated. A dancer is no less important if he or she prefers to dance at the mainstream level. A caller is no less important if he wishes to stay a mainstream caller.

There is a place for all of us in square dancing, so please don't force or be forced into the next level too quickly. In other words, Stop and Smell the Roses!
