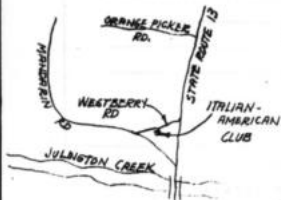

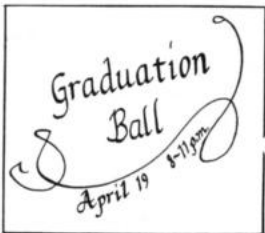

## CALLER OF THE MONTH

### JERRY BARRETT

#### "FROGMAN"

Jerry, while teaching his first class, met a student named Marilyn "Mickie" Alley and they had their first date on New Year's Eve 1974. They were married the following March. They are the proud grandparents of 2 grandchildren by Jerry's daughter Hazel now residing in Dunedin, FL and a son, Rusty, in Louisville, KY.

Jerry had a curiosity about calling only one year after learning to dance so he asked Stu Shocklette (who has his own record company) about calling and Stu gave him a couple of records to try. Jerry didn't like them and bought a couple of his own. That started it all. He formed his first class from employees of the L&N Railroad where he and Mickie worked. From this class a club was formed which started another class and so on. Jerry became popular and had to keep his wedding date a secret for fear a square dance would form at the courthouse with him calling.

With the help of the Fire Department in Louisville Jerry started a telethon "Crusade for Children" Dance with proceeds going to crippled children. The first year they raised \$250. and his last year they raised \$10,000.

The Barretts were transferred to Jacksonville in 1980. After a six month vacation from calling Jerry's first calling job was with John Robbins on New Year's Eve. His first club was Friendly Frolics, then The Strawberry Swingers in Starke. Jerry formed The Windsongs (a plus club) and the Lamplighters by request from M/M Pacetti. Jerry has served as President of the Gateway Caller's Assoc for two years and is now serving his second year as secretary.

The nickname "Frogman" originated in Louisville. At the time the record "Joy to the World" was popular Jerry was the only caller doing it. The phrase "Jeremia was a bull frog" caught on and one night when he came to the dance there was a live frog sitting on his record. After that night it was a game to sneak a frog onto his records without being caught and having to catch the ones that got away.

Louisville's loss is Jacksonville's gain and we are glad you joined our square dance world, we love you, keep up the good work.

I, like most of you have traveled from club to club and danced to a lot of the callers, but, to see what they have to go through first-hand was to say the least, an awesome experience.

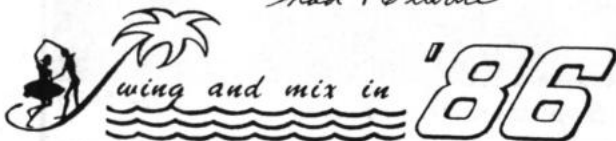

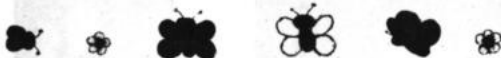

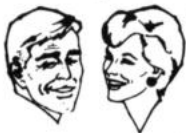

## SQUARELY SPEAKING (All about New Club Members)

The time has arrived at long last! Most of the clubs around the state have already or will soon be graduating their class members and welcoming them to the fold as new members. This gives cause for concern to both callers and the long-time club members. Special consideration must be given to the new members as they make the transition from a lesson atmosphere to that of being part of the club. Let's discuss this topic and refresh in our minds how to make new-comers feel welcome and truly a part of the club.

Club members have a real responsibility placed on them, as they must make a special effort to convey to new members that their presence is really wanted. From the greeters at the door to the committee handling refreshments, smiles and a gracious manner are a must. The entire membership will want to be aware of all new-comers, chatting with them before the dance, genuinely welcoming them into their squares and inviting them to join them afterwards at the pizza parlor or whatever place it is that the majority go following a dance. Club members will, hopefully, never cast disdainful looks at new members if they happen to make a mistake in the square. All they need to do is conjure up in their own minds how sensitive and unsure they themselves were following graduation. Keep any criticism out of the square and do not attempt to "teach" during a tip.

Club callers have still other concerns in welcoming the new club members. They will want to make modifications in their usual programming so that they can successfully merge the newcomers with the least amount of fanfare. It's best to tone down the level a few notch, giving them more time to build and reinforce the freshly learned repertoire of movements. Slowing down the tempo a few beats is also wise since new dancers do not yet have a fully developed reaction time. The discerning caller will also shorten tips by a few minutes, especially if there is square breakdown and looks of frustration on the part of the new members. Then if he comes back on the next tip with something he "knows" they will have no trouble with, he will allow them to regain their esteem and self-confidence. A group of dancers who are expressing real anxiety cannot be expected to enjoy themselves. This is the critical time that can dictate whether the newcomers will stay with the activity, or decide that maybe sticking to bowling is more fun and less taxing.

Another way to keep up the enthusiasm of new members is to design some theme dances that will prove to be really fun. Involve the newcomers in the decision-making on these and certainly in the ideas and actual decorating. I have seen a number of these bring out large crowds, with the new people especially showing their joy. Some of these were:

## SQUARELY SPEAKING (continued)

**BADGE DANCE:** This is a tried-and-true theme dance that never seems to wear out its welcome. Working with a local badge-maker, decide what badge will be involved for each tip and have him present to make them up on the spot, if this is possible. New dancers, especially, seem to enjoy this.

**INTERNATIONAL DANCES:** A Mexican Fiesta, an Octoberfest, an Italianfest, a Hawaiian Luau and an assortment of dances involving other countries is always fun. Specifying food that fits the theme makes it more authentic and it is even more realistic if the caller brings forth singing calls that depict the country being highlighted.

**SEASONAL DANCES:** The usual ones, of course, are Christmas and New Year's Eve balls. Others may involve Valentine's Day, President's Day dances (Feb.), April Fool's Day and Thanksgiving. Then there are the four seasons, which always allow for great ideas to decorate the hall. Here again, the caller can often come up with records to suggest the theme.

I urge that your club dance during the summer and try to have at least one special event a month, urging the participation of your new members. The only way they will retain what they have learned is to continue to dance. If it is not possible for your own club to do this, arrange for visitations to other clubs (Banner Stealing) that have special dances, making certain that you have provided for the inclusion of the new members. Stress with them how important it is that they dance year 'round. Most of all, stress how much fun square dancing is and then go about proving this to them. You and they will be glad you did.

- 7 That clubs that do not sponsor classes would support those that do, especially in the jamborees at which these classes are formed - making it a double effort to attract new dancers and fulfilling an ethical obligation.
- 8 That clubs in financial difficulties would consider joining forces with other clubs in order to remain active. Talking it over would be a healthy start.

SETS IN ORDER AMERICAN SQUARE DANCE SOCIETY

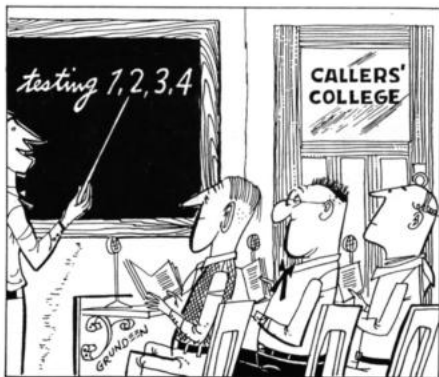
If this activity had a cartoonist-laureat, it very well could have been Frank Grunden. Frank, a free-lance artist whose credits included work with the Walt Disney organization, came into square dancing in 1947 when he and Ethel, his wife, joined one of Bob Osgood's classes at Beverly Hills (CA) High School.

It was just at this time that a new square dance magazine was about to be born and Frank was recruited on the spot as its "official cartoonist". With the introduction of Sets in Order, in November, 1948, Frank drew the first of his 444 cartoons that would appear on the back cover of each issue for the next 37 years.

Over the years Frank's ideas captured the joy and friendliness of the activity. No phase of square dancing was spared. The dancers, callers, round dancers, new dancers -- all aspects of square dancing were singled out at one time or another. He saw the fun side of everything and shared it with many thousands of dancers over the years.

With the closing of Sets in Order (Square Dancing Magazine) in December, 1985, Frank's work with the magazine was complete. Somehow he must have known this for, barely three weeks into the new year, Frank passed away suddenly and without any lingering illness. He will be missed but, as in the case of the magazine itself, he has said his piece and hopefully, future generations of square dancers will have occasion to enjoy his work.

4. Going to dances with a good outlook, smiling faces and a willingness to help others in the square.

There are numerous other things that can help keep square dancing alive, but it all boils down to one thing—stop thinking of ourselves and have a little more compassion for the new dancer and our fellow man. We all have feelings. Treat others as we would like to be treated.

Wouldn't all of us dancers who have been around a good while, and think we know most everything from Mainstream to A-2 or higher, look funny if our arms kept on growing from pulling and tugging at dancers we thought didn't know as much as we did?

Let's all try to be "square angels" occasionally and after a club graduates, keep working hard to have the new dancers want to stay on and make this new hobby a part of their lives as we all have.

We all are quick to say square dancing seems to be dying out. Why? Wouldn't it be a shame if each of us dancers as individuals were some small part of the cause?

Let's all evaluate ourselves and help square dancing come back to life!

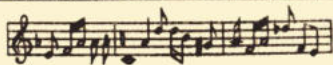
