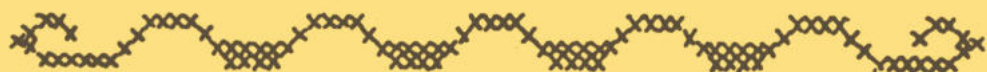

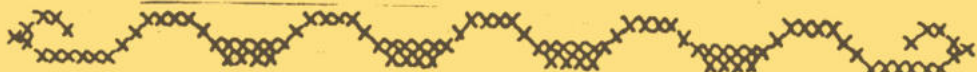

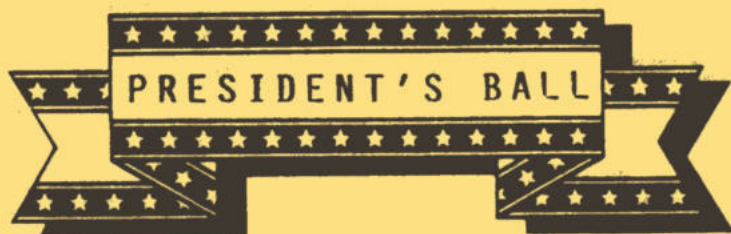

TO MAKE THIS WORK YOUR COOPERATION IS DEFINITELY REQUIRED AND WE BELIEVE YOU WILL SEE THE BENEFITS OF THIS PROCEDURE AT YOUR FUTURE DANCES.

EDITOR'S REMARKS:

ALL ABOUT SPECIAL DANCES

One of the assets of being the GRAPEVINE Editors is that we are invited and get to attend a lot of the SPECIAL DANCES. We don't even think twice about going, we just mark the events on our calendar and go. Sometimes there are conflicts and this makes us unhappy. We are forced to make a choice. It is especially upsetting when both events are advertised in The Grapevine and we make every effort to attend all advertised Specials to take pictures (and enjoy ourselves too). It's not fair. We miss a lot of good dances.

We are just one couple in Jacksonville. If we have this problem of making choices it stands to reason YOU do too. Now the obvious solution to this particular problem is "eliminate the need to make a choice". Sounds easy, right! If it were only that simple. But, we (all of us) could sure try.

SECTION IX, D of the Northeast Florida Square and Round Dance Association's By-Laws (concerning this particular problem) reads:

"THE GRAPEVINE SHALL MAINTAIN A CHRONOLOGICAL LIST OF ALL OPEN (SPECIAL) DANCES IN THIS AREA IN ORDER THAT CLUBS MAY, IF THEY DESIRE, AVOID CONFLICTING DATES FOR SPECIAL DANCES. (CLUBS ARE URGED TO ADVISE THE GRAPEVINE OF THEIR EXPECTED SPECIAL DANCES WHEN SCHEDULED AND TRY TO AVOID DATES WHEN OTHER CLUBS HAVE SCHEDULED SPECIAL DANCES.)"

It would be advantageous to all clubs and callers and individuals if these suggestions were followed. EVERYONE WOULD HAVE BETTER ATTENDANCE and PROFITS and FUN. The excuse that "WE are on one side of town and THEY are on the other" isn't logical. Most square dancers will travel to enjoy a good dance.

One solution would be to combine efforts. If you are planning a special dance invite another club that dances on the same night to join forces with you. This way all the duties could be split as well as the profits and the callers could have a break and even get to dance with their taws. It stands to reason more people would be in attendance and you would gather visitors from both clubs as well as others who will want to join in the fun (if the dance is well advertized).

How about having special benefit dances on Sunday afternoons or early evening? Maybe even include a covered dish supper? This would be a great treat once in awhile, dinner out, dancing, socializing and supporting a worthy cause all at the same time?

We feel this system will really work and that you, the square dancer, will profit the most from this new procedure.

Caller of the Month: EDDIE & ANN MILLAN

Eddie began his calling career in 1962 and celebrates 25 years in the profession in May. He learned to square dance from Floyd Hagger and at the ripe old age of 15 began his calling career with a pre-teen club. At age 17 he took over an all adult club when their caller retired. He was caller/choreographer for a teenage exhibition group who performed on a local TV show and on stage at the Coliseum for a country music festival where he was interviewed by a reporter from the famed Nashville paper "The Music City News".

Eddie became one of the youngest members of the Florida Callers Assoc. and traveled throughout the state. Calling helped him work his way through University of South Florida. He then spent two years in the Navy and then resumed his calling full speed ahead.

Eddie and Ann met at a square dance, married here in Jacksonville and lived in Tampa until he finished school. He even spent his Navy time at Mayport. He really got 'to see the world' didn't he? They have two children Scott, age 15 and Marty, age 13. Eddie is employed as a teacher with the Duval County School System and during their summers they traveled all around the United States and took the boys with them. He now calls for Lone Star Swingers on a regular basis and does quite a lot of out of town calling on the weekends.

In 1980 he began recording on Mountain Records and has quite a few records to his credit, but, after four years he started his own company, 'Cloverleaf Records' and his first release "Uncle Pen" was ranked in 5th place in sales by a national distributor. Other releases include "Dixie Hoedown/Rubber Dolly" and "City of New Orleans" and Alabama Jubilee".

Eddie has quite a list of calling accomplishments a few of which are: Asst. Staff Caller - Cope Crest; Staff Caller, Walnut Meadows Square Dance Center, Berea, Ky; Square Dance Center, Lolo, Montana; Prairie Mt. Festival, Chicago, IL; Natl Trail Dance, Columbus, OH; FL Single-Rama, Orlando, FL; Five National Square Dance Conventions; Natl Single-Rama Conv, 1984; SC State Conv., Myrtle Beach, SC; FL State Conv., 1965, St. Lucie County S/D Festival, Ft. Pierce, FL, etc., etc.

Locally has called for Swingin' Saints, Seabreeze Singles, started Dixie Grands and Arky Stars. Eddie and Ann are now in the dry cleaning business, "Lady Diane" in Orange Park. This private

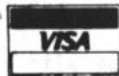

CALLER'S CORNER



It's time to review this year's class. How many new dancers did you start with/ How many do you still have/ How many will you graduate/ And, most importantly, how many will still be dancing a year from now?

Many callers have agreed that the major problem faced by callers and dancers alike (and a major reason for drop-outs) is the rush for new dancers to learn the Mainstream basics, then the pressure to learn most, if not all, the Plus Program in order to dance with the club and at yearly festival dances.

Who is responsible for this problem. Well, no one person, but a combination of factors contribute. For example, the Callerlab Plus Program is a very inviting level of dance for many dancers. The club dictates to the caller that when the students graduate they should be able to dance with the club...so teach them all they need to know in 30-35 weeks. Then there are the new dancers' friends urging them to hurry up and learn so they can all go dancing together. And lastly, the caller, who falls into all these traps and teaches two, three, or even four calls a session...so that the lists are covered, but, very little is retained well.

How do we stop or slow down this loss, within one year's time, of about 50% of all new dancers? First, it will take the combined efforts of callers, dancers, and leaders.

For the callers...show as much enthusiasm as you can during your class sessions. Teach slowly, and make sure the dancers understand and can execute one call before going on to the next. If you don't teach a single call during a session, but, the dancers enjoyed the evening, they will return for the next session. Don't ever let learning become work for your class. Remember, square dancing is the recreation these new dancers have chosen. If they ever cease to enjoy themselves they will turn to some other recreation, and you will have one drop-out after another.

For the club dancer and member...attend the class sessions with one thing in mind. That is, to try to help the class members enjoy themselves. Mingle with them, trying to make them feel as welcome and comfortable as possible. Dance with them, doing the calls exactly as they are being taught. Don't do the latest Flip Wilson Left-Allemands...leave out all the twirls and the short-cuts. Don't sit in a corner of the room with other club members and talk about the dance you just attended, or the one you are going to

attend. The evening should be devoted entirely to the new dancers.

This is when they will be forming their opinions of your club and its members, and it will have a great bearing on whether they stick with it or drop out. (I might add a comment here on club economics.

If you have occasion to attend a club other than your home club's, offer your donation at the door. Some building and hall rentals are based on attendance, and someone must pay the bill!)

Finally, the club presidents, association president, board of directors, and all other officers can help too. These are the people with almost unlimited responsibilities who have been chosen by their fellow dancers to lead and guide the activities. As such, when planning the various dances, they should have the welfare of all dancers in mind at all times and should strive to execute their duties efficiently. If any extra care is given, it should be given to the mainstream dancers. After all, they are the life's blood and future of all levels of square dancing!.

I know that the suggestions I've touched upon here are not the only solutions, but, I do feel that they would go a long way toward improving our activities.

One added comment: Twenty years ago when we held our Fifth Saturday Dances, there would be twenty square in attendance. Today our Fifth Saturday Dances are still attracting twenty squares. Haven't we been spinning our wheels?

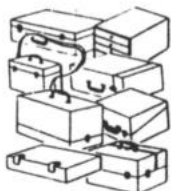

GUIDELINES FOR NEW DANCERS

Dance at Other Clubs: Your club needs your support and there should always be a special place for the club where you learned to dance, but you are missing one of the great things about square dancing if you only dance with your home club.

Dance to Other Callers: During your lessons you tuned in to the caller who taught you and you will always have a special place for him. Every caller has a different style and that's all part of the fun.

Don't Dance in the Back of the Hall: The tendency for the newer dancer is to hide in the back of the hall where he thinks the caller can't see his square break down. A good caller watches the whole floor, including the back. There also may be a sound problem there. Don't be afraid to take your turn dancing in front.

Don't Dance Just With Other New Dancers: Sometimes an outreached hand from a more experienced dancer is all your square needs to keep going. Everyone dancing today was a new dancer at one time and can remember how it felt.

Touch Hands After Every Move: Establish your position by touching hands at the end of each move. If you are lost, at least you will know you have company.

Keep Dancing This Summer: To make all this new information you have jammed in your head become second nature, it's important to practice, practice, practice.

Be Aware of Your Dancing Level: Look for dances advertised at the level you know.

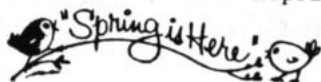
Don't Be in a Hurry to Dance Other Levels: The level you dance has nothing to do with how good a dancer you are. It has to do with how much time you have to devote to the hobby. You may never choose to move to another level and that's fine. Don't make a choice until you have danced Mainstream for at least one full year after graduation. Don't let anyone else rush you!

Don't Take Square Dancing Too Seriously: Square dancing is for fun. The odds are pretty good that someone is going to make a mistake (once in a while even a caller makes one). Don't worry about whose fault it was. It doesn't matter. Regroup and keep smiling.

Finally: Jump right up when the music starts; get in the first open square; introduce yourself; smile and have fun. Thank everyone when the tip is over. While taking a break, make sure the round dancers can hear their cuer.

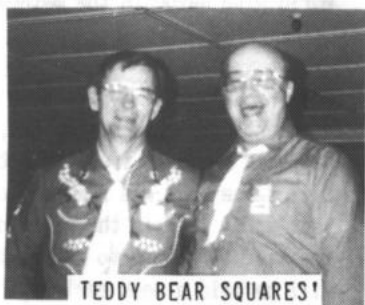

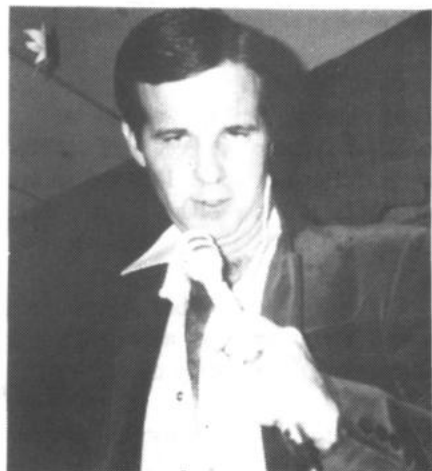

At the same time, the numbers three and four dancers move forward to form a momentary box of four, then do a Walk & Dodge. Ends in an Eight Chain Thru formation.

THE LANGUAGE OF SQUARE DANCE PROGRAMMING

There seems to be a great deal of variety, and some confusion, regarding the designation of dance programs throughout the square dance world. One sees program designations such as MS+, MS Plus, MSQS, Soft Plus, etc. What do these terms mean? They really tell us nothing or explain exactly what we should know or how much. "There is no program called Mainstream Quarterly Selections Program, (MSQS). These experimental calls are intended for use in Mainstream Workshops.

No dancer is required to know the QS calls to attend a MS open dance. If such calls are used, the caller is to teach them if necessary. Please advertise dance programs as MS not MSQS".

Proper program designations help dancers to find that dance where they can be most comfortable and can have the greatest enjoyment. Use of the proper terms aids both dancers and callers. The correct program designations are shown below. All lists are current as of February 2, 1987.

Basic Program (B) - Numbers 1 through 49 (4/18/84)

Mainstream Program (MS) - Numbers 1 through 68 (4/18/84)

Plus (+) - The Mainstream Program and 27 calls on Plus Program.

Advanced One (A1) - The Mainstream and Plus Programs and 38 calls on A1 Program. (9/85)

Advanced Two (A2) - The Mainstream and Plus Programs plus 78 calls on A2 Program. (9/85)

Basic Challenge (C1) - The Mainstream, Plus, Advanced and 64 calls on C1 Program. (11/85)

Extended Challenge (C2) - The Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, C1 and 76 calls on the C2 program. (12/85)

3. THOU SHALT NOT: ridicule those dancers possessing two left hands but shall endeavor to help them distinguish one from the other.
4. THOU SHALT: strive to dance in different squares, thereby giving to all the benefit of thy fine personality and great experience.
5. THOU SHALT NOT: anticipate or dance ahead of thy caller for he is of fiendish nature and possessed of evil powers to make you appear ill-prepared in the eyes of thy fellow dancers.
6. THOU SHALT NOT: moan and belittle the caller, thy partner, nor the slippery floor when thou has goofed, for this is likely thine own mistake.
7. THOU SHALT: clean thyself diligently before the dance, thereby creating a pleasant aroma for thy partner. Men should wear long sleeved shirts and women should wear dresses.
8. THOU SHALT: remain silent while thy caller gives advice and instruction.
9. THOU SHALT NOT: partake of strong drink before or during the dance, least thy mind becomes befuddled and confused.
10. THOU SHALT: strive diligently to observe these commandments and thy reward shall be great; for ye shall have many friends and shall be called **SQUARE DANCER**.

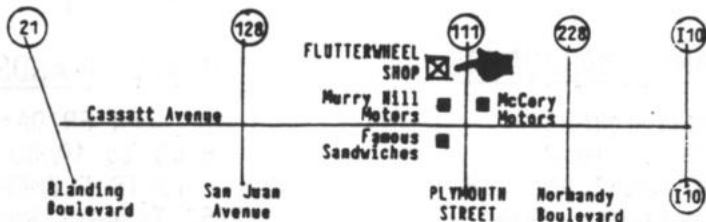

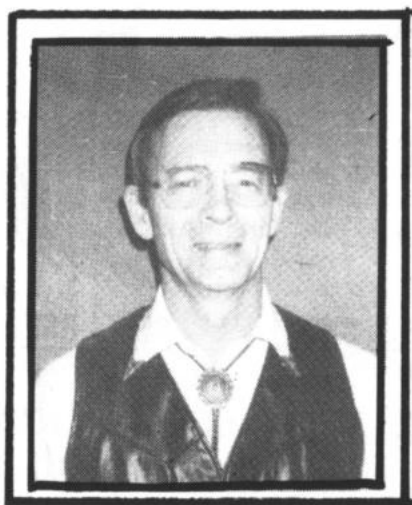

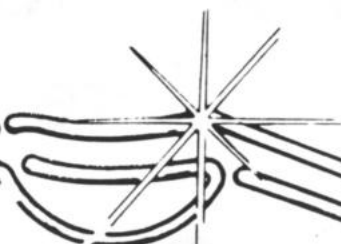
