## CALLER OF THE MONTH

### \* R. J. & JOANIE HOGAN \*

On December 13, 1930 in Chiefland, Florida, a very special caller was born and was named R.J. Hogan. At an early age while riding a school bus he made acquaintance with a pretty young gal and use to save a seat for her. Unfortunately, Joanie's family moved to south Florida and they lost touch for awhile. They met again in their teens and this time it was for keeps. They were married October 13th, 1950 (yes, it was a Friday the 13th). (It appears 13 must be R.J.'s lucky number.) They are proud parents of a daughter Lanita Hogan Brown (who is married to Reggie L. Brown) and the proud grandparents of two grandsons, Alexander (age 9) and Christopher (age 6). They presently reside in Naples, FL.

R.J. served with the U.S. Marines and later was employed by Southern Bell Telephone Company and just recently retired after 32 years service with them.

As the story goes, R.J. wasn't going to learn to square dance because he just didn't have enough time to learn. Joanie signed them up two years straight, but, he would never go. The third year a group of fellow employees from the Telephone Company conned him into going just one time. Well, that was in 1964, and that's all it took, because as you know, he hasn't missed a week since either going to or calling a dance. They learned to square dance from Dick Gonzales in Gainesville at a club called The Swinging Squares. Back in those days there were only 12 basic lessons.

R.J. began his calling career when Dick retired from calling. He had made the comment that before he would give up square dancing he would learn to call and the next week one of the club members came with records, record player, etc. and told R.J., "You are now our caller". The Swinging Squares was the only square dance club in town, so, he learned to call and several months later R.J. started his first class with six squares.

On several occasions before 1987 and as a regular since, he has called for the Florida State Convention and the Georgia State Convention from 1971 thru 1975; was on staff at English Mountain Square Dance Retreat 1986, '87 and again in June of this year; Blue Gray Festival, Lake City from 1982 thru 1985; he has also called for 3 cruises to Bahama's and one to Bermuda; has several bus tours to Nashville, Tennessee and one tour to the World Fair in Knoxville, Tennessee.

He is a member of Callerlab, Florida Caller's Association, Gateway Caller's Association and has served as President of the Rural Caller's Association for two years and over the years has served on various committees with all these organizations.

At present he calls for Bass Capital Squares in Georgetown, FL; OTOW Wheel-A-Round Squares in Ocala, FL.; Starlite Twirlers in Gainesville, FL.; Whirl-A-Ways in Hawthorne, FL. and makes appearances at Flagler Ocean Waves, Crystal Twirlers in Crystal River and Groveland Squares.

R.J. and Joanie have a small ranch with 100 head of cattle where he will be spending a lot of time since he has retired. Joanie is presently employed at

Nekoosa Packaging Corp. (formerly Owens-Illinois) and has 30 years service with them. (Think she will retire soon?) Another hobby is gardening and his spring garden is already planted and he has plans to get in some fishing real soon.

February 16, 1988 is his official retirement date but, he has been on vacation since December 1987 and is really having a good time.

In all his years of being associated with square dancing and calling the one thing that will always stand out among his favorite memories is the time in 1986 that the Wheel-A-Round Squares of Ocala held a special "R.J. HOGAN DAY". Everyone all over Florida knew about this event for months except R.J. It was the biggest surprise of his life -- over 300 people attended; all his clubs, his whole family and square dance friends from all over Florida. He still doesn't know how they all kept that secret from him. Even Joanie was in on it, (she told him they had a demo to do for the City of Ocala and all they had to do was be there at 2pm). This was truly an honor that he will always remember.

When asked "How would you like to be remembered?": Fair, Honest and Friendly were the words he used. If you look these words up in the dictionary they describe how R.J. would like to be remembered.
