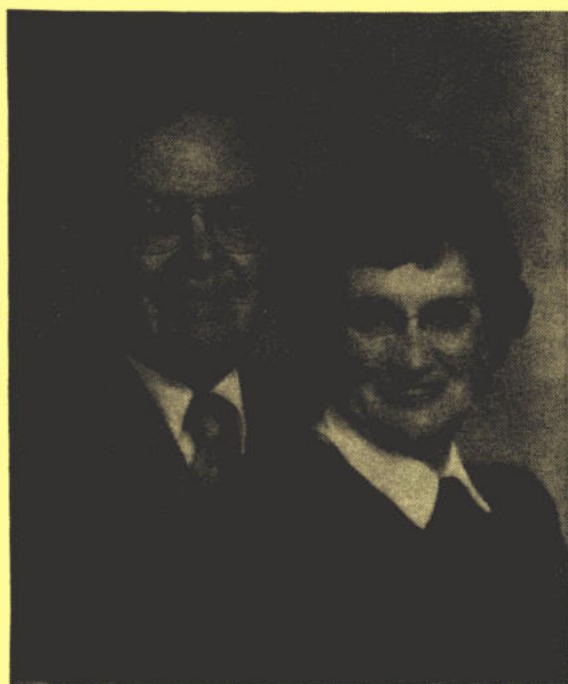

Roll call was taken, 11 clubs present, a quorum was not established.

MINUTES: Jan. minutes were distributed to the delegates and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer, Mary Downing, reported as follows: Opening Balance \$1,356.88; Credits \$2,061.25; Expenses \$4,925.63; Balance \$447.46 as of March 12, 1989.

FIFTH SATURDAY DANCE: Ray Reedy, Chairman, announced the next dance will be held on April 29, 1989 at Sandalwood Jr/Sr High School. Callers Ken Perez and Bill Chesnut, Rounds Jim & Barb Winters. Chairman urged that each club be represented by at least one square.

FALL ROUNDUP 88: Mary Downing reported: Credits \$2,899.25; Expenses \$4,010.26; Ads to be collected \$155.00; making a net loss of \$956.01.

FALL ROUNDUP 89: Chairman, Mary Downing, reported ticket sales totaled \$90.00, \$300.00 deposit has been paid to Civic Auditorium. Cost of auditorium will be approximately \$1,000. Ribbons \$83.45 and advance flyers \$6.36 are paid. A committee meeting will be held 3/19/89 at Mary's home.

FALL ROUNDUP '90 and '91: president expressed a need for someone to serve as chairman of 1990 and 1991 Fall Roundup and asked for volunteers for these positions.

GATEWAY CALLERS: Lawton Smith announced that the Graduation Ball will be held on Apr. 15, 1989 at the Ramona Pavilion.

THE GRAPEVINE: Shad Shadwell reported that the Guidelines for Banner Stealing were printed in Feb/Mar issue. Request was made to submit questions concerning square dancing for "Who-When-Where?" article. An effort to attend all Graduation Dances and take pictures will be made for Jun/Jul issue. NEFSARDA will furnish New Dancer's Book to new grads and special offer of GV for 50 cents per issue for new students is available.

INSURANCE: Harvey Shriver reported there are 967 dancers insured and 21 clubs. Clubs should request that schools be insured.

STATE CONVENTION: Aaron Fry, chairman, reported that 25% of the proceeds from state convention will go to NEFSARDA, yet, less tickets have been sold in Northeast Florida than any other area. To date 900 tickets have been sold. Florida Singles have designated the Radison Hotel as their headquarters. Fashion Show will feature club outfits from Northeast FL area. Each club is requested to provide one couple to model their club outfit. Grand March will be under direction of Lawton Smith. Live Band will play Sat night for MS and Sun night for Plus dancing. Virginia Cook is in charge of decorations. Band will play for "After Party" Sat night at Omni Hotel. George & Nancy Wolfert are Host Chairmen and need volunteers. Campground fees will be \$9.00 per night and shuttle bus will cost \$10.00 per person for entire weekend. Parking at Expo Center parking lot will cost \$2.00 per day. Clarice Shadwell designed cover of the program book.

CREDIT CARD: United Square Dancers of America made arrangements to have a Master Card, credit card with their name imprinted on card. There is a \$20.00 annual fee for this card. The FL Federation will divide the portion of monies they receive with five districts. NEFSARDA will receive a portion of this annual fee from FL Federation. The card is silver in color and should help publicize square dancing.

OLD BUSINESS: New Dancer's Book; Virgil Green moved that NEFSARDA continue the practice of giving this information booklet to new dancers. MOTION CARRIED.

NEW BUSINESS: Shad Shadwell introduced Bob Hornsby who is a new caller to the area. He is presently calling in St. Augustine. His wife, Nean Hornsby, is a round dance teacher and cuer.

Next meeting will be held on May 7th, 1989 at 2:00pm.

Meeting adjourned at 2:55pm.

Each day of the year volunteer blood donors save premature babies, accident victims, people undergoing surgery and many more. Every blood donation may help as many as three different patients in need.

Premature babies rarely have sufficient oxygen carrying capacity in their blood and "mini-transfusions" can give them the time they need in order to mature. A heart-lung machine cannot even be started without six units of blood! Accident victims may need blood just to replace blood they have lost. Cancer patients undergoing treatment may not produce sufficient blood cells, but a blood donor can offer the cells they need. People with leukemia may reach remission because volunteer donors made sure they had time to undergo therapy.

Twenty-two hospitals are located in the greater Jacksonville area. Patients in these hospitals need 50,000 units of blood each year. Blood is a unique, life-giving fluid which cannot be duplicated in a laboratory setting. It comes only from caring volunteers.

Somewhere in the Jacksonville area there are men, women and children who are alive and well thanks to you. Perhaps you have never thought of your donation of blood as a "gift of life", but you should. Isn't it a wonderful feeling?

If you are CAMPING at the Central Florida Fairgrounds, there will be a shuttle bus to and fro to the Expo Center.

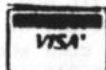

MEMO to SQUARE DANCERS
Who Do Not ROUND DANCE
by Dave & Nita Smith
Lubbock, Texas

Square dancing and round dancing compliment each other. We wholeheartedly believe that square and round dancing go hand in hand and a separation would be a great loss to both activities. People who do both square and round dancing will stay in the activity longer than those who do only one or the other. When interest in one lags, the other will keep them going to dances.

We predict a greater increase in round dancers for the new dance season than any prior season. Why? Because square dance callers are getting involved with round dancing. Square dance callers are recognizing the value of having round dancers in the squares. In most cases, square dancers who also round dance are smoother square dancers than those who do not. Several contributing factors make this true.

First and most important, round dancers learn to step on the beat of the music. Round dancers are choreographed so that there is a definite pattern of steps that fit the music. Round dancers learn to hear this beat and step in time to the music or else they cannot perform the dance routine. Each round dance basic contains an exact number of steps to complete. Dancers must take all steps and no extra steps in order to complete a basic within a measure of music. We are not experts on square dance movements, but we believe that most square dance basics are also designed to use a certain number of steps. Most of us have noticed that our favorite callers are the ones who can put the square dance movements together with the music they are using, creating smooth and enjoyable dancing because every movement "fits" the music. But in square dancing, it is not absolutely necessary to take a

certain number of steps for a movement as it is in round dancing, and some square dancers not trained in round dancing take short cuts, finishing ahead of the measure, or put extra moves into a figure, finishing behind the other members of the square, causing other dancers to stand and wait.

Secondly, round dancers learn to listen to music phrasing and will dance within the phrasing and at the tempo the music dictates. Also, round dancers are constantly being reminded to use proper posture and styling and therefore generally develop a habit of smooth and graceful dancing that carries over onto the square dance floor.

We, of course, are not saying that all round dancers are beautiful square dancers. Neither are we saying that all square dancers who do not round dance cannot dance smoothly or do not step on the beat of the music. We are saying that generally round dancers make better square dancers, and we can practically guarantee that square dancers who learn to round dance will enjoy their square dancing more than ever before.

We appreciate all square dance callers, and we want to thank those who encourage their dancers to learn to round dance, those who get out and round dance between their own calling tips, and those who cooperate with and encourage the round dance cuers at square dances.

Square dancers, ask your caller how he feels about round dancing.

Round dancers, thank your callers -- they are creating a renewed enthusiasm and a new interest in round dancing and helping to keep square and round dancing together where they belong!

THE LANGUAGE OF SQUARE DANCE PROGRAMMING

There seems to be a great deal of variety, and some confusion, regarding the designation of dance programs throughout the square dance world. At conventions, festivals, and club dances; and in various publicity releases and publications, one sees program designations such as MS+, MS Plus, Soft Plus, etc. What do these terms mean? Does MS+ indicate that the dancers should know some calls outside of the Mainstream Program? If so, which calls? Or does it mean that, in addition to Mainstream Program dancing, there will be some sort of added attraction?

Terms such as Soft Plus really tell us nothing, since the "soft" part, like beauty, is in the eye of the beholder (or, probably, the caller for the evening). When one sees the MS Plus designation, he probably assumes that the dancer will be expected to know some of the Plus Program calls. However, which Plus calls does he need to know for that particular dance or caller?

The latest publication of the CALLERLAB Basic and Mainstream Programs makes it clear with this statement: "There is NO PROGRAM called the Mainstream/Plus program. No dancer is required to know Plus calls to attend a Mainstream open dance. If such calls are used, the caller is to teach them if necessary. Please advertise dance programs as Mainstream or Plus, NOT Mainstream/Plus."

Proper program designations help dancers find a dance where they can be most comfortable and can have the greatest enjoyment. Club officers must tell callers what program they are expected to call. We need to be more specific and careful in designating dance programs. Club officers and dancers need to be more insistent that callers adhere to the advertised program. Use of vague and incorrect programming language leads to confusion and frustration. Use of the proper terms aids both dancers and callers alike.

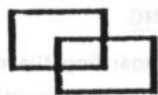

TO THE EDITOR

I would like to put in a rebuttal against the NEFSARDA President's message in the Feb/Mar issue of the Grapevine, regarding the last paragraph having to do with the level of the NEFSARDA dances.

I agree that Mainstream is the foundation of square dancing and a lot of attention and leadership should go into helping that level. However, I do not feel that you should do this to the point of completely ignoring the other levels of square dancing. I agree that the Advance, Plus and Challenge dancers can dance Mainstream, and I really don't think that the majority of them object to dancing Mainstream. It is the way it is put together or choreographed.

But, telling us all to dance Mainstream throughout the year is like telling 12th grade students to read first grade books so that first graders and 12th graders can all read together. I don't think the 12th graders would enjoy first grade reading, just as Challenge level dancers may not enjoy Mainstream dances. Sometimes it is okay, but, not 100%.

Myself, personally, look at square dancing like building a house with the foundation being Mainstream, complete with the roof being Challenge. We can't just keep building foundations. I feel that the foundation for our house of square dancing in the Northeast is weak. The walls are shaking and the roof is leaning.

Don't take this personal, George, I don't think it is your fault, I think it is the fault of all of us, mine, yours, the other dancers and the callers. I do think we have to look to you as the NEFSARDA President for leadership and guidance. Using your figures there are 21 Mainstream clubs and 10 Plus clubs. I think the Plus clubs should get their fair share. In view of the board's point of view, why would any club Plus or higher want to be a member of the Northeast, since you are only going to do things for Mainstream.

Are there any other points of view out there? I would welcome other opinions.
