WHAT IS CALLERLAB?

I have talked with many many people involved with square dancing who do not know what CALLERLAB is or what it has done and can do for our activity. This is surprising because of the tremendous influence CALLERLAB has had on square dancing.

CALLERLAB is an association of active callers established to assist the members in all aspects of their involvement in the activity and to provide for the coordinated application of skill and experience of the members.

One of the biggest contributions CALLERLAB has made is the standardization of square dance definitions and program lists. The increased mobility of today's dancer makes standard programs essential. In the days before CALLERLAB we could go to a "CLUB LEVEL" dance and not know a good portion of the moves being called, even though we were "CLUB LEVEL" dancers in our home location.

The Quarterly Selection process provides a "proving ground" for new moves. New moves are added to the appropriate program QS list. A move stays on the QS list at least 6 months, during this time those callers and clubs which wish to use the new move are encouraged to do so and to grade its merit. If the move survives this "test of time" it can stay on the QS list for a maximum of 3 years. At the end of this period, it must come off the QS list and may be added to the appropriate program list. Several of our popular moves have gone through this process.

Through communication, members are kept up-to-date on the associations activities. This information is available to you through your local CALLERLAB members.

Roll call was taken, 13 clubs were present, a quorum was not established.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

5th SAT DANCE: The new Chairman will be Hollis & Mary Fowler. The NE will have 4 banners available at the 5th Sat Dances. Clubs with the most in attendance (1st & 2nd Place) and clubs with the highest percentage (1st & 2nd place) present will steal these banners. The NE Board, before the next 5th Sat Dance will retrieve these banners from those clubs.

FALL FESTIVAL: The name Fall Roundup has been replaced with Fall Festival. There will be a trail-end dance on Friday and the Festival on Saturday (Nov 16 & 17). A Fall Festival Chairman is still needed.

GATEWAY CALLERS: GCA has changed it's next meeting from Apr 8 to the 22nd. The 5th Sat Dance in June will be called by the GCA and proceeds will be exclusively for promotion of lessons.

GRAPEVINE: The Northeast Florida Club Directories have been made and will be mailed to subscribers in their April-May issue. New student handbooks will be available for the Graduation Ball. The NEFSARDA will pay for these books for new dancers.

USDA PROGRAM: There are 16 clubs registered for insurance (784 dancers). Dec 1st will be the new deadline for 1991 insurance registration.

BLOOD BANK: The Blood Bank dance had 10 squares and \$83 donated at the door.

STATE CONVENTION: A 1994 State Convention Chairperson is still needed. A corrected address for mailing registration forms was given. (See ad in GV for correct address).

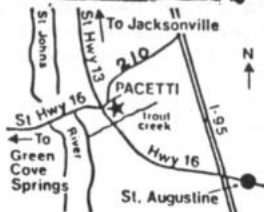

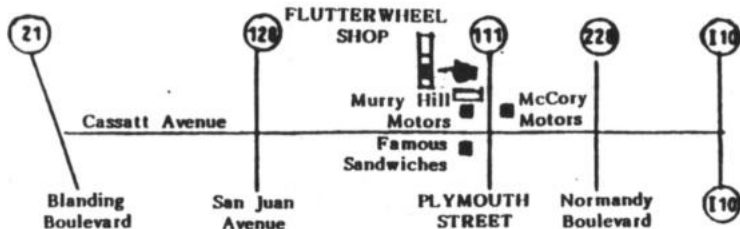

The school's two lunch lines previously served standard school menu fare. One line has been converted to Walker's Deli, which is named after cafeteria Manager Doris Walker. The new line dishes out hamburgers, hot dogs, french fries, milkshakes, ice cream, snack cakes, nachos, french bread pizza and chicken sandwiches, among other entrees. A three-day-a-week baked potato bar and a two-day-a-week spaghetti bar are planned, Fowler said.

"We're going to try a little bit of everything," Fowler said.

The price of the Type A meal, \$1.35, is the same for both lunch lines, but snacks cost extra.
