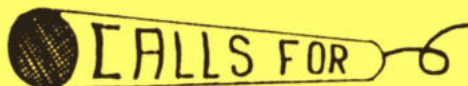

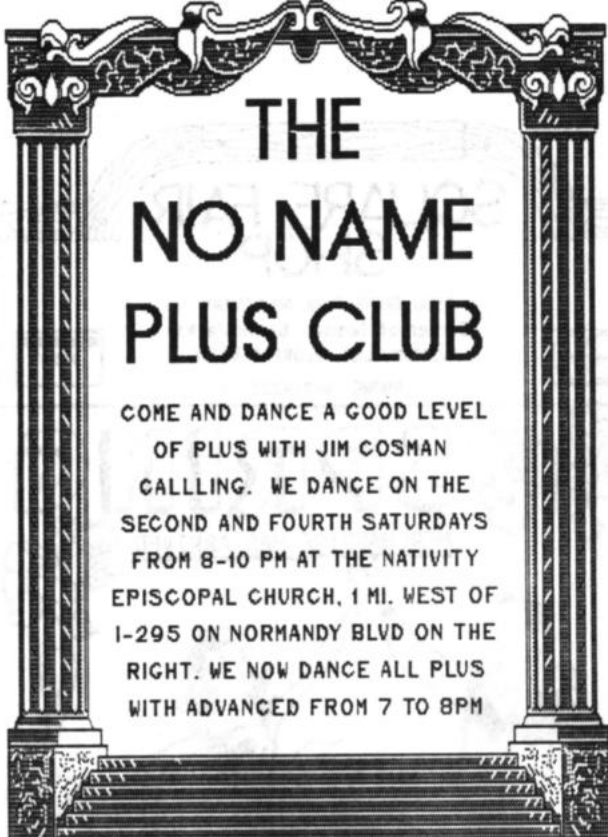

FLORIDA WILL BID TO HOST NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION

During the Florida Federation's working weekend, Worley Carrier (Chairman of last year's State Convention) proposed that Florida make a bid to host the National Square Dance Convention in 1997. The Federation Delegates overwhelmingly voted YES and elected him to be the Bid Chairman.

At the Nov. meeting of the Federation, a member of the National Convention Committee met with the Delegates and listed the guidelines that must be followed in order to hold a National Convention. He also reviewed the various facilities and sites that Worley and his group had investigated. Of those, only the Orlando Convention Center met the criteria as to size, location, and number of hotel rooms in close proximity.

Although the actual bid is not officially presented until 4 years prior (1993 in this case), an announcement can be made at this year's National that Florida intends to bid for 1997.

It is essential that the National Committee know that Florida dancers will support this, therefore - ALL FLORIDIANS WHO ARE GOING TO THE NATIONAL THIS YEAR IN SALT LAKE CITY ARE ASKED TO ATTEND THE BID SESSION. Everyone will be asked to sit together so that at the appropriate time, under Worley and Nan's guidance, we can cheer so that it will be obvious to the National Committee that Florida dancers support this 100%. Come prepared to holler, clap, stomp your feet, ring bells, blow whistles and perhaps even participate in a more organized choreography.

Join the Fun! It will be a day you won't forget! If it "flies" the Central Florida Ass'n will be deeply involved. Get in on the excitement right from the beginning!

40TH NSDC SEMINARS

The very heart and substance of any NSDC is the opportunity to learn more about your role as dancer, caller, cuer, prompter and leader. Seminars, panels and clinics offer this opportunity to listen and learn from some of the best and most experienced people in square dancing today.

Seminars are the educational backbone in square dancing. At the 40th NSDC, each International organization will offer education relevant to its charter and area of specialization. Those organizations are:

LEGACY, the International Assembly of "Trustees" of the Square Dance Activity. LEGACY is the "home office" of square dance composed of members (trustees) representing all facets of the square dance community. They are the ones who ask, "What can we do to help further, promote and perpetuate square dance". LEGACY will conduct three 2-hour seminars on topics from "Everything a Club Leader Needs to Know" to "How to Conduct Leadership Training Sessions". Don't miss it!

Callerslab, The International Association of Square Dance Callers. These seminars, two 2-hour sessions per day, will be conducted by accredited caller coaches presenting topics necessary for caller improvement and contribution to the activity. Even if you are not a caller but would like a bit of insight into calling, attend these sessions-it may just be an eye opener!

Roundalab, The International Association of Round Dance Teachers. Three 2-hour sessions presenting subjects ranging from cueing, styling, rhythms and teaching are done by folks known for their knowledge of the subject matter and ability to pass it on. It's another great opportunity to enhance your ability and expand your knowledge and concepts. Interested dancers and future cuers are invited to attend.

Contralab, The International Association of Contra Callers. Three 2-hour seminars will be presented concerning the facets of contra calling and dancing, i.e. music, timing and use of contra in square and round dance clubs as a tool to teach timing. Callers, cuers and dancers can expand their capabilities and enjoy a "triple treat".

UTAH TRIVIA

BMI/ASCAP UPDATE

In October 1990 many clubs and callers received a mailing from Broadcast Music Inc (BMI) offering contracts for the use of copyrighted music. The proposed rate for these licenses was \$15 per dance. Responding to the uproar of concern that resulted, CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB entered into negotiations with BMI. The goal was to arrange a licensing agreement that would be reasonable in cost and would relieve the individual clubs from the responsibility for the license.

BMI is one of the two major associations that administer copyright control for the composers and publishers of music. The other is the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP). These two associations are the legal representatives of the composers of most of the music you hear today and most of the singing calls and round dance tunes used in the square dance activity. Patter call music is often in the public domain which means it is old enough to no longer be covered by copyright or it was never covered under copyright in the first place. CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB have successfully the fees with both organizations. Licenses will be issued through the two organizations to callers and round dance leaders who are members of their respective organizations. Use of licensed leaders will relieve the clubs of the obligation to have a license for regular club dances, workshops and classes.

This update is being published in response to the many questions received in the CALLERLAB Home Office regarding the pending licensing agreement between BMI/ASCAP and CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB. As you were previously advised, we (CALLERLAB & ROUNDALAB) are nearing completion of our negotiations with BMI (Broadcast Music Inc) and ASCAP (American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers). It is anticipated that these agreements will be signed shortly after our 1991 Las Vegas Convention. For all intents and purposes, our negotiations with each of these organizations are considered to have been completed. Please remember that these contracts are to become effective on or about APRIL 1, 1991! Three year contracts are being negotiated. The contracts will be renewed at the end of each year. Until April 1st or such time as the contracts are signed, both BMI and ASCAP have agreed to suspend any and all actions currently being pursued involving the square and round dance activities.

In the hopes of answering some of the most commonly asked questions we are providing the following information given in the last issue of DIRECTION and also disseminated via press releases to all CALLERLAB publications. Yes, CALLERLAB has received legal counsel regarding, (1) the need to negotiate with each of these organizations and, (2) during the negotiating process itself. In addition, legal counsel is being sought to examine the finalized contracts before they are signed. It was determined that BMI and ASCAP are within their legal rights to pursue such licensing and thus, the decision was made that CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB would pursue obtaining a blanket license on behalf of their respective organizations.

IN RESPONSE TO THE MOST COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS (a brief summarization - specific details follow) ---

* The licensing agreements with BMI and ASCAP will become effective on or about April 1, 1991 and will be effective for one (1) year. A three year contract has been negotiated with each organization. Such contracts will be reviewed and renewed at the end of each year.

* One Night Stands and weekends ARE covered under the negotiated agreements.

* Clubs and other sponsors who choose to hire a caller or cuer who is not properly licensed are operating at risk unless, of course, the club or sponsor has obtained their "own" licenses for that particular event and/or evening.

* If you belong to both CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB, duplicate licenses are NOT required. Your license will be issued through CALLERLAB.

* Festivals, area or state conventions are NOT covered at this time.

* If you permit a "new" caller to call a single tip at one of your square dance events, it is NOT necessary for the "new" caller to have a current license. The "new" caller should obtain his or her own license when he/she is calling an evening's program.

CON'T

- * "Amateur" nights would be covered provided, of course, that a properly licensed caller is present and is acting as MC.
- * If multiple callers are hired, some of whom are licensed and some of whom are unlicensed, the sponsor is at risk. Remember, it is the sponsor's responsibility to see that appropriate licensing is secured.
- * The contracts negotiated by CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB relieve the sponsor of the necessity of obtaining a license, provided that the caller and/or cuer hired is properly licensed.
- * There are no cross-licensing agreements between BMI and ASCAP.

SPECIFIC INFORMATION AND DETAILS --

The overall well-being of both the Square and Round Dance activity was kept in mind when negotiating. Initially, it was determined that the promoters of events (not callers and/or cuers) were required to obtain licensing in order to conduct an event open to the public or for which an admission fee or donation is solicited or accepted where music was performed. (Remember, the above referenced licenses are "performance" licenses as opposed to "mechanical" licenses). By law, in order for a square or round dance using tunes controlled by these organizations to take place, someone must have an appropriate license agreement with both BMI and ASCAP. There is no cross-licensing agreement.

In order to obtain satisfactory rates, ALL US members, subscribers and apprentices of CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB must be licensed under these agreements -- i.e., it is mandatory that all US CALLERLAB callers and ROUNDALAB cuers become licensed. It was determined that it would be less expensive (and thus better for both activities) to seek a blanket license for callers and cuers rather than place the promoters of any dance events in the position of having to seek individual licensing. (The cost for a club or other event sponsor to obtain appropriate licenses for one event would be between \$22 and \$30 per dance regardless of the type.)

While initially the cost of the licensing fees may seem high, please project your own numbers into the activities and consider that there may be in excess of 8,000+ clubs each paying fees to BMI and ASCAP each time they sponsored a dancing event. It was subsequently determined that it made far better financial sense and would be, in fact, better for both the square and round dance activities to seek a blanket license for callers and cuers. We were successful in negotiating a fee structure based upon the frequency of dances. Thus, a "new" caller or cuer who calls/cues less frequently than established callers and/or cuers pays at a lower rate. (Note: The term "dance" refers to classes, workshops, and regularly scheduled club dances.) EXAMPLE: If you, as a caller, run a workshop, you are the sponsor. The cost for licensing would be \$22-30 per night. Thus, after only 4-6 workshops, your entire licensing fees would be offset by obtaining your license through CALLERLAB.

The contracts read that the licensing agreement(s) cover any regularly scheduled event. It is our opinion that one night stands are covered. However, area or state conventions may still require separate licenses since they would not qualify as "regularly scheduled club events". (We suggest that you do not use the term "festival" since BMI/ASCAP define a "festival" as over 20,000 people and more than 7 hours per day). The fees for a two or three day event should be considered a necessary cost of doing business and may be negotiated directly with BMI and ASCAP at the following addresses:

The blanket licensing arrangement is available only to callers who belong to CALLERLAB and cuers who belong to ROUNDALAB. For callers who also belong to ROUNDALAB, the fees will be paid to CALLERLAB but only one fee need be paid unless both husband and wife call and cue in their own right.

Clubs and other sponsors interested in obtaining their own licenses may negotiate directly with BMI and ASCAP at the addresses shown above. We have been advised that the fees for such arrangements would be significantly higher than those obtained through CALLERLAB & ROUNDALAB.

Time flies when you are having fun, and the Silver Stars have been busy. On Jan. 29th we had a Star Trek to Jacksonville, to steal the Rollaways' Banner. We enjoyed both the club and being able to meet members of their class.

Feb. 2nd, the Stars participated in a Square Dance to benefit the Handicapable Dancers. Thanks to callers and dancers from other clubs we were able to surpass our goal of \$2,000.00. These funds will be used to aid these dancers in the purchase of square dance clothing. Later in the evening these dancers gave us a look at their ability to dance; few were able to watch with a dry eye. We hope we are able to bring some joy into their lives. We thank you again for your support.

February 8th we had a Crazy Hat Dance. The weather was bad that night so the crowd was a bit smaller. Most Dancers came with hats. It was hard to balance the hats and dance at the same time. The winner for the men did not even come with a hat. He improvised by, using a band hat with a yellow ribbon and really stole the show. Sorry guys but Fred Roberson won hands down. 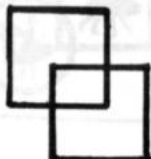
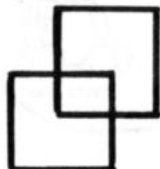
