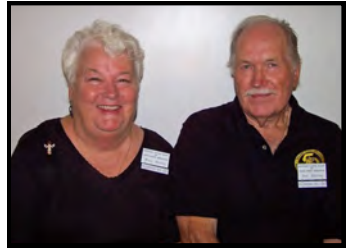

# CALLER'S COLUMN

The fun of writing an article is to try and entertain or educate or make somebody think. This is my attempt at it. Callers, our world continues to change; some for the better and some that just make it different. Here are a few things that cross my mind on a regular basis and let me know what you think.

How do we know if the dancers are happy with what we are doing? One way is very simple – are they coming back? Another way is probably even easier—ask the dancers. Try to find out if they like your music, body flow, timing, humor or what they feel you can do better. Most will not tell you face to face so put out a survey asking for input. Make sure to listen to what is not being said.

Alternative music to traditional hoedowns and singing calls can make a dance livelier and can enhance a theme. But not all music fits all of us and we need to figure out what works and feels good to us and the dancers. Using music that does not fit your personality or style can give a conflict between your music and your voice. Try walking a few calls to the music you have chosen and see if it works. Lively music only works with lively calls. Tape a tip using the music and replay it and see what it sounds like to the dancer. I am lucky to have a small workshop group on Monday to play with different styles of music. A few patter songs have disappeared as a result of watching this group. Not all music works for all of us so work to find your style. Country, Blue Grass, Rock or a combo of all can make for a great or lousy dance.

On the subject of music, there are a number of the square dance record labels putting out some unique music. I have found some great stuff on Riverboat that is not boom chuck but is still very danceable music. And the record labels can certainly use our support as the number of callers continues to dwindle and music sharing continues as a problem. Own the music you use. It is only fair and legal.

It is a sad thing that the Teddy Bears are retiring. Be watching for their last dances and go out to support the group. If you are interested in keeping the club going, talk to Lisa quickly.

An idea that I stole from Jon Jones of Arlington, TX at Callerlab in Miami in 1980: "If all the callers in this room got blown up we would set square dancing back 15 maybe 20 seconds. Between the tapes, records and other callers, it will go on." We add more to the dance than the tapes and records do, but it is awfully dull calling to a mirror. Dancers and callers need each other. So here is to the new dancers that we have added this year and to the dancers that have or will make the commitment to become the callers and cuers of the future.

# 61st National Square Dance Convention®

*Come Dance With Us and....  
Circulate in Washington State*

June 27-30, 2012 Spokane, Washington



## **Spokane - Home of the 61<sup>st</sup> National Square Dance Convention®**

If you registered for the 61<sup>st</sup> NSDC before March 26, 2011, you filled out a Pre-Registration Form. If you have not done so yet, it is now time to convert to a full registration by filling out the Long Registration Form.

### **10 REASONS TO FILL OUT YOUR LONG REGISTRATION FORM**

1) This will save you time in line. It is important to fill out and return the Long Registration form before the Convention. The National Executive Committee requires everyone to fill out the Long Registration Form before receiving his or her Badge and additional purchases.

2) Mark the Solo box if you want a 61<sup>st</sup> NSDC Solo ribbon. This will help you identify possible partners on the dance floor.

3) Print your name (nickname) as you want it on your badge. The city and state on your badge is taken from your mailing address.

4) Fill in the Number of Previous National Square Dance Conventions you have attended. This will be on your name badge. This is a great conversational item when you square up. Only you know the number of Conventions you have attended. The National Square Dance Convention database does not pass this information on to the next Convention. Follow the bright Red arrow on the left side of the Long Registration Form and fill in your number of Conventions attended next to

your name on the left side of the form.

5) Order your Program Book. Printing of the Program Book will be limited to the number pre-paid. The price is currently \$10 per book; on April 30, 2012, the price goes up to \$15. Easy-to-carry Daily Schedules are included with Program Book. Daily Schedules are NOT available without the Program Book. In the Daily Schedules, the Dancer can easily find information on the Callers scheduled in the numerous Halls, the Round Dance Showcase of Rounds and their teaching schedule, Clogging, Line dancing, Contra workshops, Education activities, and the Exhibitions schedule. So order yours now. Daily Schedules are NOT available without buying the Program Book.

6) Order your Sew & Save Book. A limited number of "Sew Creatively" books and CD are printed. So order yours now.

7) Order your Hotel or RV Bus Pass. You can have door-to-door service by pre-ordering. The RV bus is nonstop between the Spokane County Fair & Expo Center and the Convention Center. The Hotel buses will run to the two West Hotels and to four Valley Hotels. By ordering now, you are ensured that we have enough buses to meet your needs.

8) Submit your Housing choices. Many of the Hotels have SOLD OUT. So fill in several options. Registered dancers can reserve their room online at [www.61nsdc.com](http://www.61nsdc.com). Click on the Housing -2012 link. Click on Reservation link. Select date of arrival and departure. Scan the available hotels. Fill in your

choices of bed size, number of people sleeping in the room, special requests. You will receive an email that your reservation has been submitted on the Spokane Hotel Reservation System within 24 hours and should receive a confirmation within two weeks from the Hotel.

9) Fill in the Dance Level area on the lower right side of the form. This information is important to schedule the halls and the Callers, Cuers and Prompters for the dancers. We want you to have a great time with your friends.

10) Fill in the Program information for Callers, Cuers, Instructors, Prompters, Exhibitions and Educations. This will ensure that the Registration Committee gives you a special Ribbon. Be sure to fill out the Entertainer Profile: [www.61nsdc.com](http://www.61nsdc.com). This will help the Program Committee in scheduling.

The price for Registration increases to \$60.00 per person on April 30, 2012. Don't get caught at the last minute paying a higher price. ### **TRANSPORTATION AT THE 61<sup>st</sup> NSDC** **IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

Due to economic budgetary cutbacks by the Spokane Transit System (STA), significant changes are required to the Transportation Services being offered for the attendees of the 61<sup>st</sup> NSDC. After careful review of the STA schedule and routing abilities, it has been determined that extensive use of the STA provided services is not conducive to the success of transporting our Convention attendees. All shuttle and bus transportation is now sponsored by the 61<sup>st</sup> National Square Dance Conven-

tion®. The 'STA' bus pass, which has previously been offered on the Registration Form, is being automatically converted to the 61<sup>st</sup> NSDC Parking Lot Shuttle pass. If you do not have your own transportation to get to the Parking lot, those of you staying at one of the Convention Hotels should consider the Hotel/Motel bus pass.

#### **Parking Lot Shuttle:**

A parking lot will be available at 801 N. Cincinnati Street in the Gonzaga University District. You can either walk the .8 mile lighted path, or ride the 10-minute shuttle, to the Convention Center. It is STRONGLY recommended that you purchase the "Parking Lot Shuttle Pass" on the Registration Form for only \$12 per person.

#### **RV Shuttle:**

For all those folks that are planning to bring their RV's to the beautiful Pacific Northwest, and attend the National Convention, there will be an 'RV Bus Pass' available for purchase (\$40 per person) for the folks using the RV facilities at the Spokane Exposition Center (404 N. Havana St., Spokane Valley, WA 99202). These bus passes will only be available for the 'RV' registered guests.

#### **Hotel/Motel Shuttle:**

For those hotels not listed as 'walking' hotels on the Registration Form that are located to the east and west of the downtown core, the 61<sup>st</sup> NSDC will provide busses. The hotel/motel bus pass is available for purchase (\$40 per person) by attendees staying at these hotels.

#### **61<sup>st</sup> NSDC LIMITED PARKING**

The Convention Center is located in Downtown Spokane and parking is very limited. It is STRONGLY recommended

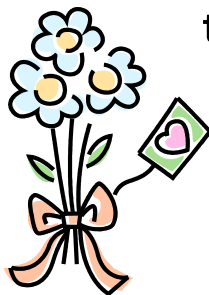

## UNITED WE STAND – DIVIDED WE FALL

By Jack McKinney, reprinted from *The Grapevine*, Jan/Feb 2001

Who can sell Square Dancing? **Square Dancers** are the only ones. Take a look at ourselves. How many of us try to promote Square Dancing? How many callers work to get new dancers? Who reaps the monetary benefits from new dancers? We formed an association made up of clubs in our area so we can exchange ideas and form plans as a unit so we can accomplish more good things.

Take a look at ourselves. How many clubs do not send a delegate? How many delegates go back to their clubs and responsibly report the important issues that occurred? How many delegates have some positive input at the meetings? How many clubs look at different ways to advertise or promote lessons?

Take a look at ourselves. How is our attitude? How many of us say I will go once a week if I feel like it and I don't have anything else to do? How many of us say I do not want any responsibility, but I do want someone to prepare the hall for dancing; I do want refreshments to be prepared; I do want to dance and not have to be mixed in with a class and have to angel; I do want the caller to be present and do a good job to my satisfaction and if I don't like his presentation I will tell everyone that he isn't doing a good job; I want to leave early so I don't have to help clean up; I want everyone to be nice to me even if I am not in a good mood.

Take a look at ourselves. How many clubs who are not having classes send some dancers over to another club to help angel new dancers? Where are they going to get new dancers? How many clubs who are not having classes get together and go to another club's graduation to welcome new dancers into Square Dancing? How many Round Dancers help other clubs with their classes and graduation? Where do round dance clubs get their new dancers?

Take a look at ourselves. How many clubs have a special dance and take one square to a club to promote their dance? And if another club takes three or four squares to their special dance, how does that club repay them? Do they go back and visit them later and take several dancers with them? Are we promoting Square Dancing among ourselves? If not how can we promote Square Dancing to outsiders?

We have gone to other clubs who had Fall Festival badges for three months and we have sold badges to their members just by asking them personally three weeks before the Fall Festival. Some clubs are selling ads for their club's special dances and none (zero) for the Fall Festival!

Maybe we are satisfied with the status quo. Maybe we really don't want a lot of new dancers which will take up more of our time and make more work to be done. Until we make an effort to change our way of doing things to promote Square Dancing mothering is going to happen and in a few years there will be very few clubs and very few dancers.

Support the Board! If you are in it for fun, get busy and work - that's where the fun is!

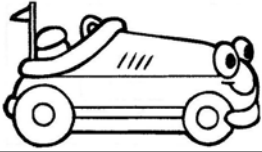

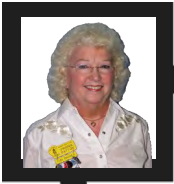

# What's Cooking?

In the Kitchen with

## Word for the day.....

The word for the day, or actually any time, in Maine and the Maritime Provinces of Canada is definitely "lobster". Once in a while it is "wild, low-bush blueberries", but more often it is lobster. Since being in Maine and Canada, I know I have eaten at least my weight in seafood of all kinds, but lobster has to top the list! If you can't stand or are allergic to seafood, you should probably stop reading right now, because you won't enjoy the rest of this article or the recipe. Every place we visited has their own version of seafood chowder and it varies from wonderful to okay, but just okay lobster doesn't exist. Well, we did try a McLobster from the famous golden arches and while it was interesting, you couldn't call it bad. I think one of the nicest things in Lobster country is that you can buy fresh, live lobster and have it cooked for you or take it home and cook it. Yes, I know you can do the same with Florida lobster, but trust me, it is not the same, partly because it wasn't just harvested that morning and partly because lobster up here is sweeter and more succulent - honest, it really is! The following recipe comes from the Island Sunset Resort & Spa located off the Cabot Trail.

### Island Sunset Boiled Lobster

Start with a big pot of salted water. The water should taste like "a day at the beach".

Add a sliced onion, carrot, celery and a lemon sliced in half. Bring to a rolling boil, dip the lobster in water with rubber bands removed, let water return to boil, cook for 17 - 18 minutes. Remove lobster and immerse in cold water to stop cooking process. The antennas will remove easily from the body when cooked. Enjoy with famous "Foamy Butter Sauce."

### Foamy Butter Sauce

1/2 cup whipping cream  
1/4 cup white wine  
1 lb unsalted butter (cubed)  
1 tbsp squeezed lemon juice  
Salt & pepper to taste

Add wine to the empty pot and reduce heat by 1/2. Add whipping cream and reduce again by 2/3. Start whipping the butter cubes into the mixture, one at a time, until each is melted. Add the first 6 cubes slowly and add the remaining cubes faster. Add lemon juice, salt & pepper and enjoy.

## ***A Different way of attracting new dancers***

A member called the American Callers office with a new way of finding new dancers through the local hospital Wellness Program. The member stated that the local hospital had contacted him to see if he would be interested in teaching the dance program. They wanted to have square dancing, line dancing and some round dancing as a part of the program to help promote wellness.

The hospital would pay for the advertising, furnish a hall to teach the classes and hold the dances in, and would pay the caller/teacher for their services. The member said in the phone conversation that they had started five different classes in the program that he taught on different nights.

To get further information on the wellness programs and how they work in our local area, I called two hospitals and found out that this program works about the same way all over the country, but before one can participate in the program they must be cleared by a doctor to do so. In some hospitals the program has a membership fee and a monthly fee. However in some hospitals the program is free.

There is one thing about this type of program and the people in it. They are not sitting home watching TV or playing a computer game; they are looking for some way to exercise their body and mind.

Square dancing is the best entertainment buy there is. If you compare it to the average movie cost, plus refreshments, it's 3 to 4 times better buy. Besides that, popcorn and coke does nothing to exercise your body. An evening of square and round dancing for FUN is the best entertainment you can buy.

For a long time we have not pushed the health benefits of dancing or the joy of the music, because the music offers everything from Oldies, Country, Rock, Pop and more.

## ***Some of the Health Benefits***

1. You burn about 400 to 800 Calories in a three hour dance and make everything fit better.
2. Keeps you fit and feeling good and it is recommended by the Heart Association.
3. Exercise benefits better than a 3-4 mile walk because its done with music, fun and friends.
4. Lowers blood pressure, Improves cholesterol, Strengthens weight bearing bones and
5. Slows loss of bone mass.

If the hospital in your town has a wellness program and you should contact them about including dance in their program be sure to take along these facts and I am sure you can add many more benefits to this list yourself. Again we need to stress more and more the FITNESS, FUN AND FRIENDSHIP that is offered by square dancing and round dancing. This is one of the best selling points we have and people are looking for an activity that gives great health benefits.

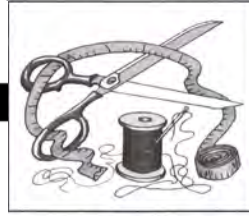

# SEW ON & SEW FORTH

## Fluffy Fleece Fabric

There are many different types of fleece fabric. Some are very thin and light for undergarments and others are very heavy with water repellent surface treatments that are designed for mountain climbing. All colors and a wide range of thicknesses and surface treatments are found in fleece. It is usually polyester, but it can be blended with other fibers.

Pre-washing of fleece fabric is not necessary because it does not shrink or bleed. Launder fleece garments inside out with similar garments. Use cold water with powdered laundry detergent on a gentle cycle. Liquid laundry detergents can effect the moisture wicking and water repellent properties of fleece fabric. Do not use bleach, fabric softeners or dryer sheets. Tumble dry for short time on a low setting. Over drying will shorten the life of the garment. The best way to dry is to shake out and hang up. Do not dry clean.

Never press fleece, it will melt. If it needs a bit of touch up try steaming the garment and use a clothes brush to revive the nap. Use a clothes shaver or a sweater comb to remove the 'pills' that form on the outside where the fleece rubs. Especially in places like the under arms. It is often hard to tell the right side from the wrong side of a fleece fabric. Look closely at each side. The better looking side is the outside. Looking at the edge you may see that one side is thinner than the other. The thinner side is the outside. If you can't decide from those tips just choose one side of the fabric as the outside and be consistent. Mark the inside of each piece with a small piece of blue painters tape. This tape will not leave goo on the fabric. Mark the notches and other construction points with a fabric marker on the inside. Do not try to clip the notches because the clips will be difficult to locate. On pieces like pockets where it is difficult to tell the top from the bottom always mark the top edge.

Always choose patterns with simple lines. There are many patterns that are designed just for fleece. When laying out a pattern on fleece use a 'with' nap' layout. Make very sure that all of the pieces, even the little ones, are going the same way. If the nap is running in different directions the pieces will appear to be different colors. Pin with quilters pins. They are extra long and have big plastic heads so they don't get lost in the nap of the fabric. When cutting out the pattern use a 45 or 60 mm rotary blade cutter. This will

be much easier on your hands than cutting with scissors. Polyester is very tough and it dulls rotary blades, scissors and needles faster than other type of fabrics.

The edges of fleece fabric do not have to be finished. It does not ravel. It can be dressed up with pinking shears or a wavy blade rotary cutter for a decorative effect. Fleece seam binding (Wright's) or regular cloth seam binding can be used to cover up the exposed edges. Some people like to work a blanket stitch, or other decorative stitch, around the edges either by machine or hand stitching.

When you begin sewing, insert a new needle, Universal 90 is a good choice to start with. Set the stitch length at 4 mm or 8-10 spi. A too short stitch length will cause the fleece to stretch. Thread the machine with a good quality polyester thread and practice on scraps before starting the garment. If the stitching is not looking right try a stretch or ball point needle. If the fabric is very thick, lighten the presser foot pressure. The instructions are in your sewing machine manual. Reducing the tread tension may also help the stitch quality.

Make a fleece cape to wear with your square dance outfits. It will keep you toasty warm without crushing your ruffles or mashing your skirts. A long cape in your club colors will make a great entrance at the next dance. There will be patterns for and examples of different types of fleece caps at the 61st National Square Dance Convention in Spokane. Stop by the Sewing Studio to see the many displays and new patterns to trace.

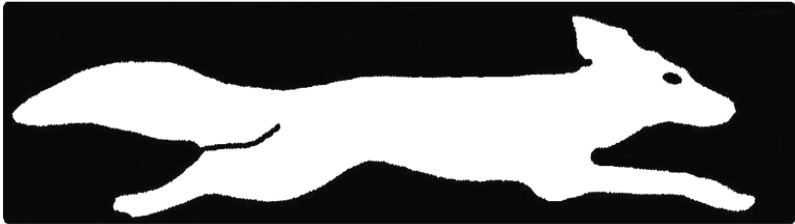
