RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Since summer and seafood seem to go together, you might like to try this recipe which utilizes almost any kind of seafood, or any combination thereof:

SEAFOOD CONTINENTAL

- Mix: 1 can cream of mushroom soup, 1 can cream of celery soup, 1/2 cup water, 2 Tbsp. dry white wine (optional)
- Add: 4 cups cooked seafood (flaked white-fish, crab, lobster, shrimp, or any combination of seafood), 1 cup shredded mild process cheese, 2 tsp. minced parsley.

Pour into shallow baking dish, top with buttered crumbs.

Bake at 400° about 20 minutes, or until sauce starts bubbling. Serves 6.
