- 1/3 cup Milk
- 1 1/2 cups sifted flour
- 1/2 tsp. Salt
- 2 tsp. baking pwdr
- 1 Lge or 2 Sml bananas(mashed).

Bake in loaf or bread pan for 50 Min. at 350 degrees.
