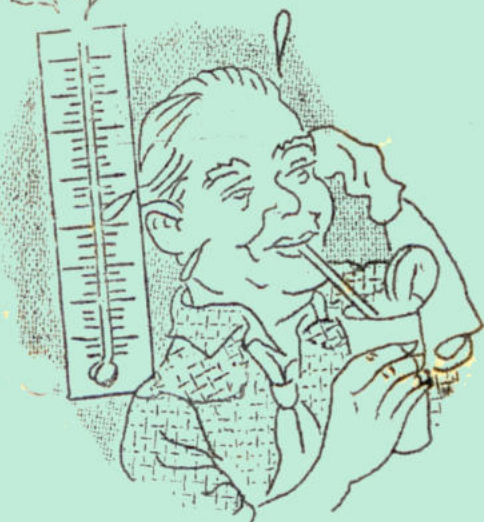

The following clubs were represented at the NORTHEAST FLORIDA SQUARE DANCE ASSOCIATION meeting held at the Mayflower Hotel, July 11, 1965: Friendly Frolics, Fun and Frolic, Grand Slammers, Merry Mixers, Seaside Squares, Swinging Squares--Jacksonville, Swinging Squares--Gainesville, Orange Park Promenaders, Western Cutters, and Y-Knots.

President Wally Lightfoot announced that as a result of the clubs voting, one round will be presented between tips at the NORTHEAST FLORIDA SQUARE DANCE ASSOCIATION dances. A nominating committee consisting of Virgil Green and Bill Fleshman has been appointed. Paul Lane, Bill Fleshman, and Virgil Green were appointed to re-write the by-laws. A committee is needed to work with the teachers of public schools to teach square dancing in the schools.

The July Fifth Saturday Dance is to be held in Palatka.

Plans are being made to give the Jacksonville dancers an opportunity to make the "FLATTOP" badge. Depending on the availability of the carrier, this will be held in late September or early October.

Virgil Green and Mrs. Bill Camp are writing a history of the FALL ROUNDUP of Jacksonville. This will be published in the Bow & Swing and in the Grapevine.

The 1967 State Convention will be held in Jacksonville, June 15, 16, and 17th. Carl Law is Chairman.

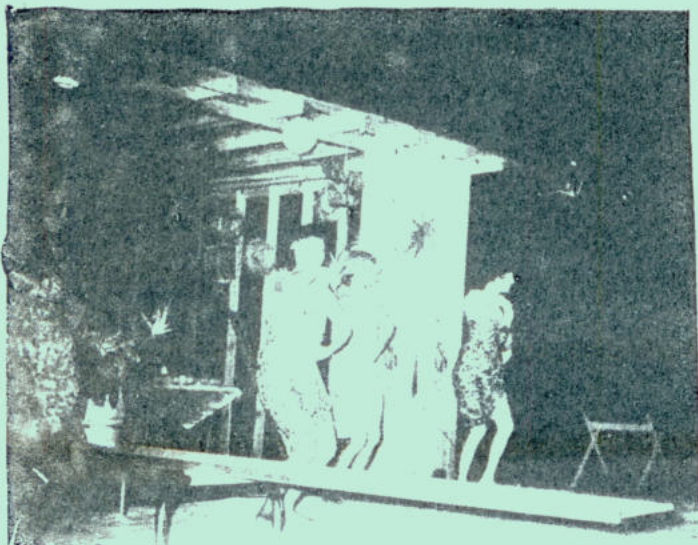
Anyone interested in helping organize this project, learning to square dance, or just watching is cordially invited to come any Saturday night.

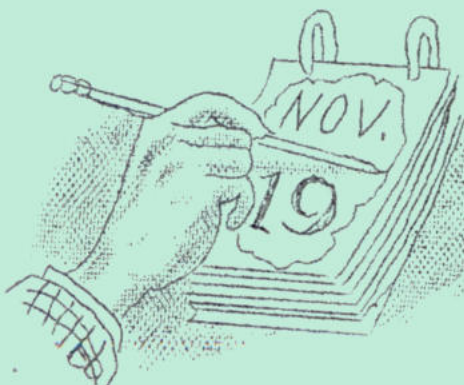

SPECIAL NEWS BULLETIN FROM THE NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION

TWO FUTURE CONVENTIONS AWARDED AS 11,196 ATTEND 14th NATIONAL IN DALLAS

Philadelphia in 1967 and Omaha in 1968 were announced as future Convention sites as 11,196 including dancers from all 50 states attended the 14th Annual National Square Dance Convention in Dallas, thus making it the 5th largest in history.

The 1966 National will be in Indianapolis, Indiana, on June 16, 17, 18 with the Philadelphia Convention set for June 29, 30 July 1, 1967, and the Omaha dates being June 20-22, 1968.

The 11,196 at Dallas was more than twice the 5354 who attended the 3rd Natl. in that city in 1954. This was the first Convention to register dancers from all 50 states.

We thoroughly enjoyed our extended vacation but like most people were very happy to pull in to our driveway after the 5½ weeks.

Here are some highlights of our trip. Miles traveled, 6500; states visited, 2, highest point, 11,600 feet near Echo Lake, Colorado. The floods and tornadoes we just missed. The scenery on US 25 between Asheville, N. C. and Johnson City, Tenn. The Needles, Mt. Rushmore, buffalo and deer in the Black Hills of S. Dak. Devil's Tower, antelope, prairie dog towns and a hanging (make believe, they are celebrating their 75th year of statehood) in Wyo. Two weeks before there had been a riot at a rock and roll with plenty of news coverage. Constant movement of thousands of dancers thru the halls and passageways. Perfect sound in all the halls; spectacle of 400 squares from back row of the balcony. Eagerness of most to mix and meet new people, yet a few squares never dancing or mixing with any but themselves. Solos dancing as much as they wanted to and having a wonderful time (check with Jaiquette Liner and Lee Wallace). The good humor of about fifty people waiting for only one elevator at 3:30 a.m. Sunday morning. The frustrated look on the face of the vendor trying to sell beer to about 2500 dancers at the Rodeo. Statements made at panels, one to publishers of Square Dance magazines "Let's have less articles on what is wrong with Square Dancing and more on what is right". The others on the Future of the National. "Our National contributes to the square dance picture by friendships formed". "The only permanent individual satisfaction and the only basis

on which the square dance movement can grow solidly is in sharing with others the pure joy of dancing. Our National's contribution in friendships renewed is an important factor in maintaining this solid basis of square dancing". The last two statements were made by Dr. Ernest R. "Bart" Bartley, Professor of Political Science and caller for the Merrysteppers of Gainesville. Going along with the above, identical statements made to us by two couples, one from Andalusia, Pa. and the other from Cantua Creek, Calif. "We have so enjoyed your company we would like to keep in touch and renew this friendship at future conventions."

Comments overheard. By the Dallas Chief of Police when asked what he had done with the extra police officers on duty Thursday night. "Frankly after about an hour I went out and sent them home". By a harried cashier at the Picadilly Cafeteria "Square Dancers are just great". By almost every dancer "my feet hurt". Many times by old and new friends and meaning it "We will see you next year in Indianapolis".

People met in halls and passageways; this amazed us, with the thousands of people there we were constantly running into ones we knew. Curtis and Evelyn Womble, Bob Waites, Ruth, Bart and Debbie Bartley of Gainesville; Scotty and Angie Hayes, Jaiquette Liner and Lee Wallace of Jacksonville; James and Helen Teagle, Odie and Otis Cowart and the Drivers of Wildwood; Skeeter and Helen Chauvin of Tampa; Ed and Shirley Newton of Sarasota; Frank Bedells of Miami Beach; Art and Ruth Rodgers of St. Louis, they danced with 441 last January while on vacation; and the couple we danced with in Lake City while they were vacationing in Miami from Phoenix, Arizona but now live in Enid, Oklahoma and Tex and Jean Brownlee of Odessa, Texas.

One final statement about a National Square Dance Convention. In 1966 it will be held in Indianapolis and in 1967 in Philadelphia. We would recommend that attendance at one of these might be worked in with your vacation plans, not so much for the dancing but the opportunity to meet and exchange ideas and form friendships with dancers from all over the country.

Our July 29th dance at the Center has been cancelled but we will be going "full swing" on the following Thursday, August 5th, so come on out and join us.

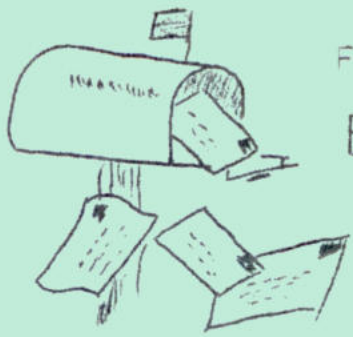
