THE PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

One of the largest crowds yet attended the NORTHEAST FLORIDA SQUARE DANCER'S ASSOCIATION meeting in the Mayflower Hotel July 11. The Ancient City Squares of St. Augustine and the Dixie Chain Gang Square Dance Club of Jacksonville were accepted as members of the NEFSDA. The Association is fortunate to have the support of these clubs. It was announced that a new club, The Sunshine Twirlers, has been formed in Gainesville with Scotty Thomas as caller. Congratulations Sunshine Twirlers, we hope that you too will join NEFSDA. Bob Ross reported that plans for the Fall Round-up, Nov. 11th & 12th are progressing smoothly.

Richard Patrick was appointed Chairman of a nominating committee to present a slate of new officers for the the NEFSDA at the next meeting, which will be held at the Mayflower Hotel Aug. 29th. At that time, the club delegates present will elect new officers for the next year. An effort will be made to get the Sept. issue of Grapevine in the mail in time to

reach subscribers prior to the Aug. 29th meeting, with a list of the nominees.

Delegates at the Association meeting voted to turn the publishing of the Grapevine over to Johnny and Jeanette Todd who will operate the Grapevine publishing business on a profit basis. In order to provide the Todds slight profit for their labor, it will be necessary to raise the subscription rate to \$1.50 per year. The new rate will be effective with all future new subscriptions and renewals. A copy of the Contract between the Association and the Todds will be sent to every club in the Association in the near future. The major policies established by this contract are as follows: A. Subscription rates will be \$1.50 per year. B. One free copy will be given to graduates of square dance classes. C. The publishers are to bear all expense in connection with publishing of the Grapevine and in turn are to retain all receipts from subscriptions and advertising. D. NEFSDA and all clubs in the area it serves will be permitted to submit news items each month, such news items to be limited to one full column (half of an 8 1/2 x 14

The Dixie Chain Gang held its Graduation party Dance June 25th, at the Community Hall, Phillips Highway Plaza. The initiation ceremonies were carried out in true "chain-gang" style. In the midst of a tip, Marshall Wyatt Burp (George Stanton) and his deputies stormed in, placed a ball and chain on Frank Clements and placed all graduates under arrest.
