As for classes, it has been fairly well proven the best way is by personal contact with friends, neighbors, relatives, etc. Invite them to a club social a week or so before classes start. Take them to the class until they become acquainted with some of the others in the class. Show them you are interested and keep on being interested.

It is a little early but don't throw or give away those useable toys. Harvey Chambers, President of the Jubileers is Chairman for our second Toys for Tots Dance and is looking for a hall which will hold no less than 35 squares.

Wally Lightfoot, Foots Reynolds and Bob Sinn are the nominating committee and have been tapping shoulders the last couple of weeks seeking Association officers for next year.

Ernie Doering reports subscriptions to the Grapevine have fallen off nearly 100. Several clubs have their reporters act as subscription agents. This might be a good idea for all clubs. So if the reporters are agreeable, contact your club members and see if you can't get these 100 back plus some extras.

A glowing report on the 1967 State Convention was one of the highlights of the July meeting of the Northeast Florida Square Dancers Association, when the Association met at the Robert Meyer Hotel on July 10. It was announced that there were 1,096 paid registrations, with a net profit of \$1,468.89 to the Federation.

Fall Roundup tickets were distributed to club representatives by Chairman George Millan.

Delegates voted to approve the printing of information leaflets which will be available to member clubs for presentation to new square dance graduates. The leaflet, designed by Virgil Green, will acquaint the new square dancer with Association, State and National square dance organizations and publications, as well as to convey the true spirit and purpose of square dancing as wholesome and friendly recreation.

Club members of Northeast Florida Association will soon be hearing about the Golden Key of Visitation, which was presented to the Association by John Donely at a recent Florida Federation meeting. The purpose of the Key is to promote visitation, and the project may be initiated at the Fifth Saturday Dance on July 29. By the time you read this, some club may have already been presented with the Key.

NORTHEAST FLORIDA SQUARE DANCERS ASSOCIATION

BY-LAWS Revised August 1, 1965 and amended
May 8, 1967

I. NAME

The name of this Association shall be the NORTHEAST FLORIDA SQUARE DANCERS ASSOCIATION.

II. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Association is to coordinate the several activities of the member clubs in functions they cannot perform individually, and to this end:

- (a) To promote the growth of square and/or round dancing in this area and to help insure its growth and progress as a wholesome family activity.
- (b) To take advantage of opportunities for presenting to the public the fact that square dancing is one of the most enjoyable, wholesome and physically beneficial forms of recreation available.
- (c) To affirm in the public's mind that drinking of intoxicants at square dances is not tolerated.
- (d) To encourage the formation of new clubs and the development of new callers and to encourage and help them in any way possible if so requested.
- (e) To sponsor and promote Association dances and an annual roundup. Other than the annual roundup, Association dances will normally be held on fifth Saturdays so as to cause the least interference with regular club dances.
- (f) To publish a monthly bulletin of club and Association news at a subscription rate set by the Board of Delegates.
- (g) To organize area dancers for the purpose of hosting and conducting the State Square Dance Convention when it is assigned to the Northeast area.
- (h) To maintain membership in and liaison with the Florida Federation of Square Dancers for mutual assistance in functions that area associations cannot perform individually.

III. AREA

- (a) The Northeast Florida Square Dancers Association area includes the counties of Flagler, Putnam, Alachua, Columbia, and all counties in Florida north and east thereof, subject to the approval of the State Federation of Square Dancers.
- (b) All meetings of the NEFSDA will be held in the area outlined in paragraph (a) above.

IV. MEMBERSHIP

- (a) Membership in the Association shall be on a club basis only.
- (b) A club includes square and/or round dance groups duly organized and whose officers have been elected from the club's membership by a majority of its members.
- (c) Membership shall be subject to confirmation by the Board of Delegates.
- (d) Individual clubs are requested to furnish a current membership roster to the Executive Secretary upon first joining the Association and in January and July of each year thereafter.

- (e) Membership dues shall be set by the Board of Delegates and are payable on July 1 of each year. Member clubs who have not paid dues by August 15 shall be considered delinquent and shall have no vote until dues are paid.
- (f) Dues may be prorated monthly for a partial year's membership in the Association should a club join the Association during the fiscal year who has never been a member of the Association before.
- (g) Square and/or Round Dance Clubs from outside the area outlined in Article III (a) may be accepted as full participating members providing they meet all the requirements for membership in this Article, subject to the limitation set forth in section (h) following.
- (h) No club from an area in Florida which is presently assigned to another regional association by the Florida Federation of Square Dancers will be accepted for membership unless they accompany their application with the prior approval of their current regional association and of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers.
- (i) Square and/or Round Dance Clubs from outside the area may be accepted for Associate Membership upon payment of one-half the usual dues and if they meet all other requirements for membership set forth in this Article. Associate Members will not be entitled to a vote.

V. BOARD OF DELEGATES

- (a) The Board of Delegates of the Association shall consist of the Delegates at Large and of one certified delegate (usually a married couple) from each member club, which member shall be in good standing in the club he represents.
- (b) Meetings of the Board of Delegates shall be held bi-monthly in the odd numbered months of the year. Special meetings may be called by the Executive Committee when advisable. Delegates, delegates at large, officers and chairmen of all committees shall be notified prior to meetings.
- (c) A quorum for any meeting shall be fifty per cent (50%) of the delegates from member clubs.
- (d) Each member club and each delegate at large shall have one vote, and no one but a delegate at large or a delegate who has been certified by his club before the meeting commences may introduce a motion or vote. A delegate or delegate at large may exercise his vote only when present at the time the votes are cast.
- (e) The general policies of the Association shall be those formulated by the Board of Delegates.
- (f) No caller shall be permitted to serve as a delegate.
- (g) Each Past President of the Northeast Florida Square Dancers Association shall automatically become a delegate at large with one vote and shall retain this status so long as he maintains a good standing in a NEFSDA-Member club.
- (h) No person may establish the status of being more than one delegate or of having the vote of more than one delegate.

VI. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- (a) The President of the Association shall appoint a nominating committee no later than the July meeting of each year. This committee shall select a slate to fill the offices of president, vice president, recording secretary, corresponding secretary and treasurer. The slate selected will be reported to the member clubs through the September GRAPEVINE or by other means by September 1 of each year. The first item of old business at the September meeting shall be the report of the nominating committee, at which time nominations shall be taken from the floor if any. No one shall nominate a person from the floor who has not previously consented to having his name placed in nomination. After the nominations have been closed, the delegates present shall vote for one nominated candidate for each office. Voting shall be by secret ballot, and the candidate receiving the majority of votes for the office will be elected.
- (b) Officers shall take office on October 1 and serve for one year.
- (c) No caller shall be permitted to hold office in the Northeast Florida Square Dancers Association.

VII DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- (a) The PRESIDENT shall preside at all meetings of the Association, serve as ex-officio member of all committees, appoint and/or remove chairmen of committees subject to the approval of the Board of Delegates, and perform all other duties incumbent on his office. He shall countersign with the treasurer all checks drawn on funds of the Association.
- (b) The VICE-PRESIDENT shall assume the duties of the president in his absence and perform all other duties the president may appoint him to do. He shall be a member of the program and roundup committees.
- (c) The RECORDING SECRETARY shall keep a record of proceedings of all business, an official membership list, an attendance record, a list of all committees, and issue membership cards. In addition, the secretary shall prepare a brief of the minutes of each Association meeting for the BOW & SWING representative and for the GRAPEVINE.
- (d) The CORRESPONDING SECRETARY shall conduct all necessary correspondence and notify officers, delegates, delegates at large, and chairmen of all committees at least one calendar week prior to each regular meeting, and as far as possible in advance of each special meeting.
- (e) The TREASURER shall be custodian of all funds of the Association, except those specifically delegated to the GRAPEVINE, shall receive all dues from member clubs and notify any member club that has not paid its dues by August 15 that it is delinquent. Except as noted above, he shall collect all monies, pay all bills, and prepare a written report of Association finances at the close of his term of office. All checks shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the President.

VIII. COMMITTEES

- (a) Standing committees shall include program, public relations, GRAPEVINE, roundup, executive and by-laws.
- (b) The program committee shall have charge of all arrangements for all Association dances except the roundup
- (c) The public relations committee shall make every effort to encourage new people to become square dancers through every pub-

licity media available to them, publicize Association events, and assist member clubs with their publicity when requested. In addition, they shall be in charge of arrangements for every function of public participation by the Association, such as demonstrations at fairs, etc.

- (d) The GRAPEVINE committee shall publish the monthly news bulletin for the Association. News from clubs in the Northeast area will be published whether or not the clubs are members of the Association. In addition, this committee shall maintain a chronological list of all open dances in this area in order that clubs may, if they desire, avoid conflicting dates for special dances. (Clubs are urged to advise the GRAPEVINE of their expected special dances when scheduled and try to avoid dates when other clubs have scheduled special dances.) The GRAPEVINE committee shall make collections and pay bills of the GRAPEVINE, using other Association funds from the treasurer, if necessary, and submit the GRAPEVINE accounts to the Association officers for audit in March and September of each year. Suitable publicity shall be given to new beginners classes and Association functions and activities. The NEFSDA may enter into contractual arrangements to have the GRAPEVINE published by private individuals if it is judged desirable to do so. In this event, the GRAPEVINE committee duties will be handled by the person or persons having the publishing duties if they are square dancers. If they are other than square dancers, the committee shall have supervisory powers over the publisher.
- (e) The roundup committee shall be appointed annually at the January Association meeting and shall have charge of all arrangements for the annual roundup. They shall reserve suitable facilities and program callers for the third year following the last roundup.
- (f) The by-laws committee shall prepare all amendments to these by-laws proposed by the Board of Delegates in the proper form and in concise language so that if approved at the next Association meeting, the amendment may be attached to the appropriate section of the by-laws. Biannually, in odd numbered years, the by-laws committee shall revise and republish the by-laws, bringing them up to date in accordance with the wishes of the Association.
- (g) The Executive committee shall consist of the current elected officers and immediate Past President. It shall have the power to call special meetings as provided in Article V (b). It will carry out such business of the Association as may be necessary between meetings not in conflict with these By-laws and will be charged with the responsibility of preparing agendas for all meetings and such other duties as the Board of Delegates may direct. All actions of this committee are subject to review of the Board of Delegates at the next regular meeting.

IX. YOUNG DANCERS

- (a) Teen-age and pro-teen clubs meeting the requirements outlined in Section IV (b) are eligible for associate membership in the Association by payment of one-half the annual dues, but they shall have no vote.
- (b) Regardless of their affiliation with the Association, young dancers up through high-school age shall be admitted to Association dances at one-half the regular admission.

X. PROCEDURE

In all cases not covered by these by-laws, the proceedings of the Association shall be governed by "Roberts Rules of Order (Revised)."

XI. AMENDMENTS

- (a) These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board of Delegates present and voting.
- (b) All amendments shall be included in the notice of meeting sent out by the Corresponding Secretary under Article VII (d).

XII. ENACTMENTS

These by laws shall supersede all previous by-laws, including amendments thereto. They shall become effective when ratified by three-fourths (3/4) of the member clubs.
