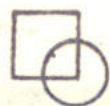

## Caller's Corner

For the past 27½ years I have heard many times square dancing is fun & fellowship. This I truly believe should & could be for every square dancer. No truer example could be more real than watching the class members on their first lesson. The enthusiasm & excitement fills the hall when they have learned a medley left, right & left grand & promenade home & execute it well. Between graduation & sometimes down the line, the fun, excitement & enthusiasm seems to dim.

I have heard many excuses such as: the callers' fault, club officers' fault, & club members' fault. But to me this is not the real problem. Square dancers are people & as all people don't like strawberry ice cream, fishing, etc. Some dancers like square dancing at different perspectives. Some like to dance twice a month, some feel they need to dance once a week while others have time & energy to dance more often. This does not mean the people who dance twice monthly don't enjoy their hobby as well as the ones who spend more time square dancing. The reason for this could be many things, such as, children at home & other activities. When we as leaders try to push them beyond this point we soon lose them. I truly believe the time has come to re-evaluate our square dance movement. I think the time is right for all clubs to seek the level the majority of the membership wishes, not what the caller or a selected few want & stick with it. I have seen dancers have just as much fun at a good Basic 54 dance as dancers who have danced for sometime enjoying a good Plus 1 & Plus 2 dance. I do not believe we can retain as many new dancers from our graduating classes if we don't give them a true choice in all phases of dancing from Basic 54 thru Plus 1 & Plus 2. Give them the chance to seek their own level as they wish & not as leaders & callers choose for them.

It is no fun to go to a club thinking you can dance their level & be hit with "Spin Chain the Gears, Relay the Duecy & Tea Cup Chain". When you are a Basic 54 & Mainstream dancer. I believe there is a place for all levels in our District. But let's be honest with the dancers, advertise your club level of dancing in the District Directory when inviting clubs to visit. This way the dancers cannot be deceived. Square dancing is fun at all levels. Some of us are fortunate enough to have more time to seek higher levels than others.

I believe if we put the fun back into square dancing we all have talked so freely of, for so long, the dancers will be happy at the level they choose, & the dropouts will show a decisive decrease. The only problem will be a challenge to all callers to use the basics to the fullest at any level your club decides to choose.

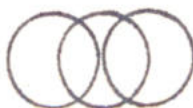

With election of NEFSDA officers in September, we felt this article would be very appropriate at this time.

PREFACE

The following articles have been completed to promulgate the rules and regulations of N.E.F.S.D.A. to the dancers of the area. It is hoped that the question and answer format will serve as an aid to spark an active interest in your association.

It behooves the dancers to avail themselves of a copy of the by-laws of the association as well as keeping themselves informed of what transpires at the association meetings.

Although it would be nice to communicate with each dancer personally on matters concerning NEFSDA, this would be not only impossible but impractical task. Fortunately, the drafter of the by-laws saw the impracticality of such an endeavor and provided for representation through club delegates.

Consequently, it is the duty of each member club to select a reliable delegate and charge him/her with the responsibility of attending the meetings and communicating to their respective club's ideas and position to this assembly. It is likewise the responsibility of the delegate to return to their club and give a complete report of what transpired at the meeting. It is incumbent upon each club to expect and require this report from their delegate.

PURPOSE & MEMBERSHIP

Q What is Northeast Florida Square Dancers Association, Inc.?

A A charitable and philanthropic corporation.

Q What is the purpose of NEFSDA?

A. To promote square dancing in the Northeast area of Florida, through membership square dance clubs, round dance and clogging clubs; and to assist and cooperate with all square dancers in promoting friendliness, better dancing, fun and harmony.

Q What area does NEFSDA include?

A The counties of Flagler, Putnam, Alachua, Columbia and all counties in Florida North and East thereof.

Q What are requirements for membership in NEFSDA?

- A
- A) Clubs only qualify for membership.
  - B) Club Officers serve voluntarily and uncontested as club leader or perform a function within the club which the club designates as an office.
  - C) Membership shall be subject to confirmation by the Board of Delegates.

BOARD OF DELEGATES

Q Who votes and passes resolutions in NEFSDA?

A Club delegates and delegates-at-large (officers have no vote).

Q How does a club get full representation at NEFSDA?

A Send a responsible delegate who is reliable in attendance and communicating ideas.

Q What comprises the Board of Delegates of the Association?

A The delegates-at-large and one certified delegate (usually a married couple) from each member club, which member shall be in good standing in the club he represents.

Q What shall constitute a Quorum?

A Fifty percent of the delegates from member clubs.

Q Who formulates the general policies of the association?

A The general policies of the association shall be those formulated by the Board of Delegates.

Q May a person receive remuneration for his services as a delegate?

A No person who receives compensation for his services connected with square/round and/or clogging shall be permitted to serve as a delegate.

- Q Who qualifies as a delegate-at-large?  
 A Each past president of the NEFSDA, INC. shall automatically become a delegate-at-large with one vote and shall retain this status so long as they maintain good standing in a NEFSDA, INC. member club.
- Q May a delegate represent more than one club?  
 A No person may establish the status of being more than delegate or of having the vote of more than one delegate nor will any married couple be allowed to serve as delegate of more than one club.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

By whom and when is the nominating committee appointed?

The President of the Association shall appoint a Nominating committee no later than the July meeting of each year. This committee shall select a slate to fill the offices of President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer. The slate selected shall be reported to the member clubs through the Grapevine or other means by September 1 of each year.

- Q Are nominations from the floor permitted?  
 A Nominations shall be taken from the floor, if any. No one shall nominate a person from the floor who has not previously consented to having his name placed in nomination.
- Q When do officers take office and for what length of time?  
 A Officers shall take office on October 1, and serve for one year.
- Q Who cannot qualify as an officer in NEFSDA?  
 A No square dance caller, round dance cuer or clogging instructor shall be permitted to hold office in NEFSDA, INC.
- Q Is it possible for an officer to receive compensation for his services?  
 A No officer shall be permitted to receive compensation other than reimbursement for regular and necessary expenses incurred in performance of their duties as an officer.
- Q Is it permissible to have more than one officer from one club??  
 A The nomination committee shall make every effort to have as many member clubs as possible represented in the slate of candidates presented. However, this does not preclude having more than one officer from any one club if it is necessary or desirable.

### CLUB MEMBERS SUPPORT YOUR CLUB LESSONS

Much has been said by many people for many years about Club members supporting their Club lessons. This is an important enough of an issue to be repeated time and time again.

Most of our Central District Callers welcome and encourage their Club members to be very active in the support of their lessons.

There are some basic rules which we should adhere to very religiously while supporting the lessons and they are:

1. NEVER let a New Dancer miss the chance of meeting and getting to know YOU. Make a special effort each meeting night to greet each and every New Dancer with a warm handshake and a friendly smile.
2. NEVER let a New Dancer sit out a tip. Always ask, prior to the music starting, if you may have the pleasure of their company for the next tip.
3. DON'T dance with the same persons or in the same square each time. Dance with all of the New Dancers in different positions and in different areas of your hall.
4. REMEMBER - There is only ONE INSTRUCTOR and that is your CALLER. DO NOT attempt to answer any questions or give any instructions during the tip. Answer questions only after the Caller has dismissed the squares and then answer only the questions you are competent in answering, otherwise take the New Dancer and his questions to your Caller and ask him to answer and/or demonstrate as necessary.
5. DON'T congregate in a corner with your club members. Mix with the New Dancers, visit with them, bring them into your conversations, make them feel they are important to you and your Club.
6. IF you have refreshments during or after your lessons, make sure the New Dancers are AWARE of this and that they are YOUR GUESTS OF HONOR. Help them relax, sit down with them, find out who they are, what they do for a living, what are their hobbies. LET THEM know that you are sincerely interested in them.
7. SET EXAMPLES for the New Dancers.
  - a. Be attentive to the Caller. Do exactly as he says, no more, no less. NO short cuts, no fancy steps or swings.
  - b. Be clean, wear your Foo-Foo power and Gentlemen, PLEASE your long-sleeve shirts.
  - c. Remember you were once a New Dancer, DON'T let your disappointment show when someone in your square does not do as well as you think they should.
  - d. BE prompt to square up with your New Dancer partner when the music starts and NEVER-NEVER let your Caller have to waste valuable instruction time asking for help in filling a square.

An interesting bit of Statics was pointed out at a recent Central District Conclave about how we graduate over five hundred (500) New Dancers twice a year and yet, the total growth of Dancer population has been only 2 percent since the year of 1965.

Maybe if each of us would try a little harder at practicing the above mentioned basics we could start changing this trend and increase the growth of our HOBBY much more quickly.

We have heard Jim & Sharon both say they don't know what they would do without square and round dancing in their lives. It has given them the opportunity to meet very fine people from all over our great country.

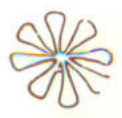

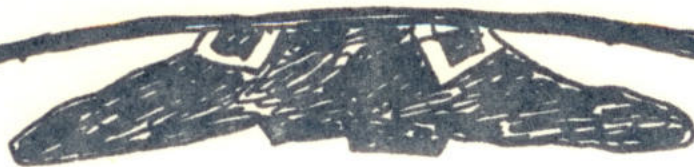

CALLER'S COMMENTS

A very special note of thanks to the Grapevine editors and the NEFSDA for allowing the Gateway Callers to have a "Notes to Dancers" section in the Grapevine. We hope to be able to provide you with some of our ideas and other callers' ideas regarding square dancing.

The following information is rarely found in learner manuals but has been found to be of value to all dancers: Ed Foote (Fifth Saturday Dance caller last January) should get credit for these items.

1. Be a dancer, not a walker. When calls are walked rather than danced the entire square's timing is thrown off.

2. Stand erect. There is a tendency for new dancers, especially the men, to lean forward excessively when doing calls.

3. Take hands with adjacent dancers immediately after every call. This helps you to see the formation you are in. Failure to take hands immediately accounts for a majority of square breakdowns.

4. Believe the caller no matter what he says. Often dancers will stop cold if a caller tells them to do something and they do now know why he told them to do it.

5. Listen for each call. Even though some callers may "lump together" certain calls, be sure that the command is given before you execute a call. For example: Don't assume a Double Circulate by the girls will occur with a Spin Chain Thru call from a standard 8 chain thru formation even though your own caller may use this call a majority of the time.

The above items are not an exhaustive list but may be of some help to dancers.

CALLERS: TRY THESE MOVEMENTS.

Heads lead right - Veer left - Bend the line - Right and left thru - Pass thru - Wheel and Deal - Centers touch to a wave - Release Recycle - Centers turn thru - Centers U-turn back & pass thru - Box Gnat - Right & Left Grand.

Heads Star thru and California Twirl - Centers In - Cast off 3/4 - All 8 circulate - Centers run - Slide thru - Trade by - Star thru - Pass thru - U turn back- AL

GRAPEVINE: Paul Walker, Editor, reported Expenses of \$205.39 and Income (ads and subscriptions) of \$921.95. Available income is \$2216.83. Subscriptions for the June-July issue were 331-- are now 420. The Dixie Grands and Merry Mavericks sponsored a Subscription Dance on July 11. Merry Mavericks combined their annual Hobo Dance with the Subscription Dance and Paul thanked both clubs for supporting the Grapevine. Clubs have been visited and pictures taken for future issues. BY-LAWS: At the May NEFSDA meeting copies of 8 proposed changes to the By-Laws were given to all delegates to be taken back to their club for a club decision. Jim Whiteman, a Past President and Permanent Delegate, sent in a proxy vote but, according to the By-Laws, he had to be present for his vote to count. A change to the By-Laws requires approval of 2/3 of the delegates present. The vote on the 8 proposed changes was as follows:

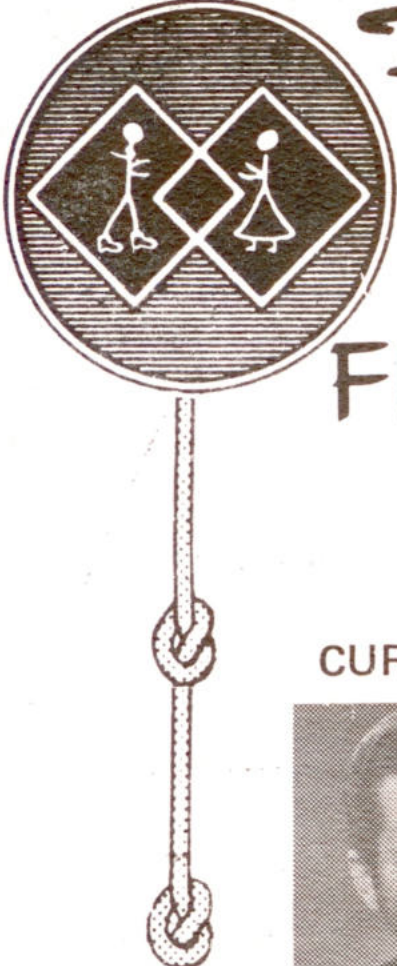

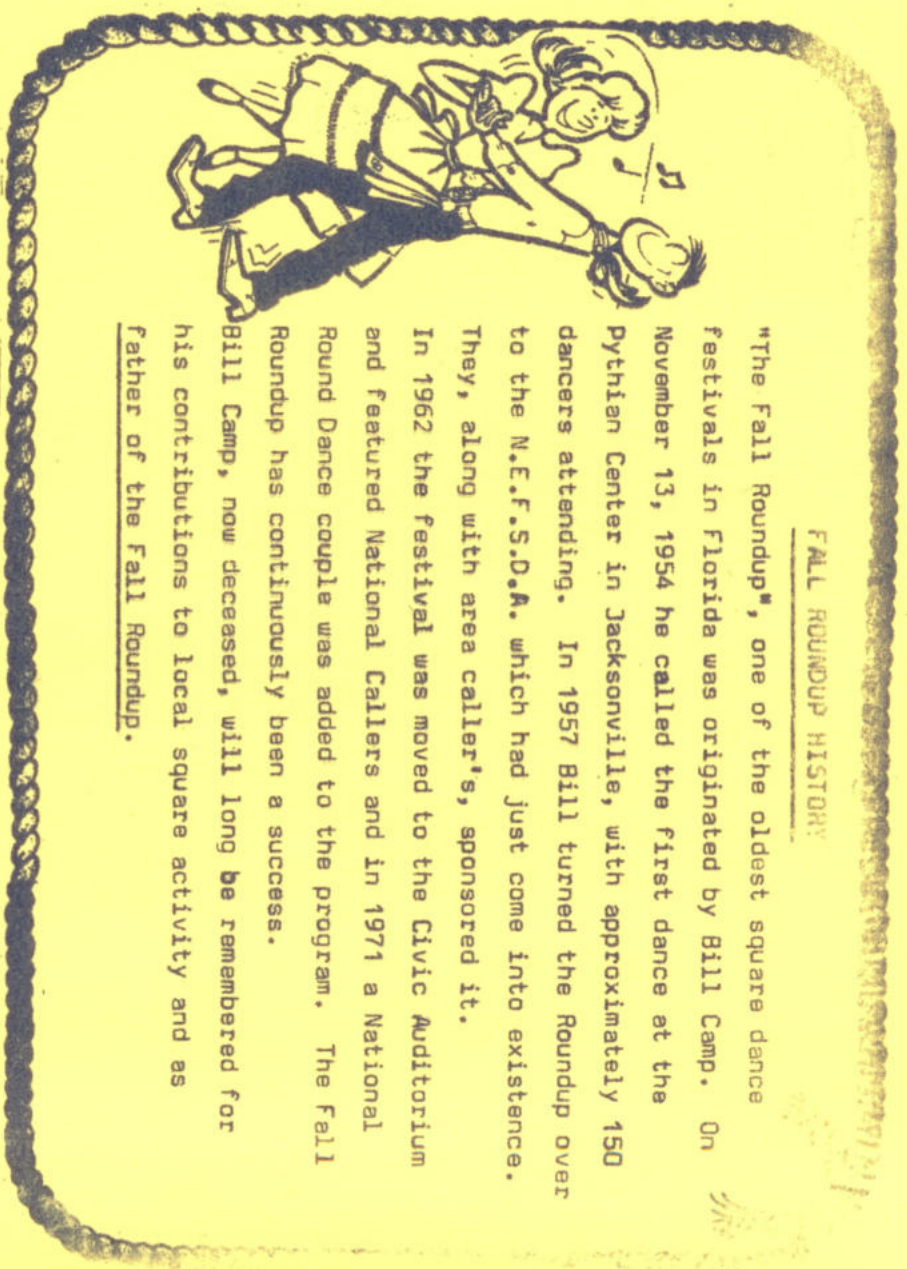

FALL ROUNDUP HISTORY

"The Fall Roundup", one of the oldest square dance festivals in Florida was originated by Bill Camp. On November 13, 1954 he called the first dance at the Pythian Center in Jacksonville, with approximately 150 dancers attending. In 1957 Bill turned the Roundup over to the N.E.F.S.D.A. which had just come into existence. They, along with area caller's, sponsored it. In 1962 the festival was moved to the Civic Auditorium and featured National Callers and in 1971 a National Round Dance couple was added to the program. The Fall Roundup has continuously been a success. Bill Camp, now deceased, will long be remembered for his contributions to local square activity and as father of the Fall Roundup.
