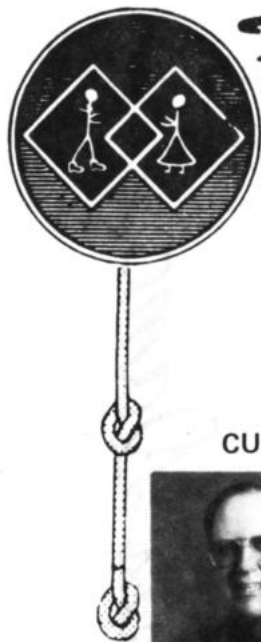

Square dance gets national standing with signing of bill

WASHINGTON - Fulfilling, at least partially, the longtime hankering of the nation's square dancers, President Reagan signed a bill Tuesday designating the square dance as the national folk dance of the United States.

However, the designation runs out at the end of 1983, a sore point with the San Jose-based square dancers responsible for helping to force the matter through a reluctant Congress.

One of the main proponents of the drive, however, said Tuesday that hopes of making the square dance the official national dance forever have not been dimmed.

"Naturally, we would be happier if there was no time limitation," said George Holser of Aptos, vice chairman of the National Folk Dance Committee. "But we have been told that usually there is no problem getting the designation extended, and eventually, if there is no opposition, they can easily make it permanent."

The bill's language limiting the designation to 1½ years was a last-minute amendment by Rep. Robert Garcia, D-N.Y., chairman of the subcommittee that handled the bill.

Garcia was unwilling to waive a subcommittee policy favoring limited designations without a request from the bill's chief sponsor, Rep. Norman Y. Mineta, D-San Jose. Mineta lobbied hard to get signatures for the bill, but was reluctant to call in political IOU's for a square dance bill.

Two weeks ago, when they learned of Garcia's legislative maneuver, the square dancers and the offices of their sponsors in the Senate, Minority Leader Robert C. Byrd, D-W.Va., and Majority Leader Howard H. Baker, Jr., R-Tenn., were upset.

"I feel good," Holser said Tuesday. "We are making headway."

GV TO BE PUBLISHED UNDER CONTRACT

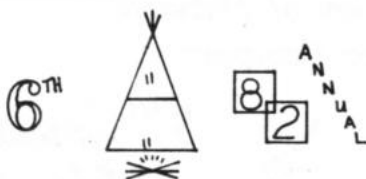

MINUTES OF MEETING

NEFSDA



The regular meeting of the N. E. Florida Square Dance Association was called to order by President Fred Groover on July 11, 1982. The opening prayer was offered by Virgil Greene.

ROLL CALL: The roll was called by Recording Secretary, Ernie Holt. NEFSDA Officers Present: President Fred Groover, V.P. Norm Farrell, Recording Secretary Ernie Holt.

President Groover reminded delegates that Club Rosters and Club Dues were due.

CORRECTION TO MINUTES OF MAY 1982 MEETING: Frank Smith is Past President of State Federation and not President as reported.

TREASURERS REPORT: Bank balance reported by President Groover in the absence of Treasurer. Bank balance as of July was \$2,597.01.

MASTER CALENDAR COORDINATOR: Paul Walker, Grapevine Editor is Master Calendar Coordinator. Clubs should call him to have special dances and events listed on the Master Calendar.

BLOOD BANK REPORT: Hank Pelz, Chairman, reported 108 units of blood in account. Anyone giving blood in month of July will receive Blood Bank Vehicle Tag.

VISITATION: Chairman absent.

EDUCATION: Chairman absent. Marie Fisher call President Groover to discuss the proposed Seminar on July 25th. She reported to President Groover that she had not received any positive response from clubs even though many had been contacted twice. Marie reported that she has received no cooperation from the clubs. After discussion the President announced that he would notify those affected that the Seminar is cancelled.

SINGLES: No representation.

GATEWAY CALLERS ASSOCIATION: Eddie Millan stated that meetings are better attended now and there is more interest from the Callers in the GCA. There is more cooperation between callers and they are trying to get more callers to attend the meetings.

CLOGGING: Doris Krevo suggested that the Program Chairman should include information on the 5th Saturday Flyers informing cloggers that taps are not allowed. President Groover reported that the Program Chairman did not provide the information to the Grapevine in time for publication but would try to get the information to all Clogging Clubs.

ROUNDS: Bob Keegan stated the Reflections have 15 to 18 couples and will represent N.E. Florida at the 1983 National Convention in Louisville. Charlie and Madeline Lovelace will hold a workshop clinic and dance on September 11th at Forest High School.

FALL ROUNDUP: Norm Farrell states the closing of the Host Hotel, The City Center, presents a major setback in Fall Roundup plans. Some Flyers have been distributed so anyone seeing Flyers listing the City Center as the Host Hotel should inform the holder of the change. Badges will be used for admission in the place of ribbons.

5th SATURDAY DANCE - July 31st is 5th Saturday Dance. Ken Perez and Johnny Robbins calling, Edith Reising on Rounds and Sally Thompson Clogging.

GRAPEVINE: Paul Walker reports that expenses were \$494.24; Income \$135.30; Cash Available \$1,160.43; Subscriptions 423. Paul urged delegates to encourage members of clubs to renew subscriptions. Paul also stated that he would present a proposal to contract with NEFSDA to publish the Grapevine.

STATE FEDERATION: Norm Farrell reports all delegates to the Federation was presented with a notebook containing all the information regarding the Federation. A representative from the National Square Dance Committee visited the Federation Meeting and discussed the possibility of future National Conventions being held in the Orlando area. The attendance at the Convention in Detroit was only about 14,000 which was far below the expected attendance.

1983 STATE CONVENTION: The State Convention will be hosted by the Central District in 1983 and they have produced advertising buttons to be sold at \$1.00 each. Delegates were asked to try to sell the buttons to help the Central District cover costs for the Convention.

BUILDING FUND: There is a general lack of interest in a building fund for a square dance hall. None of the delegates present reported discussing the proposal with their club.

NEW BUSINESS: Nominating Committee for 1982-83 Year - Frank & Ruth Hamway, Chairman. Lou & Susan Connelly, Carl & Jessie Hart, Marie Fisher and Virgil & Elsie Greene. Anyone wishing to submit a name to be considered should contact a member of the Committee.

GRAPEVINE PROPOSAL: Paul Walker presented a proposal to independently publish the Grapevine and requested that the Delegates to NEPSDA authorize the elected officers of NEPSDA to enter into a contract with Paul & Nita Walker to independently publish the Grapevine. After a brief discussion Virgil Greene made a motion that the Executive Board be empowered to negotiate into a contract with Paul & Nita Walker to continue to publish the Grapevine. Second to the motion by Frank Hamway. Unanimous vote or approval by delegates.

BOB KEETAN reported that a representative of Ocean Waves could never attend the NEPSDA Meeting because they dance on the same Sunday. Bob proposed that NEPSDA Meeting be held on 1st and 3rd Sundays or an evening meeting. President Groover reminded the body that the meeting time is established by By-law and any change would require a By-law change. It was suggested that Ocean Waves appoint an alternate delegate. The meeting was adjourned.

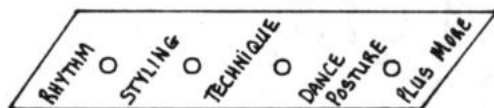

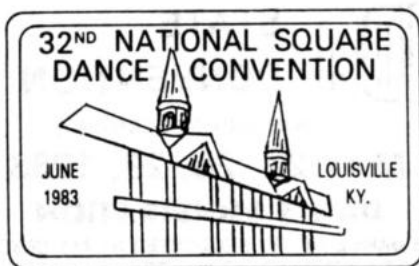

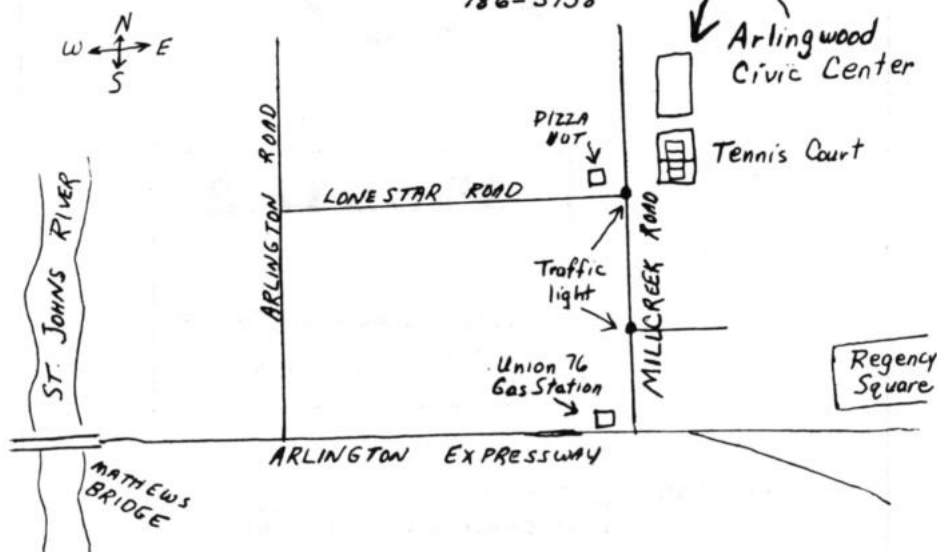
