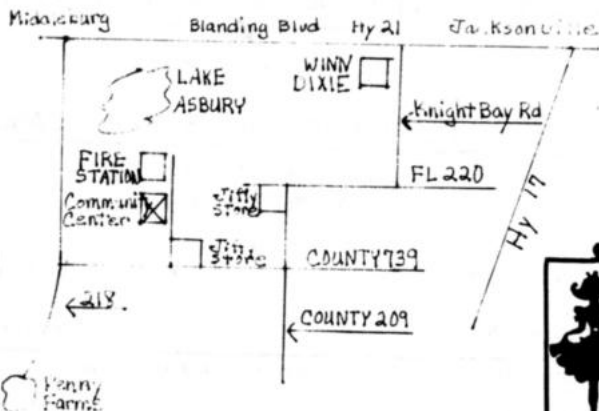

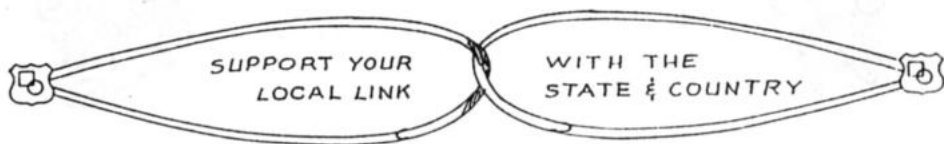

CALLER OF THE MONTH

BOBBY KEEFE

Bobby is one of those rare people, "a true Jacksonville, Floridian". He married June (originally from Cleveland, Ohio), in a small church wedding. Bobby's son, Robert Keefe, Jr. was his Best Man and gave the bride away also. At present Robert, Jr. is a senior at University Christian College and June's daughters Kendra - 14, is in 9th grade and Kara - 16, is a senior in Brandon, FL., where they spend their winters and summer in Jacksonville.

Bobby's square dance career started back in '64 when his sister called and told him "he was going to take lessons and that's it" and he did. When he took lessons they were only ten weeks long and eight weeks into class he taught a child's class how to square dance. In September of '64 he called for the Western Cutters Club, Jax. and the following year was when "Swing Thru's" were introduced to square dancing. By 1967 classes were 20 weeks long when he started his first one, by word of mouth, and then established The Quartermores and has called for them continuously for the past 20 years.

Bobby learned his advance and challenge skills from traveling callers and when plus started back in '76, from Callerlab. He has called for Friendly Frolics, Alamanderins, Sunshine Twirlers in Gainesville Ancient City Squares in St Augustine, established and still calls for Sand Dollars, a C1 club.

He has been quite active over the years such as: recording for Lore, Thunderbird and Brahma Records; Callerlab; Georgia Caller's Association; Florida Caller's Association and Gateway Caller's Association; Square Dance Coordinator for the 1984 Florida Square and Round Dance Convention; and past Staff Caller for Rainbow Lake Lodge, Brevard, NC. At present he is permanent staff caller, spring and summer and Rebel Roundup Week at Fontanta, NC, and provides contract sound for the Fall Round Up.

For sure Bobby and June Keefe are a great asset to our Square Dance World and we appreciate your contributions.

I have questioned several callers and found that their normal mode of operation calls for a 5 to 6 minute break (average) between tips. We have been asked to comment on this subject many times but would not do so until we had some concrete figures to use. Round Dancing is such a graceful and beautiful dance, why isn't Jacksonville more involved?

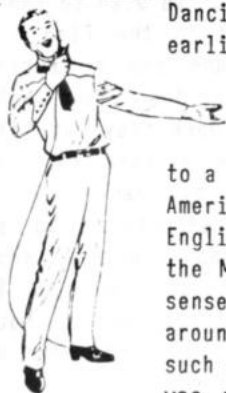

CALLER'S CORNER: "A LITTLE SQUARE DANCE HISTORY"



Dancing is the oldest of the arts, it goes back to the earliest civilizations, possibly 25,000 years. The word 'dance' comes from an old German word "danson" which means to stretch. Therefore dancing is a stretching and relaxing of the muscles of the body to a set rhythm.

American folk and square dancing has two ancestors -- one English and one French. The strong English ancestor was the Morris dance which was danced by men and was, in a sense, an exhibition dance. A pad of bells was worn around the calf of each leg and the steps were done in such a vigorous manner as to cause the bells to ring. It was a ritual dance pantomimed to bring on the spring after a hard winter and often ended in sacrifice - sometimes human. Over the years the symbolism changed and it became a dance for enjoyment. From this Morris dance evolved the English country dance and Appalachian mountain dance.

The French ancestor, a round dance called a branle, a ballroom dance of the French Aristocracy, was performed by couples in a circle. The aristocratic society of France started every ball with a series of three branies. From this developed the New England country dance.

The combining of the English and French dances brought about the quadrille, contra, circle mixer and square dance. At the beginning of the 19th century many changes took place. Dress styles changed considerably for men and women, and the square dance, a descendant of the long-ways and the court ballet, the square eight and round eight, became a dance of the ballroom and remained for a century and a half.

Taking their place in the early part of the 20th century were new dances such as the polka, waltz and couple dance. The square dance was fast becoming a "barn dance", a rowdy, boisterous affair with little grace and style. For more than 25 years the square dance was almost a thing of the past, a lost art.

In 1926, a book entitled "Good Morning - After a Sleep of Twenty-five Years, Old Fashioned Dancing Is Being Revived" was published by Mr. & Mrs. Henry Ford, the same Henry Ford that manufactured the automobiles in Detroit. To further assist in bringing the square dance back to the people Henry Ford employed a teacher/dance master and provided his caller with a beautiful place to work, Lovett Hall. (He also provided him with a new car, pretty good idea!)

Dr. Lloyd Shaw, a Colorado school superintendent, after reading the book by Henry Ford, became interested in the future of square dancing and began to search further for material covering this art. Finally, in 1939 he published "Cowboy Dances", a book which filled in the gaps left in Henry Ford's book. He also conducted summer classes, taught teachers how to present the American folk dance and square dancing was on its way again.

Three and one half per cent of total dancers from Florida is a good representation. Thanks to all who donated seashells for the Showcase of Ideas. They were placed on the tables to be taken by dancers and all were picked up. All Northeast Publications that were on display were also picked up. This shows that people are interested in what square dancers are doing in Florida.

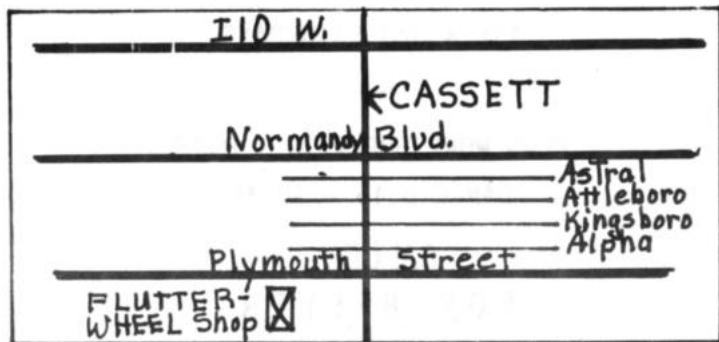

LETTER TO THE EDITOR: I have heard that there is a group of square dancers who are expressing displeasure with the inclusion of rounds at special dances. This displeasure is being expressed by a movement to "boycott" dances at which there will be rounds. If the attendance at the last Fifth Saturday Dance is any indication, I would say that this "boycott" is off to a good start.

But will it achieve the purpose the protest group hopes for? I don't think so. It will only show these people up as the small-minded people they really are. Do we square dancers want to express the FRIENDSHIP and FELLOWSHIP that our activity is based on by shutting out another group?

As I see it, there are pros and cons on both sides of the issue. I AM NOT A ROUND DANCER, so the opinions I am expressing are not of a self-serving nature.

One of the complaints is that there are so few of "them" in comparison to the number of "us". "It's a waste of time to have 8-10 couples on the floor while 50-60 couples sit idle". As one of those who sat on the sidelines while Dick cued at the Fifth Saturday Dance and Barbara cued at the Presidential Ball and Grapevine Dance, I observed these 8-10 couples also appearing in squares throughout the evening. Doesn't that make THEM a part of US?

The callers give us breaks between tips. If round dancers have the energy to dance while the rest of us "take a breather", more power to them. Rather than being a "waste of time" perhaps this could be viewed as a complete utilization of time when the floor might otherwise be empty.

I come from an area of the country where rounds were included between tips at regular club dances as well as at special dances, so perhaps that is why I don't see eye to eye with this protest movement. But, I'd be interested to hear the opinion of others who so far have not expressed an opinion either for or against rounds.
