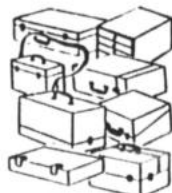

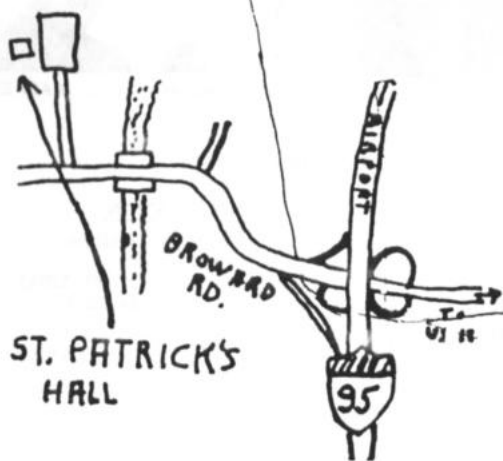

Fifth Saturday Dance: Delegate Appreciation Dance on July 30th. Delegates on roster will be admitted free. No substitutions. Delegates are asked to help with refreshments. OCTOBER dance to be a HALLOWEEN COSTUME DANCE. Callers are Jim Cosman and Lawton Smith and dance will be at Sandalwood.

Blood Bank: Reminded by President Wolfert to be sure to record donations to Northeast. In addition, call Kim Keefer so she can update her records.

Fall Roundup '88: Fred Brinson distributed ribbons to the clubs and asked that they start selling as soon as possible. Asked delegates to bring ticket money to September meeting.

Florida Federation: Letters written by dancers needed to help support the promotion of square dancing as our National Dance. Deadline for letters is July 31st. Guidelines and sample letters distributed to delegates. Strong opposition by Folk Lovers of America. Three thousand signature petition delivered to Washington.

Hall of Fame Dance to be held November 5th, 1988 in Daytona. The Hall of Fame was established by Florida Federation to honor those in Florida who have participated and promoted square dancing for a minimum of ten years and have made a statewide impact. Norm Farrell voiced a desire to see someone from Northeast nominated into the Hall of Fame.

Grapevine: Shad Shadwell has "Learn to Square Dance" posters available for 25 cents each or five for \$1.00 to anyone wanting to advertise in this manner. Promotional materials were also available. New Dancer books still available for new graduates and dancers to our area. List of new dance classes will be available in September. (Included in this issue of GV.)

State Convention '89: Registration forms and Rooster Buttons available for clubs. Volunteers still needed for various committees. Erma asks support from anyone with a convention outfit who would like to go along with them to promote the convention. Please give her a call. Next convention meeting Sunday, July 16th, 2pm, St. Paul's United Methodist Church, Arlington.

Old Business: Picnic at Brandy Branch Forest on Sunday, September 11th, 4 to 9pm. Cost \$6.00 per person. Dinner menu: hamburgers, coleslaw, baked beans, dessert, ice tea and coffee. Hayrides, games and dancing. Limit 200. Callers to be announced. Delegates to get first option. Sign-up at 5th Saturday Dance. Flyers to be distributed at that time.

New Business: Nominating Committee selected. Chairman, Danny Danson, Millard Brown and Maxine O'Donnell. September meeting will be elections.

Motion to have 50/50 at Fifth Saturday Dance. Motion passed.

Motion to confirm nomination of Fred Brinson as Vice President. Motion passed.

Next meeting: 2:00pm, September 11th, 1988 followed by picnic.

STRAIGHT TALK

ARE WE TOO AFFORDABLE?

This was prompted by a visit Carole and I made recently to a very nice (and expensive) restaurant to celebrate Carole's birthday.

I knew it was not "the average" restaurant, when, as we pulled into the driveway, two valets rushed out to open doors for us and then parked the car. It was disappointing, however, as we walked in, to find no cloakroom, but only hooks in the walls on both sides of the foyer which meant that our coats would be completely unsecured.

The building itself was new and nice but not anything extra special. The entrees were high in price and all a la carte. Salads were \$4.00 extra with no choice of dressing. The waitress brought one roll at a time and only if you asked for one. The potato with a fancy name turned out to be pan fries (about five slices). I would have preferred baked but they were not available. The fancy-named sauce for my filet mignon turned out to be brown gravy, and dessert was another \$4.00 each. When the \$80.00 bill came (tip included), I have to admit that the words "rip off" did come to mind.

As we sat there sipping our tea and coffee, I posed a question to Carole, "What makes this restaurant worth this kind of money?" We both agreed that the owner established what his place was worth when he had the menus printed. He told the public he is running an expensive restaurant and they are flocking to his place and paying the price, to the point where we overheard the hostess tell people over the phone that they were completely booked for the following night.

We do the same thing in square dancing. We establish what our recreational activity is worth by our price of admission at a dance. Unfortunately, by today's standards, we are telling the whole world that square dancing is not worth very much

when we offer an evening's entertainment for \$2.50 or \$3.00 per person. What else can you do for that amount of money? Stop at McDonald's? Maybe. Go to a movie? No! Go to a comedy club? No! Have one drink at a lounge? Hardly!

What other kind of dance lessons can you take for the price we charge to learn square dancing? None!

For 22 years now, I have watched clubs reluctantly and slowly increase their admissions price from \$1.25 to \$2.50 per person while inflation was running rampant all around us. Meanwhile, our dancers have accepted the fact that cars now cost \$15,000, trailers \$10,000, motor homes \$30,000, going out to dinner costs \$20 to \$25 per person.

Why do we insist on telling people how little square dancing is worth while clubs are not taking in enough money to meet expenses?

Maybe it's time to take a different look at the way we market our product. Should we be trying so hard to make square dancing "affordable" that no one is interested? Do people really want something that is "affordable" or do they want to reach a little? They certainly don't buy "affordable" homes, cars or vacations.

If we want this activity of ours to live forever, we must also keep it solvent and attractive. I see very little in this world that is cheap and also attractive. Let us know your thoughts on this...

Florida Georgia Blood Alliance



Donor Clubs

There has been a change at the Florida Georgia Blood Alliance - formerly the Jacksonville Blood Bank:

A Blood Alliance Donor Club is a group of individuals, usually a company, organization, church, or school, who has committed their time and energy to the purpose of ensuring an adequate blood supply in their community. If you are a Donor Club member and you or a family member (family - income tax dependents) use whole blood or red cells in a Blood Alliance served hospital, "any non-insured blood processing fees will be paid by Blood Alliance directly to the patient upon receipt of the final hospital bill". This benefit applies thirty days after the formation of the club. If no donations have been made to a donor club account during a twelve month period, these benefits do not apply.

Each club will be assigned a suggested quota of donors per year. Clubs meeting or surpassing their quota (ours is 30) will be eligible for extended family benefits (extended family - income tax dependents plus parents and grandparents of donor and spouse) and special community recognition in the media and at the Spring Donor Club Recognition Luncheon.

Clubs donating 25% or more above their quota may choose to offer benefit coverage to retirees.

If a DONOR leaves a club and is no longer a member, the above benefits are valid for one year from the time of the donation. Non-donors who are no longer members of a club are not eligible for the benefits.
