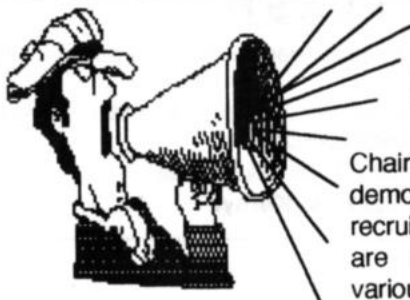


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

- K. The Committee Chairmen, along with the Association President, will present the award at the Annual Fall Festival.
- L. Nominations are to be submitted to the Chairmen of DANCE COUPLE OF THE YEAR AWARD. Aaron & Erma Fry, No later than the NEFSARDA September meeting.
- M. Nominations should be in the form of an essay and typewritten.
- N. Please sign your nomination paper.

FLORIDA FEDERATION **STATE SQUARE DANCE OUTFIT**

At the Florida Federation of Square Dancers Working Weekend, February 17 & 18, 1996, it was approved to set in motion, the process of selecting a **NEW** Florida State Square Dance Outfit.

In order to publicize and encourage dancers throughout the State to participate, the Federation needs the help of each Association and their publications state wide.

Let it be known that anyone can submit an outfit, keeping the following guidelines in mind:

1. Keep the design simple with easy construction.
2. A design compatible to women of different sizes.
3. Availability of pattern **AND** material.
4. Accessories such as shoes & petticoat, be a color the majority have.
5. Outfit should be for both men & women.

6. Outfits to be constructed & presented to the Outfit Committee at the February 1997 Working Weekend, along with a copy of the pattern and logo.

7. The committee will select a minimum of three outfits to be displayed and voted upon at the full Federation assembly at the Sunday meeting. Voting shall be by ballot only.

To avoid any conflict with the current Florida Federation State Outfit or the 1997 National Convention Outfits, we suggest the new outfit not be worn until 1998.

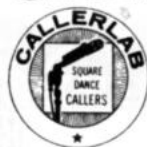

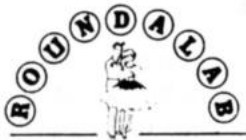

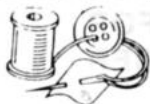

STITCHIN' TIME

by Gerry Fredrickson (Moose Promenaders)

A variety of overskirts can be made by using bandanas of fabric squares of any kind. Many times you find fabric with squares of a repeated pattern in groups of four squares. You can use as many squares as you need to attain the length of skirt and size of waist that you need. (Example: 18" squares 28" waist 19" length of overskirt.)

1. Start by cutting the squares apart. (Dia. 1)
2. Mark the bottom corner of each square.

(Use masking tape or pins.)

3. Add the length of skirt plus 1 1/4". Use this amount (20 1/4") to measure diagonally from the bottom corner (A). (Dia. 2)

4. Measure the remaining distance (5") to the opposite corner (B).

5. Mark this same distance (B) on the side (CE & DE). (Dia. 3)

6. Cut an arc through points C & D. This is the waistline.

7. Measure the waistline length (F) (7 1/2").

Take your waist measurement and divide by length E. This will tell you how many squares you need to fit your waist. You will need to round and estimate these figures as they will not be exact. ($28 \div 7 = 4$)

8. Use this first square as a pattern to cut the other squares being sure that the pattern of the squares are all facing the same direction.

9. Join the squares together by joining all the side seams together. Once the waist is cut, it will be easy to determine which sides need to be sewn together. If you marked the bottom corner of each square, it will also help to line up the squares. (Dia. 4)

10. Add a waistband. Some fabrics also have a border which is perfect for this. If you have a lot of fullness, you can add an elastic waistband and make a pull-on overskirt. If the waist measurement does not allow for this, leave one seam open and add a regular waistband with a button or hook. (Dia. 5)

11. Finish with a rolled hem or serge.

Some overskirts can be worn with a variety of skirts. They can be used to dress up a regular skirt in to a holiday outfit. You can also sew it on to the skirt as a permanent part of the dress or skirt. **ENJOY!!**

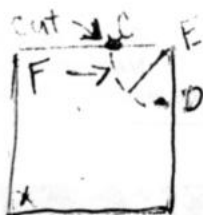

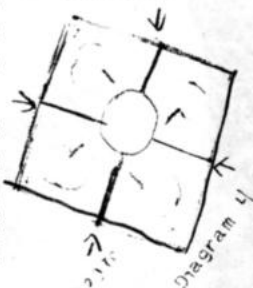

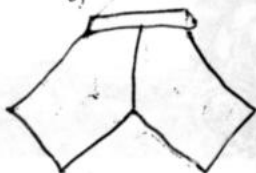

1996 Florida Square Dance Hall Of Fame Inductees **DAVE & SHIRLEY NIHART**



Northeast Florida Square and Round Dancers **Dave & Shirley Nihart** were inducted into the Florida Square Dancers Hall Of Fame on Sunday, May 26, 1996 during the Florida State Convention in Lakeland Florida.

Dave & Shirley have been Square Dancing for 24 years and Round Dancing for 21 years. They have been active in three of the five Square and Round Dance Associations in the State. Their participation began in Orlando in the 1970's where they were members and officers in three different clubs. They were also active members of the Central Florida Square & Round Dancers Association.

From Orlando, they moved to Pensacola where they served on the executive Board of the Northwest Florida Square & Round Dancers Association. They belonged to two Northwest clubs, one of which owned the building they danced in. Dances were held every night of the week in the Seaside Club and as a result, Dave, as President and Shirley as Treasurer,

were "on duty" all the time. The Niharts also served as Chairman of the 1990 Summer Festival.

Dave & Shirley moved to Jacksonville in 1981 and quickly became actively involved in the dance community of Northeast Florida. They became members of the Teddy Bear Squares and Quartermores Square Dance clubs and the Sunshine Sweethearts Round Dance club as well as the "Reflections" Round Dance Exhibition Team. As members of the "Reflections", the Niharts performed at six National Square Dance Conventions and numerous Festivals throughout the southern United States.

The Niharts are past President (1986) of NEFSARDA. As dancers who enjoy both segments of the activity, they are active advocates of both. They were the driving force behind the inclusion of "Round Dancers" in the Association title which, until January 1986, was called 'N.E. Florida Square Dancers Association'. As NEFSARDA President, they were active in the promotion and presentation of Florida's largest outdoor Square Dance when, on June 14, 1986, nearly 1500 dancers filled Jacksonville's mile-long River Walk to celebrate the "Spirit of '86" and the golden anniversary of Square Dancing in the U.S.

They have represented Northeast Florida as delegates to the Florida Federation of Square Dancers since 1984 and were elected to its' Executive Board in 1987. They served in each of the five offices and were elected President of the Florida Federation in 1991.

They also served as Northeast Florida representatives on the Bid Committee for the 46th National Square Dance Convention. After Florida was awarded the bid in 1993, the Niharts accepted the position of Registration and Housing Chairman for the 46th NSDC.

of the 36th Florida State Convention in 1989 and General Chairman of the 41st State Convention in 1984. In the year 2000, they will be serving as Assistant General Chairman of the 46th State Convention. They are the 1985 recipients of the Circle of Service and in 1991, received the honor of being named Northeast Florida Dance Couple of the Year.

Visit the Nihart home and you'll have no doubt what is their first love. From being greeted by Square Dancing figurines on the front lawn, to seeing the Square and Round Dance memorabilia in every room of the home, you are reminded that "Square Dancers Live Here!"

Dave retired after 33 years in the meat merchandising business and was employed as a Production Planner for "Pride of Florida" for eight years.

Shirley has 22 years experience in the banking profession. In order to support their Square and Round Dance addictions, Shirley is presently employed by FIGA and Dave has a part-time position with the Jacksonville Suns baseball team. When not on the dance floor, Dave enjoys playing golf and Shirley enjoys reading and crafts. In addition, they are both avid Pinochle players.

The Niharts have been married for 43 years and are parents of two sons. They are also proud Grandparents of five grandsons and one granddaughter.

It is an honor to present **Dave and Shirley Nihart**, 1996 inductees to the **Florida Hall of Fame**.

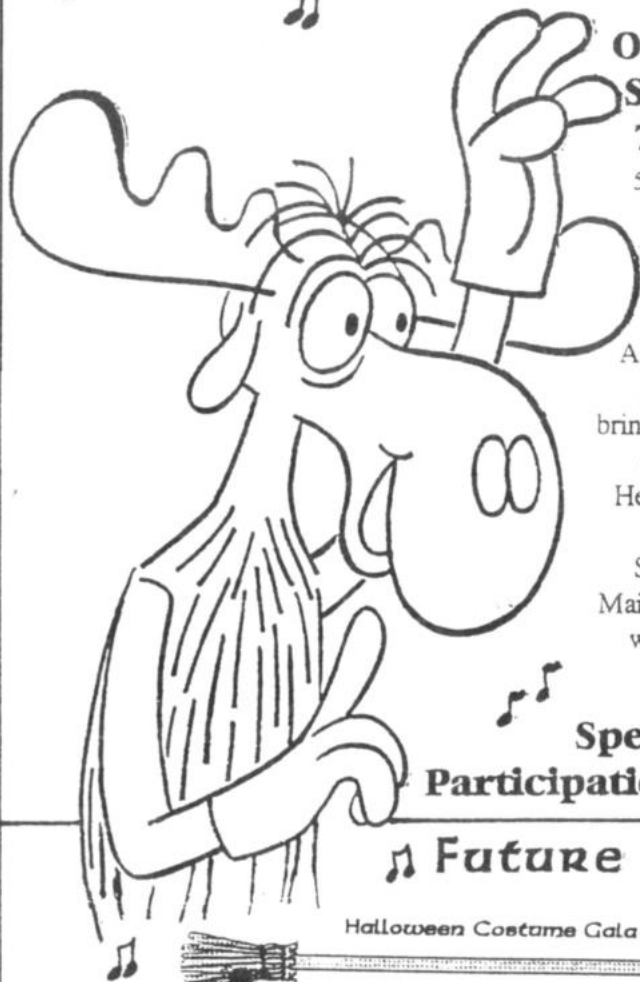

REBECCA HOLDEN — SQUARE DANCING **SPOKESPERSON**

(The following item was discovered on the Internet by our diligent Surfin' reporter on May 14th. The article appeared in the "Sioux City Journal" newspaper.)

"SQUARE DANCING ISN'T SQUARE! NEW NATIONAL SPOKESPERSON MAKES SIOUX CITY HER FIRST STOP!

"Square Dancing is the best kept secret around" says Rebecca Holden, international spokesperson for the uniquely American art form.

Holden is a surprise guest at the 34th Iowa State Square and Round Dance Convention in Sioux City this weekend.

Holden, country singer, movie actress, television star and live performer, flew to Sioux City from her home in Nashville, Tennessee, Thursday. She is perhaps best known for her role in the television series, "Knight Rider" in which she played the computer whiz opposite David Hasselhoff. The show is now syndicated in 92 countries.

Holden, a San Antonio, Texas, native, will be in Sioux City for the entire convention, which ends Saturday night.

Holden has surprised everyone with her appearance because, until two weeks ago, Square Dancing had never had a spokesperson

Months ago, Sioux City Square Dance caller Chuck Veldhuizen, member of the International Caller's Association, CALLERLAB, began searching for someone to propose as a spokesperson to a convention of 10 major international callers' and dancers' associations, which met in Kansas City two weeks ago.

Dotty & Jimmy Snow, owners of GCN Video Productions in Nashville where Veldhuizen cuts his Square

Dance records, recommended Holden. She and Veldhuizen began collaborating on a Square Dance television show pilot, "American Dance Land", and will have finished a Square Dance CD in time for the National Convention in June.

Veldhuizen then took Holden to the convention in Kansas City – just two weeks ago. He introduced her to the various associations' board and she was later approved as spokesperson.

The Sioux City convention will be her first official function since assuming the new role, but she's been working on it full speed for the past two weeks.

"No matter what I get involved in I want to get completely immersed in it and learn all I can right now", Holden said in an interview Thursday at the Journal.

Although she's danced all her life, it had been elementary school since she had Square Danced. She's been taking a crash course from Veldhuizen, who is also an instructor, and is learning to call the dances.

"Chuck took a couple of my songs and put calls in. When they're preplanned and you sing them just like the lyrics, it's not hard," Holden says of calling.

"Square Dancing is consistent," she says. "Every call is the same whether you do it in Saudi Arabia, Tokyo or Sioux City. It's all over the world. Even if they don't speak English they know all the Square Dance calls are in English. Also, unlike Country Dancing, done in bars or clubs, "You don't see Square Dancing 'out.' Holden says. "It's done in high school gyms, or church basements, or rec. rooms or senior centers. Unless you know about it already, you're not exposed to it"

That's something she wants to change. "I thought about different ways of taking it to the world, or raising its profile."

She hopes her TV show will be one way to achieve the goal of helping to get Square Dancing declared the national dance. Twenty-nine states have agreed but it takes 35 for a declaration.

Holden took advantage of a chance encounter at the Journal with Iowa Gov. Terry Branstad to bring Iowa into the fold.

In her short, yet immersed tenure, Holden already has a number of stories of different Square Dancing characters, their friendliness, and the mental and physical benefits of the dance — "I dare anybody to move to music and not get happy. It's a good

mood elevator," she says. Holden is obviously sold on Square Dancing, and she has big plans to promote it. "It's so much fun," she says. "We're going to try to overcome the stereotype image because it's a hip, hot, happenin' thing," she says. "In that regard, we're also going to bring in the youth. That's another one of my goals"

She also plans a line of "hip Square Dance clothes."

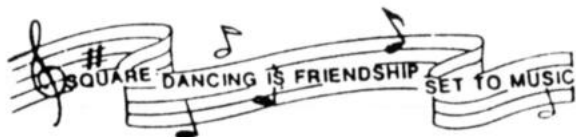

WHAT'S COOKING ?

Some time ago I enjoyed "Cornbread Salad" made by Barbara Rodon while playing Pinochle with friends. When I asked Barbara about using it for this column I didn't know that it was in our "Kitchen Magic From Florida" cookbook (page 168). I then discovered she had yet another entry -- "Delightful Squash" (page 207). Here are both of these scrumptious recipes for you to try.



Cornbread Salad

- | | |
|---------------------------------|----------------------------|
| 1 Box Jiffy corn muffin mix | 1 Large tomato, chopped |
| 9 Strips of bacon | 1 Medium onion, chopped |
| 1/2 Cups sweet pickles, chopped | 1 Cup mayonnaise |
| 1 Bell pepper, chopped | 1/4 Cup sweet pickle juice |

Prepare the corn muffin mix according to directions. Pour into a 9 inch square baking dish and bake according to the directions. Fry the bacon until crisp, Cool and crumble. Toss all the chopped vegetables, pickles and bacon together. Set aside. Combine the mayonnaise and pickle juice. Crumble the cooled cornbread. In a large casserole dish, spread half of the chopped vegetable mixture on top of the cornbread. Drizzle half of the mayonnaise and pickle juice mixture on top. Repeat the layering. Chill for 2 hours or overnight before serving.

Cook squash and onion. Drain and mash. Add sugar, eggs, mayonnaise, 3/4 cup cheddar cheese, salt, pepper and margarine. Mix, pour into 1 1/2 quart casserole. Bake at 350 degrees for 35 to 40 minutes. Top with cracker crumbs and remaining cheese and bake an additional 5 minutes.

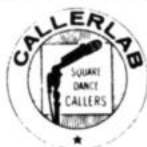

Welcome to our new members, Ralph & Mary Eusterbrock.

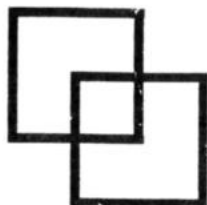
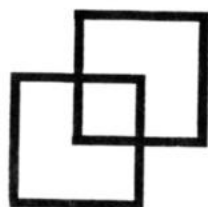

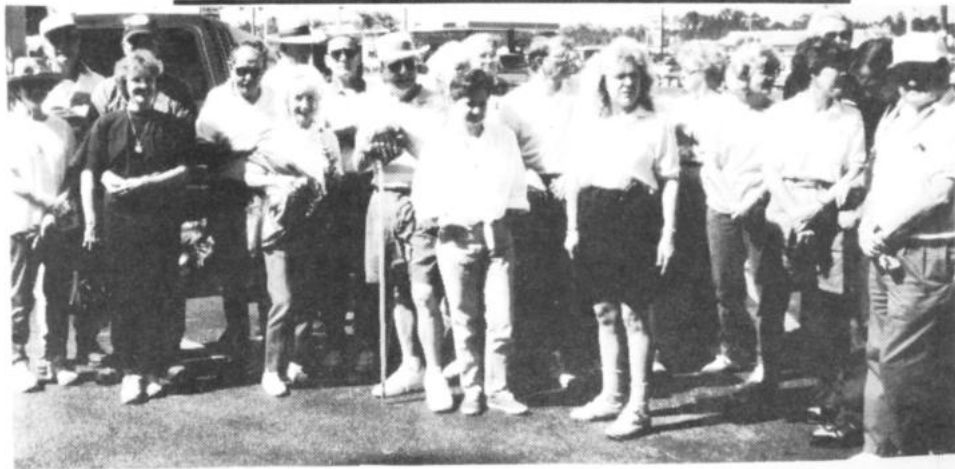

When you send in your completed form, don't forget to include the fees for those checked items along with your \$25 per dancer registration fee.

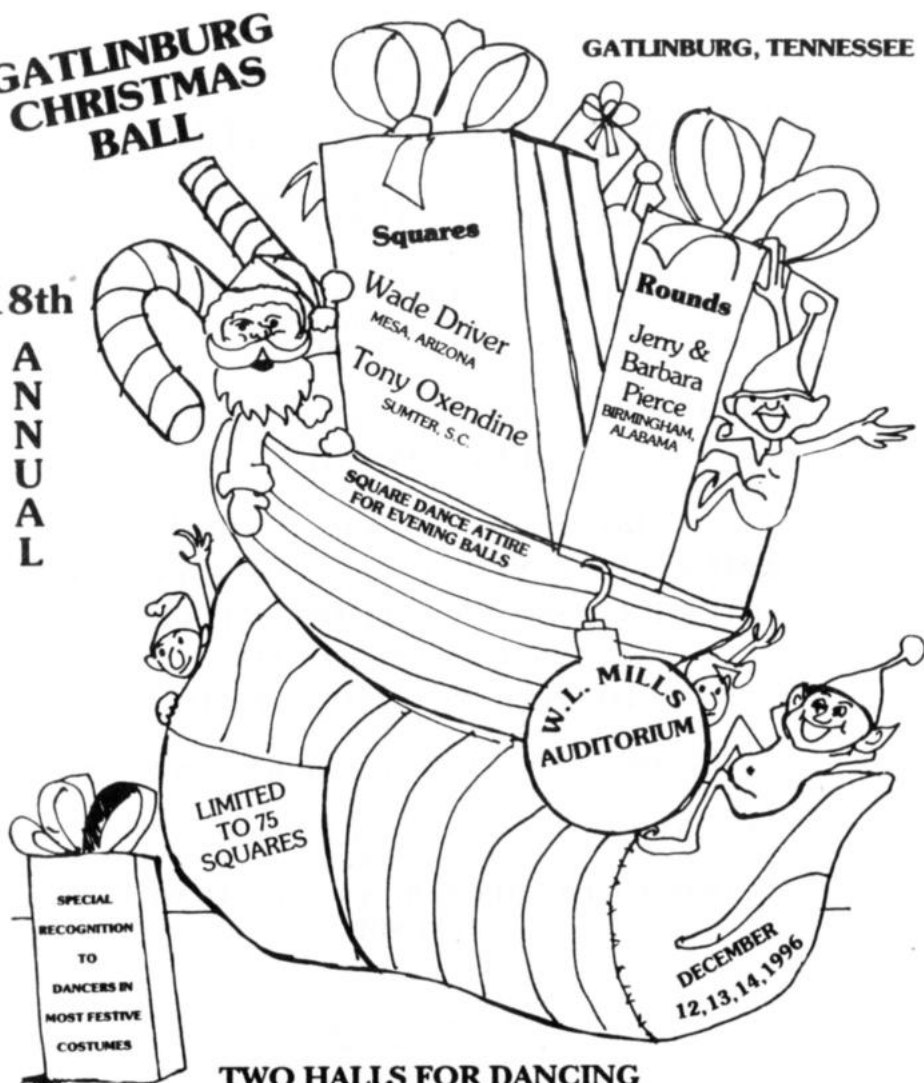
Need housing or camping? Don't forget to indicate your four choices and the dates the housing or camping is needed.

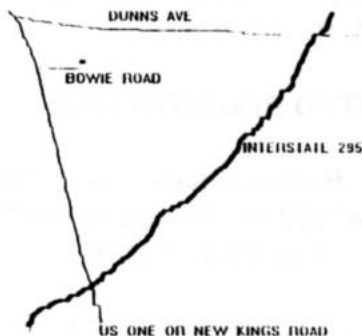
