NORTHEAST FLORIDA SQUARE DANCERS ASSOCIATION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The following clubs were represented at the last ASSOCIATION meeting held November 8, 1964, at the Mayflower Hotel: Friendly Frolics, Fun and Frolic, Grand Slammers, Jubileers, Orange Park Promenaders, Paxon Prancers, Star Lite Shufflers, Swinging Squares, Western Cutters. Delegates heard the following reports:

GRAPEVINE - Bill and Ruth Fleshman are very serious about the Association getting someone else to take over this monthly bulletin. Much unnecessary expense is being incurred by the ASSOCIATION because of errors in lists of persons to receive the GRAPEVINE and because some persons fail to send in notice of change of address.

PUBLICITY - Carl Law reported that promotion material for increasing square-dance interest has been sent to St. Augustine, Gainesville and other cities outside the local area. Some material is still available if other clubs desire it. Carl announced that square dancing at the Fair was a success and names of people interested in learning to square dance have been turned over to callers and clubs. The Kieffers were thanked for decorating the booth.

PROGRAM - Frank Clements stated that all local callers had been contacted to assist in the daytime program for the Fall Roundup, but none in Gainesville or other cities outside the local area had been contacted.

DELEGATES took the following action:
(1) It was reiterated that admission for all children through high-school age shall be only half the regular price at all ASSOCIATION dances, including the Fall Roundup. (2) When Association delegates to the Florida Federation of Square Dancers are required to travel 250 miles or more to attend a meeting of the State Federation, they shall henceforth be paid \$10 toward their expenses, except that when the meeting place and time coincide with the State Square Dance Convention, delegates shall bear their total expense.

PRESIDENT WALLY LIGHTFOOT announced the following committee-chairmen appointments: Program, Fred and Erma Blado; Publicity, Carl and Rose Law; "Bow & Swing," Virgil Green; Constitution and By-Law Revision, Louis Olsen. Wally requested that delegates determine and report whether their clubs desire the Annual Fall Roundup to remain scheduled on the week-end of the Florida-Georgia game or whether the date should be changed. The next 5th-Saturday ASSOCIATION dance will be on January 30, 1965, and all arrangements will be made by the Program Committee.

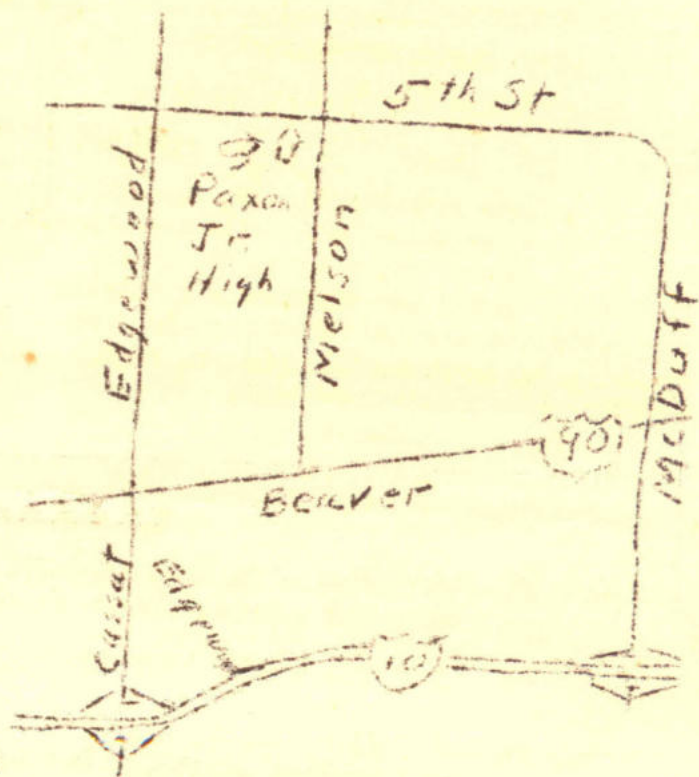
