TAKE 'EM OR LEAVE 'EM - IDEAS

& District Square Dance ASSO.workshop

COURTESY CLUES

- DO - be aware that square & round dancing is a "courtesy" recreation rather than one of competition.
- DO - wear a name badge at all times.
- DO - keep smiling even if you're angry with yourself for "goofing". The other dancers might think you are frowning at them.
- DO - accept or admit you "goofed"..When you goof..do it gracefully & try to recover quickly.
- DO - be quiet & attentive to the caller during instructions..DON'T be a KNOW-IT-ALL.
- DO - pretend you are having a good time even if you are bored. If you want a challenge..try dancing with the weaker dancers & pull them through. Maybe you are that good..
- DO - remember to treat the ladies as you would want other men to treat your own wife..the ladies always seem to treat other men a little gentler than their own spouse.
- DO - end each dance with a flourish.. applause & thanks to all in your set & really MEAN IT..
- DO - support a club as a dues-paying member. Take your turn at responsibility as officers, committee chairman or help in any way, rather than being catered to always.
- DO - as a club member, thank guests for coming..At any dance, thank the caller, the club president & every one who made your evening, pleasant.
- DON'T - be guilty of "horse-play" unless you know the set or club would not be offended.
- DON'T - forget the callers wife. she might like to dance rather than sit all evening..at least ask.
- DON'T - sit like a bump on a log when another couple is needed..if you want to sit a tip out, disappear into the washroom or some place where you are not seen..this saves embarrassing the 3 couples waiting for a friend to join them.
- DON'T - set up sets of 4 couples pre-arranged to go out on the dance floor..you might insult the ability of the other dancers around you & defeat the democratic quality of square dancing..

FROM THE EDITORS

There have been a lot of exhibition dancing in the past month & we have heard a lot of discussion on Do's & Don't's. Here are some hints & guidelines for exhibition & demonstrations as used by Mary & Bill Jenkins of Minerva, New York..

For any demonstration or exhibition, we use records including the Basic 50, only. Copies of "The Basic Movements of Square Dancing" may be purchased from us, or borrowed & returned & we provide a place for the group to practice providing a complete set is available. A few reminders, suggestions & hints will help to promote square dancing & present a favorable image. Stand tall..smile..relax..be gentle(if you are nervous & tense, don't let it show on your partners arms or hands).

Take small steps..it not only looks better, but gives you more time to think where you are going, where you are supposed to be. Keep the square small..close it in. Lets all promenade with hands in front. Keep feet on the floor..no kicking, no patting of hands..no fooling around..Dance & make it look beautiful!!

Ladies, use your skirts..arms & hands should never dangle or flop around..keep elbows to your sides, arms bent at elbow (this goes for the men too). Your skirt is there to hold if your hand is free. To practice smoother dancing, ladies & gents, moving to the beat of the music with a book on your head will help. Try it..its not as easy as it sounds, but it surely cuts down on the bounce & the vibration.

Please wear full square dance costume, including a club or name badge. At the end of the dance, do not clap. Do a California twirl, bow to the audience, California twirl & face back in. To exit, four ladies chain, chain back, & hold this courtesy turn position, promenade once. Couple one will lead off followed by couples 4,3 & 2, taking small steps & moving to the music. Entering can be done in the same sequence, couples 1,4, 3,2 & the couples stop in place after one promenade..

CALLERLAB WORKSHOP POLL

December thru February

The committee has selected one experimental figure for this quarter. The selected figure is COORDINATE.

COORDINATE is a smooth action figure starting from single file columns, set up by doing a curlique from facing lines, and ending in a two-faced line.

THE SET-UP: Heads lead right, circle to a line, curlique

THE ACTION: On the command COORDINATE all will single file circulate one and a half positions. This sets up three pairs with right hands adjacent in a column formation and two men as lonesome ends facing right. (NOTE: When teaching this position, have the dancers circulate one position, then the half more to establish the set-up of three pairs and two lone ends.)

The three pairs turn half by the right, and the center pair made up of two men will step forward individually to the outside of the girls directly in front to become one end of the forming two-faced line. The lonesome man on the end of the set-up will step ahead to become the other end of the two-faced line. The two-faced line will be in normal couples circulate direction with boys on the ends and girls in the center. (NOTE: A good smooth styling assist can be made by the girls in the column. As they turn by the right one-half, the girls who come alongside of the lonesome end men can "pick them up" as they complete the turn and together they form the end of the two-faced line.)

The figure is flowing and the follow-up actions of wheel and deal, couples circulate, or bend the line will dance smoothly.

BASIC DANCING FIGURES:

Heads lead right and circle to a line
Curlique, COORDINATE, bend the line
Star thru, dive thru, square thru $\frac{1}{2}$
Left allemande.....

Heads lead right and circle to a line
Curlique, COORDINATE
Bend the line, pass thru
Bend the line, slide thru
Left allemande.....
