PIC stands for Primary Interexchange Carrier. Clear now? Not really! Most telephone users know that big changes have occurred within the telephone industry - but are not really sure what these changes mean today or in the future.

There are numerous PIC's (or companies that are providers of long distance service). Between now and mid-1986 sixty-six percent of the nation's long distance (LD) users will have to pick which long distance company they want to carry their LD calls.

Equal access is another term that keeps surfacing. Today AT&T pays a higher premium to the local telephone company for the "#1" LD dialing service. By mid-1986 any LD company wanting to provide "#1" dialing will have to increase their payment for this service.

Once all this takes place it is felt that AT&T rates will be lowered and other Primary Interexchange Carriers will have to increase their rates to offset their higher costs for equal access.

AT&T is sponsoring this PIC dance. During this PIC dance we will take a 15 minute break for a short presentation of what is happening in the telephone industry. There will be AT&T Communications people available to answer questions.

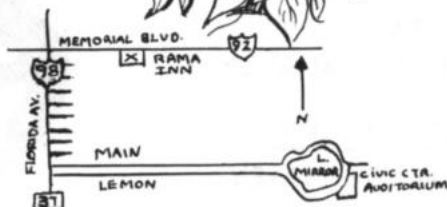

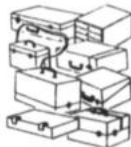
