### **EASY TRAVEL PLANNED FOR SQUARE DANCERS**

Arrangements are being made for convenient shuttle service from outlying hotels and motels for the 35th National Square Dance Convention in Indianapolis June 26-28, 1985.

Efforts are being made to house all the 40,000 expected convention goers within I-465, which surrounds the city. At any point along that interstate bypass, shuttle service can reach the Indiana Convention Center and Hoosier Dome within 15 minutes. The arrangement makes long waits by car-less square dancers unlikely.

The interstate bypass is linked to downtown Indianapolis by Interstate-65 and Interstate-70, plus an Airport Expressway and numerous major streets, some of them one-way, multiple lane routes to downtown.

Campers at the official convention campsite inside the Indiana State Fairgrounds will be provided with unlimited passes for shuttle service connections to the convention center. The \$10 pass, which is included in the camping package price, is good for a couple and two children.

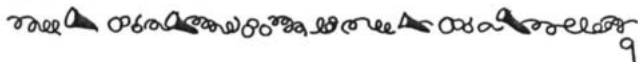

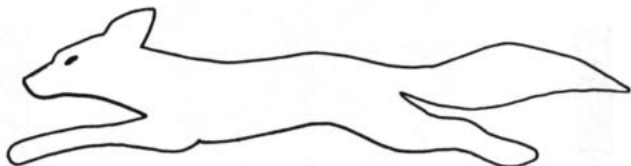

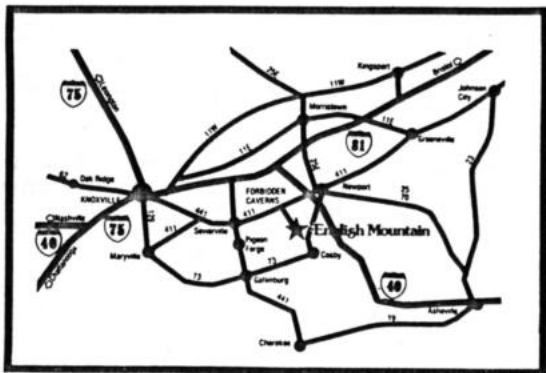

Membership goes beyond the dues-paying stage. In square dancing, you, as a dancer, are the backbone of the entire movement. Without you there would be no need for leaders, callers, cuers, teachers, etc. Being a follower brings with it an awesome responsibility.

Your first responsibility is to yourself. All types of dancing are not for all dancers. Find a level in which you are comfortable and from which you derive the most pleasure, whether it be Mainstream, Plus, A-1, A-2 or Challenge. Dance often enough to become proficient at your chosen level. Your goal should be fun and fellowship. You have a responsibility to yourself to thoroughly enjoy your chosen avocation. In this way you will become a contented organizational booster rather than a carping fault-finder.


You can be a good follower by recognizing your responsibility to other dancers. You should be socially clean, courteous and pleasant. Be friendly to those dancers you know and try to make visitors welcome. Adhere to all the rules of good manners, dancing and otherwise.

Good followers have a responsibility to their club and its officers. Support all club functions and dances. Allow the club officers to lead. Your suggestions should be made in the form of constructive criticism. Assist when possible. You have a responsibility to the entire Square Dance Movement. Non-square dancers will judge all square dancers by your demeanor and behaviour. Your attire immediately identifies you as a Square Dancer. Be friendly and courteous, try to project the image of the clean, healthful, typically American National Dance of the United States of America.
