Many changes are being made in the format of The State Convention to hopefully make it one of the best ever. Continuous dancing from 7:00pm to 11:30pm Friday evening, 9:00am to 11:30pm Saturday and 12:30pm to 11:30pm on Sunday. This is the first time a continuously open hall format will be used at the Convention. The purpose of this type program is to use the hall space more effectively and give the dancer more choices on when and in what halls to dance. The better utilization of hall space provides 50% more space for the plus dancer, 100% more space for the A1 dancer, the large arena for mainstream and better hall usage for the round dancer with over 25 hours of exclusive round dancing. Yes, A2 dancing will be available.

With 75 callers offering to be on the program the Callers Assn and the Caller Vice Chairman Earl Steele had a tough assignment. The results are outstanding, with Florida's best callers programed during the prime evening hours. In addition those callers that we, the dancers, depend on so heavily to keep our clubs active and interesting, our club callers, are also on the program.

The Round Dance Vice Chairman Frank DuBois will program the Rounds in February, now we need you, the dancer, to make this "87" convention one of the best ever

Mr. & Mrs. Club Officer, lets take a moment and discuss this State Convention. When visiting with some of the club callers I find a number of the club's are not cancelling their dances during The State Convention thus limiting the time your caller can offer to be on the State Convention program. The Florida State Convention belongs to the Florida Square Dance participants and is one of the very best State Conventions. In 1987 we have the space, an excellent program more dance time than ever before, a fun type enjoyable program, and now the Convention needs your support. We ask you, the club officers, of all Florida Square and Round dance clubs, to strongly consider cancelling your dances on May 22, 23 & 24, 1987 and encourage your club dancers to participate in this 1987 State Convention

Sally and I extend a personal invitation to all of you to send in your registration now and commit yourself to support this, your State Square and Round Convention in 1987.

## CALLER'S CORNER: WHERE HAS IT GONE?



Most of you know that Donna and I are fairly new to the Jacksonville area, being here only a year on Nov 2nd. Until I started calling on a regular basis we visited and danced at many of the clubs in this area.

During our visits we noticed primarily 3 areas of square dancing that, we feel, should be addressed by callers and dancers alike, and although there isn't enough space on this page to elaborate, the first thing I'd like to address is, "Enthusiasm".

Where has it gone? Have you as a caller ever experienced the disappointment of gearing up for a dance, thinking about how much fun you're going to have working a new call or for that matter, an old call from a new formation; you put on the record and as you wait, the record plays all the way through and most of the dancers are still milling around or socializing instead of squaring up and you have to start the record over again?

Have you as a dancer ever experienced the disappointment of going to a dance and winding up having to sit out a number of tips during the evening because people would rather continue their conversations instead of filling a partially formed square?

What ever happened to the cheering that says "Hey we made it" when you successfully reach a left allemande or a right & left grand? And what happened to the applause for the caller at the end of a tip? Or the dancers grouping together at the end of the evening and thanking the caller as a show of appreciation for his efforts?

I wonder how many of you realize that the amount of enthusiasm you show at a dance is one way the caller knows if he is doing his job properly? Does your lack of enthusiasm mean you are dissatisfied with the way he performs. If so, address him personally and discuss it, callers are just people and they enjoy having a good time as well. One nite, after a particularly good dance my wife and I had attended, she suggested that we all thank the caller as a group and out of 8 squares, maybe 2 participated. One fellow simply said, "What for, I paid my \$5.00. How about it folks? A little more enthusiasm can make the difference between a "ho-hum, OK, I'll dance if I have to" evening and a "Terrific" dance.

The second and third areas I'd like to address are "Variety and Styling". The last time I counted, there were 69 Mainstream calls on the Callerlab list. Callers, have you ever thought that the lack of enthusiasm on your dancers part may be due to a lack of variety on your part? Did you ever think that the lack of participation or the loss of mainstream dancers to higher levels was due to boredom at the mainstream level? As a caller, I can't think of anything more frustrating than being hired to a dance, weather plus or high level mainstream and finding most of the floor breaking down on basic mainstream calls;

i.e., partner tag,  $\frac{1}{2}$  tag the line, cloverleaf, spin chain thru with girls working, fan the top, etc. These and more are all legitimate calls and can add a great deal of variety to your programs.

I've noticed that dancers have memorized routines to certain records and anticipate exactly what the caller is going to call next. What happens if a guest caller uses the same record and calls something different? You got it, the square breaks down. Not only does it break down but, heaven help the poor caller, if they break down several times during one tip; he gets the reputation for calling a level they can't dance to. Don't you think that more variety in calls you use, as well as variety in the formation they are called from, would stop a lot of the anticipation and give the dancers a chance to increase their level of mainstream and stop a lot of loss of these dancers to higher level clubs just to get variety? We are all guilty, some of us more so than others, of not using information available to us through different services especially for callers, but, I really believe our dancers would appreciate our efforts more if we all did some more homework.

Earlier, I mentioned styling. I'm not talking about styling fit for an exhibition dancer, just basic styling, like hand contact in lines, ocean wave and columns, and promanading without stopping short in the home position when they could have gone the  $\frac{3}{4}$  around and avoided the traffic jam of dancers behind them. I firmly believe that encouraging hand contact in a square would stop a lot of confusion for the dancers. If hand contact was made (no matter how slight), when bending the line or in waves and columns or just as partners, there would be no doubt for the dancer who was a center, end, or partner (which may be any one of the other 7 people in their square) at any given time during the tip. Hand contact not only helps the dancer know where they are in the square, it also helps keep the squares from splitting down the middle. Just recently I called a bend the line and one of my key squares was so far apart and half of it so close to the square behind it, I wound up dancing the 2 halves of the 2 squares as one. Obviously they never made it home. We kidded a lot about it all evening and still had a good time, but, the point is, if they had just made that hand contact they would not have been that far out of position to begin with. Again, I feel that stressing just these few styling techniques, would improve the level of dancing in our area.

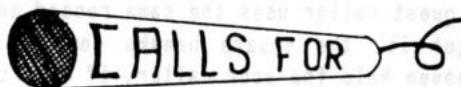
Last, I'd like to say that none of what I've said has been meant as a criticism and I apologize to anyone who may have taken it as such. My only intention is to try to improve the participation in our chosen activity by providing more variety and styling for our dancers, which I feel will in turn, provide more enthusiasm and give square dancing back the popularity it once enjoyed.

# FLORIDA FEDERATION of SQUARE DANCERS

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Joyce and I have noticed as we travel over the state that some square dancers we talk to are not aware of the relationship between them and the Florida Federation of Square Dancers. We suspect there are a good many of our newer dancers who have never been



informed about the Federation and its activities. For this reason we felt that it might be a good idea to try and explain briefly what role the Federation plays, and how it relates to each of the five associations. In other words, we will try to answer that often asked question—"What does the Florida Federation do for me?"

To begin with, the Federation is composed of delegates from all over the state. These delegates come from the five Associations, and, of course, each Association's membership is made up from the local dancers and/or local clubs. So from this you can see that a direct relationship between you, the local square dancer and Federation does exist. Each square dancer in the state does have a direct input into *all* Federation business.

Probably the best way to answer what the Federation does specifically is to list the more important aspects of our purpose:

- to promote square and round dancing in the State of Florida.
- to act as a clearing house for information, and problem solving for any problems that arise concerning square dance activities. The Federation attempts to make square dancing a popular and enjoyable activity for *all* dancers.
- to bring a spirit of cooperation among the callers, teachers, and dancers all over the world.
- to co-sponsor the annual Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention each Memorial Day weekend.
- additionally the Federation provides educational materials to all associations. In continuing the spirit of cooperation between ROUNDALAB and the Universal Round Dance Council, members of the Executive Boards of both organizations met in Kansa City, MO on July 21st before the URDC Convention

It was decided to establish a joint committee to work on terminology and standardization as it relates to descriptions, cue words and abbreviations. The first stage of work for this committee will be to compare the existing dance figures already approved by both organizations and suggest modifications to bring them in closer harmony

While the defintions might not be identical, the meaning would be the same June 1987 is the target date for completion of this comparison.

The 2nd and 3rd stages would be to discuss the figures only one organization has defined Working together on terms not as yet defined would be the 4th stage.

Other areas of mutual cooperation include producing a joint Round Dance promotional brochure, developing a suggested teacher training curriculum and setting up the machinery for an interchange of ideas and leaders between various organizations - local, national and international

The next joint meeting will be Tuesday, June 23, 1987, after the ROUNDALAB Convention and before the National Square Dance Convention in Houston, TX.

What do LEGACY, CALLERLAB, and ROUNDALAB have in common? Many things.

Not the least of these is the fact that they are organizations whose members are dedicated to the premise that Square Dancing in all of its facets, to include rounds, contras, clogging, traditional, etc., is the greatest form of recreation there is.

LEGACY is a non-profit international assembly of Trustees representing all facets of Square Dancing, including dancers, callers, cuers, suppliers publishers and special interest groups. It is a service-leadership organization interested in developing better communication among the many facets of the Square Dance activity. LEGACY probably is best known for its world-wide dancer surveys

CALLERLAB, The International Association of Square Dance Callers, is, as the name indicates, an organization made up of callers who give of their time, talent and resources to promote, promulgate and improve square dancing in all its forms

ROUNDALAB, The International Association of Round Dance Teachers, brings together round dance teachers from around the world who work to standardize steps and cues, delineate and describe various levels of round dancing, and promote and improve the activity

In keeping with its mission to improve communication and working relationship among the various facets of Square dancing, LEGACY instigated a meeting of the Chairpersons of these three international organizations during the National Square Dance Convention in Indianapolis. Bob & Dottie Elgin of LEGACY, Norm & Clarice Cross of CALLERLAB, and Betty & Clancy Mueller of ROUNDALAB got together to exchange information and ideas to better serve the dance activity. It was a productive meeting and an annual get-together of the three Chair-couples is planned.

## NASA Trip a Must for Sightseers

If you have an interest in space technology and exploration, then a visit to the Lyndon B. Johnson Space Center is a must, as there is nothing like it in the world. The space complex, more commonly known as mission control, serves as the nerve center of our country's manned spaceflight program. Here the astronauts receive their training and undergo rigorous testing to determine their ability to withstand the environment of outer space. In addition, all manned space flights are directed and monitored from mission control.

The collection of equipment and hardware from America's space voyages is truly awe-inspiring. Among the exhibits are astronaut Gordon Cooper's Mercury space capsule, the Lunar exploration module, the Apollo 17 spacecraft, and a Saturn V rocket.

Your first stop at mission control should be the visitor orientation center, where you can view official NASA films. The visitor center is also the starting point of tours. The tours include visits to the mission control center viewing room, space environment simulation laboratory, rocket park, mission simulation and training facilities, the moon

rock collection and Building 2 where thousands of artifacts and space gear are on display.

Getting to the space center is easy. From the Astrodome, take 610 East to the I-45/Galveston exit. Follow I-45 toward Galveston and exit at NASA Road, then follow the signs to the NASA center. Allow at least 4 hours for travel time and tour. The center is open daily from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Admission is free, and don't forget your camera.

About 90% of our association clubs participated in the insurance program this year and in many cases a great deal of money was saved because of the high cost of liability insurance that is required by many building owners. All this liability protection and accident insurance too. I believe the Insurance Program is one of the most important benefits that association members have.

Now is the time for your club to get registered for 1987. Remember the insurance year begins on January 1st, so in order to get full benefit of the program contact me right away for forms and more information.

Keep in mind that in order for a club to join the program all club members must be signed up. However, a dancer is only required to pay one time. In other words if a dancer is in more than one club then he/she only pays the fee (\$1.85) in one of the clubs.
