Square dancing is a sharing of fun, friendship, and good times. Unfortunately, we also share a few germs and a virus or two. Square dancers are very dedicated people and go dancing, even if they are feeling under the weather. Square dancers are also mostly very polite and use a hand to cover a sneeze or a cough instead of spraying the whole square. Now, the hand will catch most of the germs and hold them until the next right and left grand, at which time the bugs have circled the square, too. During the course of the evening, the bugs will have met probably every dancer on the floor and, of course, the caller. When refreshment break comes, the dancers and the bugs all head for the food. CALLER'S CORNER:

ARE YOU HAVING FUN SQUARE DANCING?



Many of you know that Sandra and I recently returned from the West Coast. We found a situation there much like what is happening here. We are losing a lot of square dancers: some who have just started dancing and others who have been dancing for years.

In talking to the new dancers they say they don't always feel welcome when visiting other clubs or sometimes even in their own club. Dancers who have been dancing for years say they quit because it just isn't fun anymore, or that it's boring.

Aren't we all a little guilty about forming a square before a weak dancer can get up with us? I have always felt square dancing was supposed to be fun, a place to get with friends and share the joy of square dancing and meet and make new friends. Maybe we tend to get too serious and forget that once we were these weaker dancers. Remember, square dancing is supposed to be fun. If you smile and invite the newer and weaker dancers into your square, they will also smile, relax and have fun. Smiling and laughter are very contagious, you may be enjoying yourself and having fun before you even realize what has happened.

Quite a few dancers have either quit or advanced on from mainstream and plus because they say it is getting boring. If other members of your club feel this way, talk to your caller. He or she will be more than willing to change format to make the calls more interesting. Even callers get caught up in a rut and tend to call to the weaker dancers and not the majority of the floor. So, if you feel the dance is boring, tell your caller. They can't do anything about it unless they know..

SILENCE IS GOLDEN - SOMETIMES

These three words were spoken by Thomas Carlyle many years ago but they still carry true, especially in relation to our square dance activities.

This phrase would certainly be appropriate when the caller is instructing. Your re-explaining to others in a square at this time will only confuse and distract others from paying close attention to what is being said.

Another time when "silence is

golden" should be when announcements are being made at a dance by a club member or officer. Extending the courtesy of silence to that member at the mike before a group is only politeness--his being there indicates something of importance need to be said. He is probably nervous but still willing to carry through a difficult task. Don't embarrass him by disregarding his remarks.

As someone once said, "Silence when nothing need be said, is the eloquence of discretion."

ROCK THE BOAT, Recycle, 8 Chain 4 (add words to song here if you wish), Swing your
Corner, Promenade, add 16 beat tag.

We wish to advise of the proper usage of quarterly selections. Please Note:

- (1) QS calls are not a mandatory part of any program. Dancers are NOT to be held accountable for selections past or present.
- (2) QS calls should be verbally mentioned and/or physically workshopped prior to being called the first time at an open dance. QS calls are to be used at the caller's discretion.
- (3) Conventions and festivals shall be encouraged to delete quarterly selections from all halls designated. For example, the Mainstream Hall should read MS, not MS + QS or MSQS.

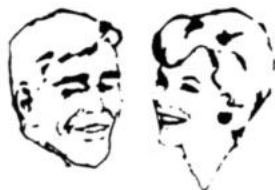

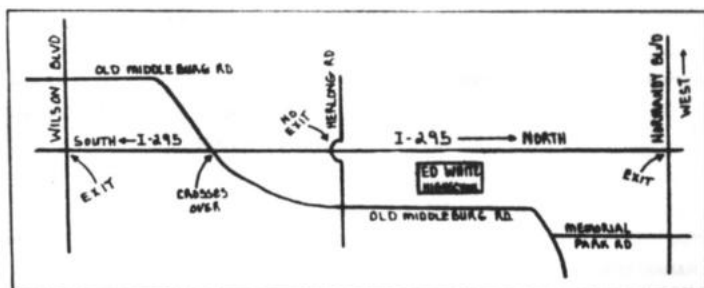

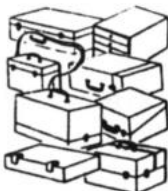
