MINUTES OF NEFSARDA MEETING, NOVEMBER 25, 1988

Nineteen of thirty clubs were represented.

SECRETARY'S MINUTES: Corrected to read, Swinging Saints caller is James Maxey.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Opening balance \$1307.29, credits \$743.50, expenses \$693.91 with new balance of \$1356.88.

GATEWAY CALLER'S ASSOCIATION: Lawton Smith has investigated the Ramona Entertainment Center for the Sophmore Dance to be held on 2/4/88. The price will be \$300 plus a 50/50 agreement. Any amount taken in over \$300 will be split between Ramona and the GCA. He also made an agreement with Ramona for the Graduation Ball which will be the 5th Saturday Dance, co-sponsored by Gateway and NEFSARDA. The price of the dances will be \$4-5.00 per person to cover the cost of the hall.

5th SATURDAY DANCE: New Chairman will be Ray Reedy. He will meet with Mary Downing and George & Nancy Wolfert to have duties explained.

FLORIDA FEDERATION: Hall of Fame Dance held Nov 5th. Raised \$237 for purchase of plaques for Hall of Fame. No action taken for establishing square dancing as National Dance. Motion died in committee. Dancers and association may resubmit request in January. Master Card to become available to square dancers soon. Nine dollars of fee to go to National Square Dancers of America with a portion returned to each state. Questionnaire in next Grapevine issue. Request dancers complete and return.

INSURANCE: Fees now \$1.90 per person with a \$30.00 club minimum. Brochure sent to each club explaining increase. Club responses due after first meeting in December.

GRAPEVINE: Ads needed by 11/21/88. Request clubs to pick up Grapevine Suscription forms. Working on Fall Roundup Program book and Directory of Dancers.

STATE CONVENTION: No report. Mentioned that price on application is per person.

FALL ROUNDUP: Advertising closed. Cost of Directory of Dancers book is \$1.50. New NEFSARDA Banner to be on display at dance. Any remaining ticket money to be collected at the door.

OLD BUSINESS: 5th Saturday Dance to be combination dance with callers. Requested that a letter be drafted stating this and sent to GWA.

NEW BUSINESS: Resignation of Vice Presient Dave & Marge Miller due to business move to Atlanta, GA. Appointed Hollis & Mary Fowler to fill term. Floor vote of acceptance.

FALL ROUNDUP '89: Bobby Keefe to get caller for \$600 each with no expenses. He will house callers. Cost of dance \$25 per couple, full program. Suggested a report be placed in Grapevine listing Roundup expenses. Suggested an increase in cost of ads for program book. Motion to refer all suggestions to Committee for consideration.

Noted death of Mrs. Bill Camp. To send sympathy card.

President Wolfert thanked outgoing board members for their service to NEFSARDA and welcomed the new board members.

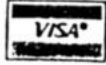

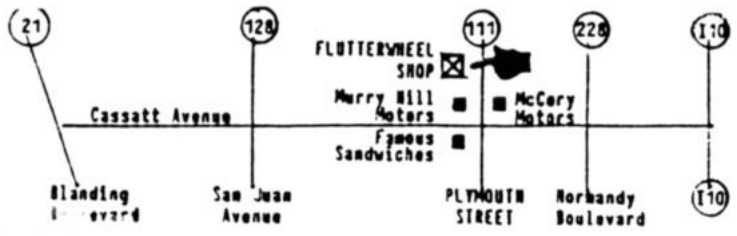

Another summer has passed with its usual seasonal blood shortage periods, and only because of the dedication of many organizations was the FL/GA Blood Alliance able to supply patients in need with the required amount of blood.

Many organizations took last minute drives to fill in for a cancellation. The Blood Alliance must draw a minimum of 150 donors a day to fill their needs in this area, cancellations leave them far short of the needed units. Therefore, you can understand how appreciative they are of groups who can spontaneously accept a blood drive. This flexibility is the ingredient that makes it possible to acquire that daily blood supply for the area hospitals they serve.

State Farm Insurance employees generously filled in for a cancellation for a second time when they were desperate. They are scheduling for the December holidays. If you would like to take advantage of the holiday spirit present in your organization and schedule a holiday blood drive, either right before Christmas, the following week, or during the first week in January, the donations would be a great holiday gift to the community.

(We included this request so all square dancers could possibly make arrangements for their workplace, churches, or other organizations to contribute -- or -- give as individuals, but, make sure you mention NEFSARDA.)

They will be giving their High School Art Contest Calendar to all December and early January donors. (While supply lasts.) These same donors are eligible for the weekly drawings (until January 15th) of \$100 gift certificates (to the store of your choice in Orange Park Mall) and the grand prize of a \$300 gift certificate (same conditions as above).

The Blood Alliance Staff is available to help you plan a drive and to give motivational talks to employees, etc. (Call 353-8262). Together we will continue to be sure that blood is available when any one of us needs it.

LETTER TO EDITOR:

REVITALIZATION OF SQUARE DANCING

For quite some time rumblings have circulated about the quandry of square dancing. The following is the concise diagnosis and cure of the problem.

For several years now we have graduated multitudes from Mainstream and Plus classes, people who do not know how to dance!

Capable dancers have tried to escape these inept squares by going to "A" and "C" levels, and now we see more and more private clubs springing up. Trouble is - people taking this route for the most part still are inept at Mainstream. Most any caller will agree that the breakdown of a square in higher levels of dance is because someone missed a Mainstream call.

For the past two years, two of the most talented callers in the nation have demonstrated this at Copecrest. While this was "Plus" week, every workshop they grilled us in Mainstream. Dancers of both years appreciated this so much that they gave the callers a standing ovation.

During the past 30 years, I have lost track of the people I angeled thru classes. During the past four years, for instance, I angeled three people thru Mainstream and two thru Plus classes. What follows is with considerable authority of experience.

Problem -- students are allowed to miss as many classes as they want. This problem frustrates the entire concept of classes. Consider the regular student trying hard to learn, when a couple of "part-time" students get into the square. The part-timers continually break down the square causing loss of interest of all.

Solution -- go back to the rules that existed 30 years ago. Beginning students should be forewarned that if they miss 3 classes during the entire year - they are out and have to start over again next year. It would be far better to graduate 20 dancers than 50 people who can't keep up!

Facilities Top-Notch at 38th National

The Myriad Convention Center, located in the heart of Downtown Oklahoma City, will serve as the "center stage" of the **38th National Square Dance Convention**.

While the Civic Center Music Hall and the Fairgrounds, as well as other smaller locations, will also be focal points for activities during the Convention, the Myriad will nevertheless host the majority of the events being planned.

This modern complex, with its arena, halls and meeting rooms all climate-controlled by computer, cordoned off by adjustable soundproofed walls, will make over 110,000 square feet of floor space available just for the purpose of dancing.

Central to the structure is the 30,000-plus square foot **Main Arena**, capable of containing 270 active squares of dancers at any given time. Additionally, onlookers may relax in the comfort of 12,000 arena seats encircling the entire area.

The **Great Hall**, with its handsome ballroom decor and 16,000 square feet of floor space, will be divided in half by electrically operated soundproof walls, and both areas will house the Round Dancing activities.

The **Exhibit Halls** consist of 100,000 square feet of space: one, with 80,000 square feet of floor space and a 25-foot ceiling, will be divided into five dance areas, plus one large area for approximately two-thirds of the exhibitors at the Convention. Two larger areas - each 25,000 square feet in size, large enough to handle over 200 squares - will be devoted to Main-stream and Plus dancing. Other areas will be dedicated to Clogging (7,400 sq. ft.), Basic (3,400 sq. ft.) and Youth Dancing (4,000 sq. ft.).

The second Exhibit Hall (20,000 square feet in area, with a 14-foot ceiling) will be totally devoted to the remaining Exhibitors.

A special area off the Main Arena has been set aside specifically for Handicapped Dancing.

As if offering a brief respite from the sometimes frantic pace of the Convention activities, Myriad Gardens lies just a short stroll from the convention complex. This beautiful botanical garden provides 17 acres of greenery, surrounding the amazing Crystal Bridge, a 224-foot cylindrical-shaped structure filled with tropical plants and constantly changing floral displays.

The Myriad Convention Center, with its restful Myriad Gardens, will be a fitting Mecca for thousands of square dancers as they converge on Oklahoma City next June.

WHO ARE WE?

From past LEGACY Surveys we know a lot about square dancers as square dancers. However, we know little about square dancers as people. So the 1988-89 LEGACY Survey will have two goals. One, to continue the flow of information about our square dance activities and our clubs. Two, to answer the question, "Who are we?"

To meet the first goal, the 1988-89 Survey will repeat many of the questions used in the previous Surveys. The consistency will allow us to continue the monitoring of trends over time.

To meet the second goal, the '88-89 Survey will include some new questions, seeking information about ourselves as people. Things such as age, occupation, family status, and lifestyle. Demographic information -- that's what marketers call it. They use it to promote products and services. We, too, can use demographic information to promote square dancing.

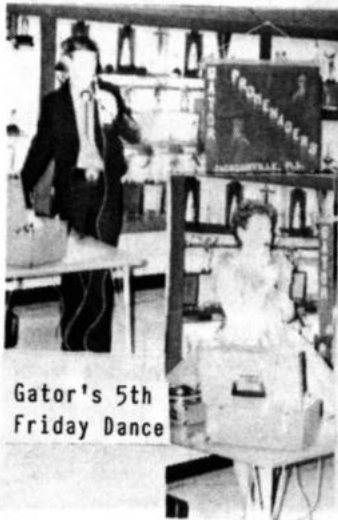

The ROUNDALAB Board of Directors has adopted the following statement:

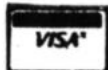
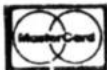
