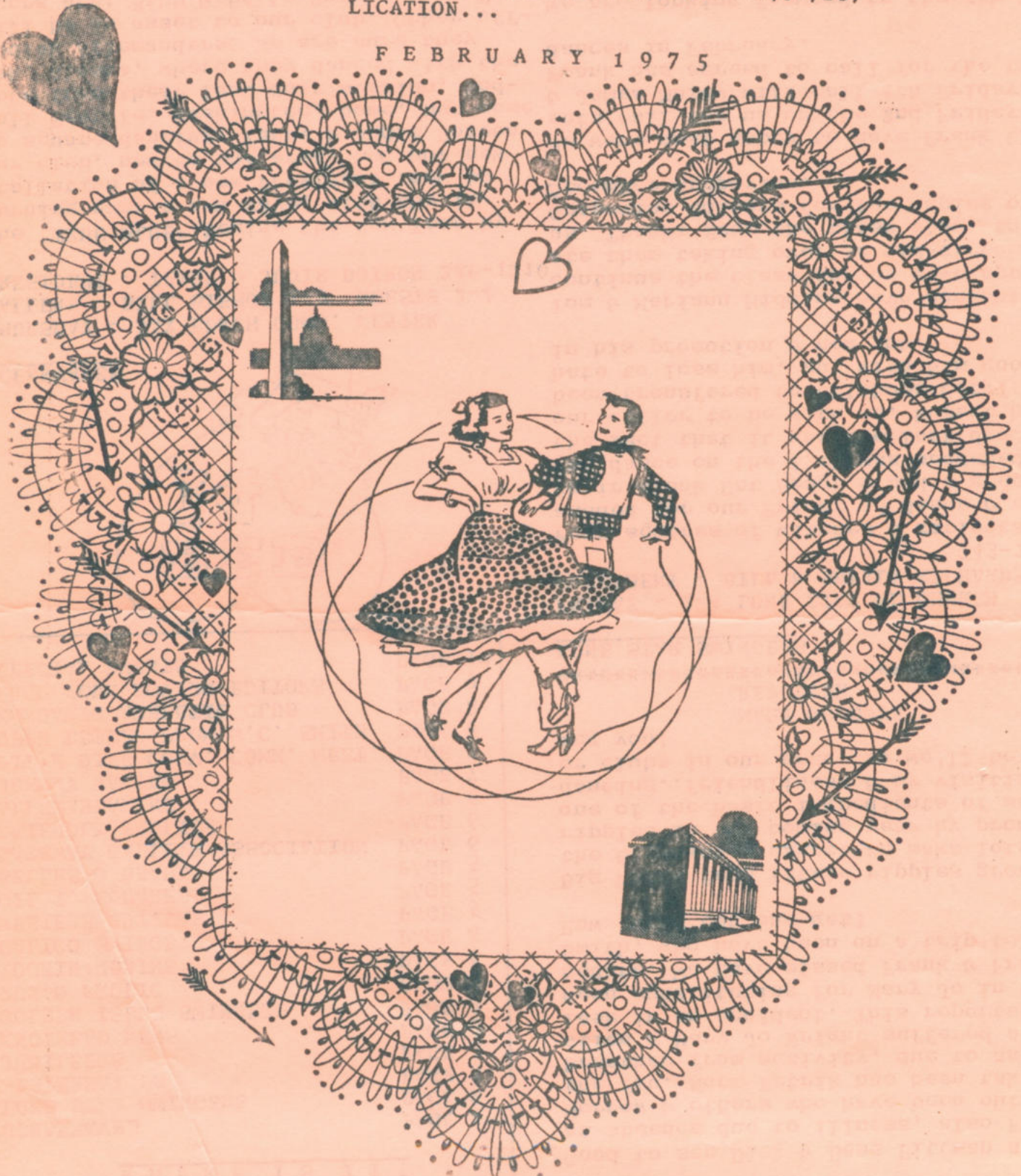

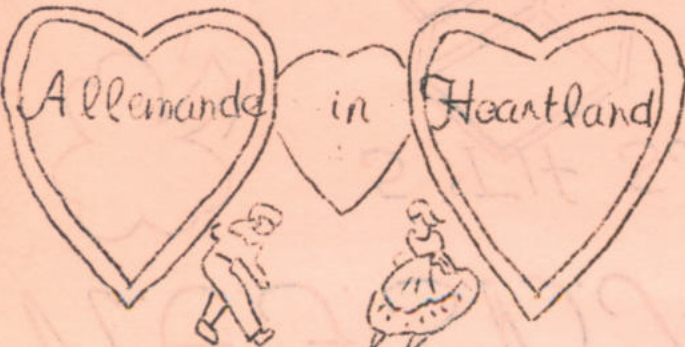

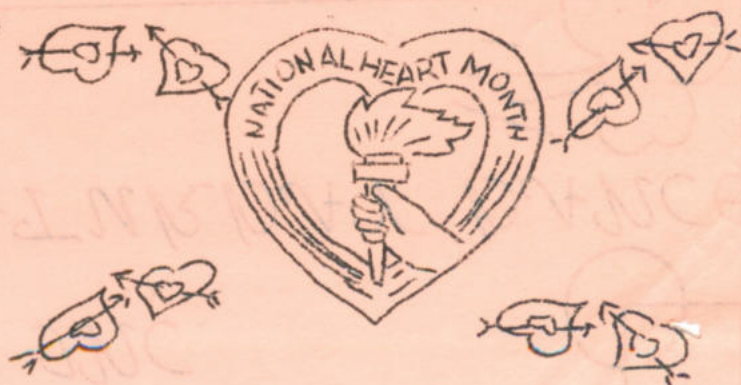

GATEWAY CALLERS ASSOCIATION

The Gateway Callers Association is embarking on several new programs, which we feel will improve our calling, & as a result, your dancing enjoyment. We would like to take a moment to tell you about some of them.

First, at our meetings, we will be critiquing each other by dancing to tapes of 2 tips, the caller himself selects. This affords the caller with the unusual (& often revealing) opportunity of dancing to himself. In addition, each person dancing will fill out a critique sheet covering timing, body flow, voice-music balance, material used & other points of calling technique.

We are also starting a teaching swap. We have a list of calls that various members have difficulty explaining & other members will share their ideas on how to teach these movements.

At each meeting we will also exchange solutions to our problem of the month, this is a choreographic problem outlined in advance, so each member can find his own solutions & bring his ideas to the meeting.

We have 2 other projects underway, I'd like to mention. First, we've started our own note service with figures contributed by our members. These notes go free to each member 6 times a year. And, finally, we have 2 clinics with Jack Lasry scheduled. The first of these is a 2 day clinic in Dec. of this year & the other is a 3 day clinic in April 1976.

Johnny was born in Waukegan, Illinois; was employed as a draftsman for the Johnson Motors the year he enrolled at Arthur Murrays School of Dance. He & Louise met while students & were married in the Spring of 1954. They moved to the Florida Keys that same year. He attended Miami Barber College & operated his own shop in Marathon until 1970.

In 1964, with the persuasion from two of his customers, Johnny & Louise attended the first Square Dance Class to be held in Marathon & became Charter Members of Key Hoppers, a square dance club dancing to records.

With a growing interest in Square Dancing, Johnny taught his first class in the Fall of 1965. With a background of teaching classes for the Marathon Power Squadron & substitute teaching at the High School, Johnny found great pleasure & gratification in the teaching of Square Dancing. The ability to convey this knowledge to others, was a deciding factor in his decision to sell the barber shop & concentrate on calling on a full time basis.

With ever growing popularity, guest dates takes him to both East & West Coast & North to Jacksonville. Tours out of state have taken him West to Nebraska, North to Illinois & Southeast to North Carolina. He teaches a class a year & runs an intermediate & advanced workshop. In addition to his numerous activities, Johnny & Louise manage The Fijian Campground at Okeechobee, Florida, where Square Dancing is very popular.

Johnny is presently President of The Florida Callers Association & will be one of the Callers for the 22nd Annual Florida State Convention to be held MAY 23, 24 & 25, 1975, in Jacksonville.
