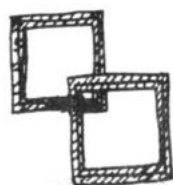

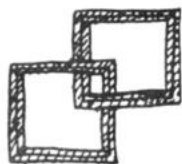

TEN COMMANDMENTS FOR ADVERTISING CHAIRMEN

1. Thou shalt use no colors save black and white.
2. Thou shalt not try to place too much information into too small a space, for it shall be too cluttered and the time spent in preparing the message shall be wasted.
3. Thou shalt not use a water soluble glue with which to affix thy maps and other parts to your copy. (It makes them blur.) Use "Magic Invisible Scotch Tape" or "craft glue" for paper.
4. Thou shalt use jet black ink only in type and drawings for clarity and good copy.
5. Thou shalt not damage thy copy by putting folds in it. Use a larger envelope.
6. Thou shalt not fail to meet the published deadlines. The recipient of your copy has deadlines he must meet also. (Call to make arrangements for late copy.)
7. Thou shalt not assume corrections/changes to your dance and workshop schedules will be picked up from your ads or club news articles. Please write to call your editors so they can keep their records accurate.
8. Thou shalt pass thy files on to the next Advertising Chairman, so he can take advantage of your experience and be as much of an asset to your club as you have been.
9. Thou shalt not fail to include thy own name, address and telephone number and the size you think the ad is and neither shalt thou omit a name, address and telephone number to whence an invoice may be sent.
10. Thou shalt always remember the quality and timely rendition of thy ad reflects on thine own club's image. A sloppy ad turns prospective guests away from your club's functions.

CALLER'S CORNER: DIDN'T YOU KNOW?

As the new president of the Gateway Caller's Association I have been asked to write something for "The Grapevine". All that comes to mind are things that bug me. Not intending to point the finger at anyone, but, if the shoe fits you should do something about it. All these things you should know, but, maybe are a little confused. If so, ask your caller.

DIDN'T YOU KNOW:

(1) SWING YOUR CORNER requires a 1½ turn. Why stop at ¾ of a turn? That's almost no swing at all.

(2) SWINGING is fun. If it isn't fun then you must not be doing it right.

(3) A TWIRL does not necessarily follow a swing. I like to save "it" for the very last thing after the last swing. It just makes the girls dizzy and it is tiring too. You try dancing her part if you don't believe it.

(4) PROMENADING HOME takes 16 beats to go all the way around, 8 beats for half way. How many does it take if the guys don't have their shoulders close together?

(5) GALS...ON A CHAIN give the guy your hand palm down. Palm up is wrong. If you trip over his feet, he can't possibly hold you up if your palm is up!

(6) GRAND SQUARE takes 32 beats. Count them 4-4-4-4, REVERSE 4-4-4-4. Why rush thru it only to have to stand and wait. Also, it is sometimes called while promenading. So you can't start it until you're at Home Position. You may even get a "GO" signal like "Sides Face, Grand Squares - GO".

(7) WEAVE THE RING takes 16 beats. Unless you "Patticake" and "Hip Bump" all the way around, then it takes about 32. Look what this does to your caller's timing. He gears his calls to your dancing. Which could make him look "lousy".

(8) THERE ARE NO "COURTESY TURNS" IN A SQUARE THRU. So why do them? This throws off timing also.

(9) 8 CHAIN THRU...either 4 or 8 hands is a "Zero" you end up with who you start it with. So look before you start so you know who to end with instead of counting.

(10) WEAVE THE RING or RIGHT and LEFT GRAND is also a "Zero". You end with who you start. Know when to end it.

(11) HEADS SQUARE THRU 4 HANDS (From Home Position). You are facing your corner, no matter what other calls you do you will come right back to home

(12) BOYS RUN... does not necessarily follow a "Swing Thru". Don't expect it. We are looking for something else to call here.

(13) A RIGHT AND LEFT THRU does not have to follow a "Spin the Top". Look for something else here too.

(14) ON A "BOX THE GNAT" you end FACE TO FACE not sideways...be aware of your positioning.

(15) DO SA DO is a hands off movement. It is usually put in there to time the music, or break up having two right hands in a row.

(16) CALIFORNIA TWIRL is not done with the person facing you. You can only do it with the person beside you.

(17) PROMENADING BACKWARDS is a no-no. If you are past home...go on around, there's time...you came to dance didn't you?

(18) TRADES... there are 6 kinds of trades and in each one you end facing the opposite hall.

(19) CURLIQUE...Gals, if this move hurts your arm or shoulder...just do a "Touch a Quarter".

(20) SCOOTBACK has no sex. Can you do it all 4 ways? Boy-Boy, Girl-Girl, Boy-Girl and Couples? Get it down pat!

CALLER'S CORNER (contd.)

(21) WALK AND DODGE...the person facing out does not turn around...only steps sideways and stays that way. The next call may not be "Partner Trade"...could be any number of calls. Let's call something else here too.

(22) SLIP THE CLUTCH...those in the middle are not supposed to Freeze Dead in their tracks...they are suppose to walk forward in a right hand star fashion to meet a designated person.

(23) GUYS...dance a tip with the Single Ladies. Give your partner a rest. Your club very likely needs this "extra" lady's support.

(24) IF YOU DANCE ONE TIP THEN REST ONE TIP you aren't getting your money's worth. Try dancing two then rest one...your strength will improve...eventually you can dance every tip. (Skip your jogging in the morning.)

(25) NO TWO CALLERS ARE ALIKE...all do things differently, expect it, better this way.

(26) More than 80% of all active square dancers are "Mainstream" dancers. You should really get to know all 68 mainstream calls well and from all positions before climbing up the ladder to "plus" level. Why load your brain with the extra 28 calls? You may get a gold star but will you still be with us in a year? The dropout rate is very high. Don't let your friends push you up the ladder too fast.

(27) WHY WOULD ANYONE WANT TO LEAVE A DANCE BEFORE IT'S OVER? You are missing the best part. Something on TV you want to see? Get a VCR! Your caller always saves the best for last. He is just getting warmed up. Also, you miss the afterparty.

(28) GET A LIST OF "MAINSTREAM" BASICS. Ask for workshops on some of the lesser used calls...like folds, cross runs, peels, tags, scootbacks, hinges, recycle, veers, dixie style, etc. These calls to often cause a breakdown of the square.

(29) YOU ARE NOW A BETTER DANCER FOR HAVING READ THIS FAR.

CAMPERS AT 36TH ENJOY EASY ACCESS TO ACTIVITIES

The Astrodome parking lot will have an area designated for campers during the 36th National Square Dance Convention immediately adjacent to all convention activities. The Camping Committee is making every effort to provide adequate and comfortable facilities but keep in mind this is not a conventional campground. All spaces are on concrete or asphalt and no

hookups are available. There will be limited shower facilities but ample restrooms and litter containers. Around the clock security will be provided and the cafeteria in the Astrohall will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., Thursday through Saturday. Water and dump stations will be on the campground.

There will be no reserved spaces so if you plan to camp together please arrive together. Monitor CB Channel 4 for information and assistance.

All campers must be registered in advance and the camp office will have your packets and badges on the site.

The camping fee of \$60.00 is for the period Noon Wednesday through Noon Saturday.

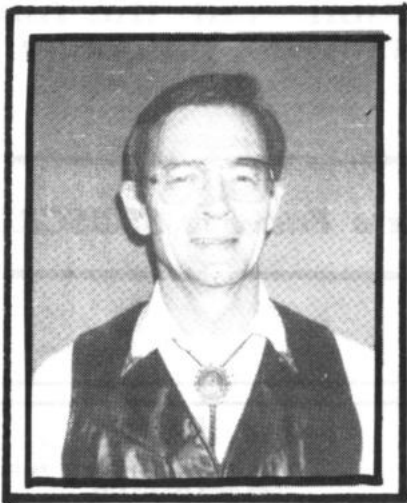

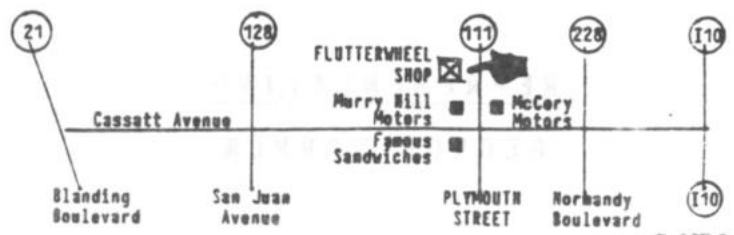

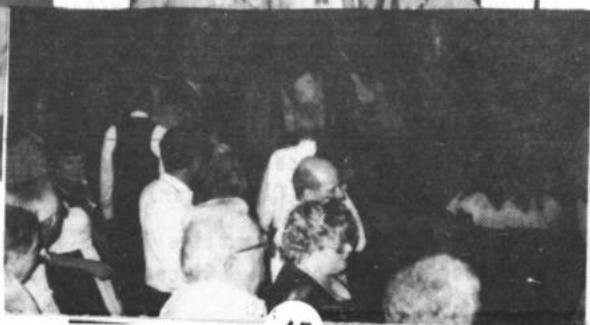

Square Dance Activity is made up of many facets of dancing. CALLERLAB recognizes this fact and encourages its members to become conversant with areas other

than just square dance calling. The callers have a responsibility to provide a pleasurable program for the dancers. Quite frequently, to provide variety, Round Dancing is included in this program.

While some square dance callers do not include rounds in their program, CALLERLAB's official position is that squares and rounds go together.

They are part of the same family tree. CALLERLAB has an active Round Dance Committee which selects a "Round of the Quarter" for suggested use by its members. It was at CALLERLAB's request that ROUNDALAB developed a manual for callers who wish to introduce rounds into their square dance program. Dual membership in CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB is not at all uncommon and many CALLERLAB members teach or participate in round dancing.

If your area does not include round dancing in its square dance program, encourage your leaders -- callers, cuers, dancers -- to develop a way of including it especially at the Basic, Mainstream and Plus dance programs. All will benefit from it. Squares and rounds, do, indeed, go together. What the proper balance may be at any particular dance should be at the pleasure of the dancers and worked out cooperatively between the caller and cuer.

25-WEEK LEARN TO DANCE PROGRAM

Red Bates, Chairman of the Special Committee established to review the Mainstream and Plus Programs to develop a 25-Week Learn to Dance Program, announced the completion of the committee's work, a monumental task involving many iterations of ideas back and forth within the USA and Canada. Results reflect the surveys and thinking of many leaders and are offered to those callers and clubs who wish to try an experimental program. It is designed for areas and clubs who have requested it, using the most popular calls from the Mainstream and Plus Programs. The listing of calls reflects the same numbering scheme used on the existing Mainstream Program and all Plus calls which are included are identified with a (*Plus*) following the call.

Calls from the Mainstream or Plus lists not included in this program should be taught

through workshops following the formal instruction period. This program is designed as a "feeder" program for Plus clubs. Individual modifications to suit local conditions are anticipated. *No* effort should be made to pressure anyone into teaching with this experimental program unless the sponsoring organization makes that decision.

Generally speaking, only standard and the more common formations and arrangements are recommended. If one tries to use all allowable formations and arrangements for each call, this program *CANNOT* be completed in 25 weeks.

We urge any callers and clubs who use this program to document their experience so that CALLERLAB can review and consider any proposed changes prior to formal adoption. If you have any questions, please communicate them, in writing, to CALLERLAB, Box 679, Pocono Pines, PA 18350.

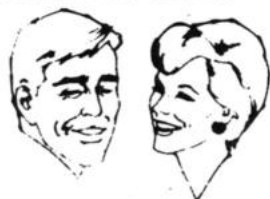

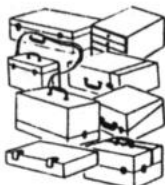

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR:

Many Jacksonville dancers and callers feel as Matt Wimpee expressed in Caller's Corner that the Jacksonville area has too many special dances. In addition, I have heard complaints that too many out of town callers are used for special dances. I disagree with both statements.

Looking only at mainstream and plus events on the Northeast calendar, there are 12 one-day dances and 4 two-day dances, 9 done with out of town callers and 7 with local callers. Many "special" dances are actually theme dances, that is, they are held on the club dance night at their usual location with their club caller, but have some element of dress, food or decoration to make the evening more enjoyable.

The main objection to special dances seems to be the belief that special dances will adversely affect the attendance at the local clubs. I believe the opposite is true. Let me compare dancing to eating a favorite food. Even if steak is my favorite food, I do not want to eat it every night. In fact, without some variety in the menu, I would soon come to hate steak and refuse to eat it. Without the variety that special dances and out of town callers bring to square dancing, a loyal club dancer may become tired of square dancing in general and drop out of dancing all together. There are obviously many reasons why people drop out of square dancing, but, the variety of a special dance can only enhance dancing pleasure and keep people dancing longer.

For a city with over 30 clubs, 16 special dances out of 52 weekends is not too many. And only 9 of these are done with out of town callers. We need to encourage all dancers to support the special dances. Through mutual cooperation every special dance in Jacksonville will be successful and well attended and the home club will still be our favorite place to dance.

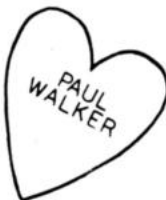

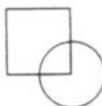

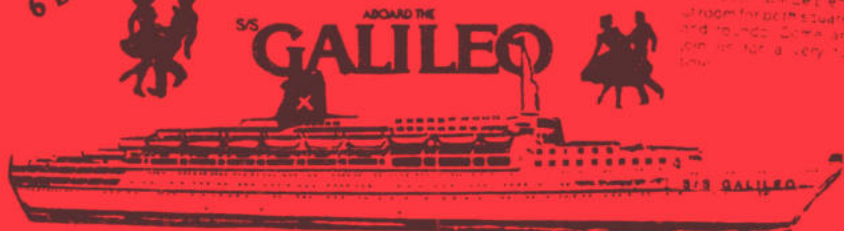
