NEFSARDA PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As most of you probably know our two Caller's Associations (Gateway and Rural) have adopted a program where new graduates should dance at mainstream level for a year before progressing to plus. We were very proud this past weekend, when Northeast and this pilot program was held up as an example to the rest of the State, at the State Federation meeting.

It was also pointed out to the Preservation of Square Dancing Committee that Northeast has the best balance of clubs in the State. All this serves to prove what we have known all along - that Northeast dancers are the GREATEST.

Two more items from Federation - The state committee is collecting seashells to be handed out at the National Convention in Oklahoma City. So, on your next walk on the beach, how about gathering some shells and bring them to the next NEFSARDA meeting (your delegate can bring them to us) and we'll see that they get to Oklahoma. The second item is Square Dancers can now apply for a Mastercard just for square dancers. (And of course round dancers.) It is a silver card with the symbol of United Square Dancers of America embossed on it. The benefits are that for each card issued \$9. will be returned to USDA and of this amount \$3. will be returned to the state association. State has voted to return this \$3. to the local associations so we will benefit directly. If you are interested, contact us and we'll get an application off to you promptly.

We were recently asked why Association Dances are always called to the floor rather than being plus dances. In our Directory of Clubs, there are 34 clubs listed. Twenty-one of these are mainstream; 10 plus, 2 advance and 1 challenge. With these numbers in mind, it is the opinion of the Board of Officers, that a dance called to the floor enables the most dancers to participate. After all, those of us who are plus and 'A' dancers CAN dance at lower levels, whereas, the newer or lower level dancers (who comprise the majority) would be unable to dance at the higher levels.

MINUTES OF NEFSARDA MEETING, January 8, 1989

Roll call was taken and a quorum was established.

MINUTES: Were distributed to the delegates and approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Due to absence of treasurer, Mary Downing, there was no report. The president regrettably reported that Mary Downing had been viciously attacked and robbed in her S/D shop on Thurs, Jan 5, 1989. Mary is recovering from her injuries, but, was unable to attend this meeting.

FIFTH SATURDAY DANCE: The next dance will be held on April 29, 1989 at Sandalwood Jr/Sr High School.

SOPHOMORE HOEDOWN/GRADUATION DANCE: Lawton Smith announced that the Gateway Caller's Assoc. will sponsor the Sophomore Hoedown which will be held on Feb 11, 1989 and the Graduation Ball which will be held on Apr. 15, 1989. Both of these dances will be held at the Ramona Pavilion and will include announced "plus".

ADS-FALL ROUND UP: The president announced that quite a few ads, which appeared in the Fall Round Up Program Book, have not been paid. He requested that a concerted effort be made to collect the monies due from these ads. (Since this meeting The Grapevine has offered (and has been assigned) to collect AD monies.)

THE GRAPEVINE: Shad Shadwell reported that the back page (Special Dance Schedule) of the Grapevine will spotlight Special (or Theme) Dances. Each club that purchases an ad for their special (or Theme) dance will automatically be listed on back page. (Special Dance Schedule). The date, theme and club will be listed.

INSURANCE: Harvey Shriver reported that, as of this date, six clubs do not have insurance coverage. All clubs dancing in schools are required by the Duval County School Board to be chartered and have proof of insurance.

STATE CONVENTION: In promotion of the 36th FL S/R Dance Conv, Erma & Aaron Fry have attended the GA State Conv; the Funfest in Lakeland; and FL Caller's meeting. At West Coast Dance they sold 59 ribbons. Ticket sales have been slow in NEFSARDA area. Only 13 sold at Fall Round Up. Ticket price is \$12.00 per person. If purchased at door, tickets will be \$14.00 per person. ** Camping facilities will be available at Central FL Fair Grounds. There will be a shuttle bus to Expo Center. ** There are 60 rooms reserved at the Omni Hotel for NEFSARDA. ** Erma reported that their activities had to be curtailed this past month, unfortunately, to the illness and subsequent death of her Mother.

NEW BUSINESS: Discussion was held concerning the rules for banner stealing. It was determined that there are no rules ONLY guidelines for banner stealing. Each club should establish their own guidelines and let other clubs know what their guidelines are.

BYLAWS: The president reported that a section relating to insurance for Square and Round dancers needs to be included in the NEFSARDA Bylaws. The Bylaws Committee will look into this issue and bring a recommendation to the delegates for their consideration.

NATIONAL S/D CONVENTION: A miniature replica of a Covered Wagon was on display at the meeting promoting the 38 Natl S/D Conv. to be held in Oklahoma City, OK on June 22-24, 1989. ** Erma & Aaron Fry announced they are trying to organize a calvacade from Jax to Natl Conv. It will take approximately three days of traveling time by car to reach Oklahoma City. Fifty rooms have been reserved for the Northeast FL square dancers.

ADJOURNMENT: Club announcements were made. Meeting adjourned at 2:50.

CAMPING AT 1989 FLORIDA SQUARE & ROUND DANCE CONVENTION

For everyone who will be camping at the convention, here is the information you wanted:

Camping facilities will be provided at the Central Florida Fairgrounds at 4603 W. COLONIAL DRIVE which is close to the Expo Centre. Campers will use the south service gate to enter camping area.

Electricity, water and dump station are available. An extra "Y", water hose and extension cord may be needed in some cases. Sites are not designated or numbered, so if you want to be with a group, we suggest one couple come early and plan the parking for their group.

A shuttle bus will run to and from the Expo Centre ONLY. Cost of the bus for the entire weekend is \$10.00 per person. Camping fees are \$9.00 a day per R.V. unit.

The south service gate will be for the use of campers only. A quiet hours ordinance is in effect after 11:00p.m. Security will be provided for the evening hours and the gate will be locked at midnight. Anyone staying out later should let us know so we can unlock the gate for them.

Reservations are requested so that we will know how many will be camping and how many will be using the shuttle bus, so that we can provide adequate service. SEND NO MONEY. Fees will be collected when you arrive.

Florida Georgia Blood Alliance

Donor Clubs

Several people have asked if they may receive their own blood or that of specific friends: The answer is YES, but, it must be prearranged with and by your doctor. There is a fee upfront for this special service.

We receive a report from the Alliance on a quarterly basis with a list of square dance donors. When received this report will be published.

BLOOD DONORS URGENTLY NEEDED

The Jacksonville blood bank needs volunteer donors to help replenish its blood supply which has dropped to its lowest level in five years.

The Florida-Georgia Blood Alliance maintains regular hours at its donor center to help people who want to give blood. You are urged to attend blood drives conducted from mobile units which are listed daily in the Florida Times Union newspaper.

At present it is too low to take care of local hospital needs. Replenishing it could mean the difference between life and death for a patient needing large amounts of blood.

This shortage is due in part to the time of year. Blood donations usually drop during January which is also a time of greatest need.

Donations at local centers have been running as low as half the amount the bank wants to meet the community's needs.

Centers to donate blood are: 8013 Beach Blvd., 4912 Blanding Blvd., 536 W 10th St., Baptist Medical Center, Ponte Vedra Beach, and Orange Park at 2153 Kingsley Ave. Some are open on Saturday.

Giving blood is a safe and simple procedure. Its importance to a patient needing a blood transfusion is beyond estimation. Remember, the life you save could be family, friend or self.

FLORIDA FEDERATION OF SQUARE DANCERS
Banner Stealing Guidelines

PURPOSE: The object of banner stealing is to promote friendly visits between clubs. Do not over-patronize a select few but spread your club around. If you are going to be a banner bandit, be a good one, abiding by the guidelines. In applying these guidelines, use good judgment at all times.

1. A banner may be stolen or retrieved by a minimum of one full square, displaying club badges of the club they are representing and by paying guest admission.

2. A club cannot steal a banner or retrieve its banner when their club caller is a guest caller of the club they are visiting, nor can a caller or his partner participate as part of the banner stealing/retrieving party.

3. Recommend that not more than 3 traveling banners be available. Banners cannot be reserved. However, as a courtesy to the host club, it is highly recommended that a stealing club contact the intended host club prior to going to steal a banner. This will preclude disappointment of no banner being available. IOU's or "substitute" articles are not recommended as being permissible in lieu of the banner.

* (??) Most clubs in NEFSARDA like to make substitutions if a banner is not available.

QUESTION #1: Would you like to continue this practice? or 3 banners only?

QUESTION #2: Do we really need to call in advance? With the above stipulation wouldn't it be fun for 3 clubs to show up at the same time and have a really fun evening? How can you "steal" a banner if the "thief" has to invite himself to your dance? If shortage of food is a problem, bring some with you.??)

4. Banners should be available to any open dance on the host club's regular dance night and location unless advertised as a special dance.

* (??) This seems to cause a lot of disagreements. First, let's define SPECIAL DANCE. The GV sees a SPECIAL DANCE as: (a) one that occurs on a different night or nights, (b) has Out-Of-Town caller and some (c) Benefit Dances. i.e. O'Leno Hoedown, Blue-Grey Dance, President's Ball, Beach Bash, Xmas in July, etc. The GV sees a THEME DANCE as one put on by a club ON CLUB NIGHT, but, has a special theme. i.e. Halloween, Xmas, Valentine, Dangle Dance, Coke & Pizza Night, etc. Primary purpose is to have a fun night and to encourage dancers to visit. An exception would be a BENEFIT DANCE on Club Night.

QUESTION #3: With dances defined as above, would you be willing to give your banner at THEME DANCES??)

5. Recommend that travel be limited to a maximum of 100 miles round trip unless mutual agreement is made with intended host club.

6. A banner raiding party, regardless of size, should not retrieve and steal banners at the same dance.

7. The first FULL banner stealing party to sign the host club's guest register should be awarded the traveling banner. It is recommended that not more than one banner be "stolen" per dance.

8. Banners should not be stolen from clubs whose dances are scheduled for the same night as the club dance of the stealing club.

9. A club should not steal a banner from another club more often than once every 90 days. It is discourteous for a banner to remain in limbo more than 90 days.

10. The banner stealing party should dance for at least three full square dance tips to be eligible to steal the banner.

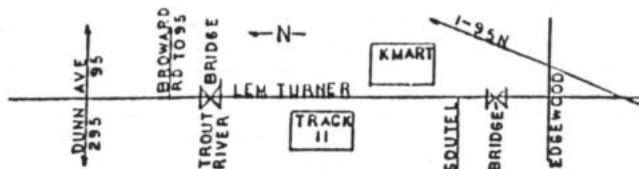

We want to extend the opportunity for you to come dance with us at any of our clubs. We only charge \$1.50 per person and I can't think of a better value anywhere. Please remember that we allow the lady to dance the man's position at all of our clubs, so, you don't have to worry about not having a partner.

We hope to see you in our squares soon and hope that until then you stay happy and keep dancing.

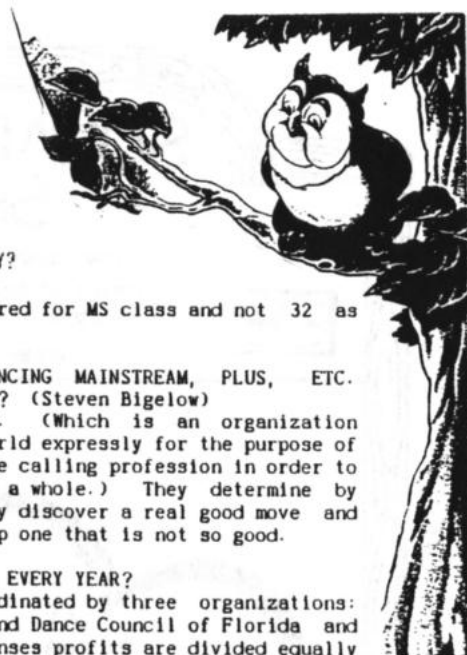

GV RETRACTION: Forty-two weeks are required for MS class and not 32 as stated in last issue of Grapevine.

HOW ARE DEGREES OF DIFFICULTY OF DANCING MAINSTREAM, PLUS, ETC. DETERMINED AND WHEN WERE THEY IMPLEMENTED? (Steven Bigelow)

They are determined by Callerlab. (Which is an organization comprised of callers from all over the world expressly for the purpose of providing leadership and direction for the calling profession in order to strengthen the square dancing movement as a whole.) They determine by experimental calls (Quarterlies). If they discover a real good move and easy flowing they add to the list and drop one that is not so good.

DO WE RECEIVE MONEY FROM STATE CONVENTION EVERY YEAR?

The Florida State Convention is coordinated by three organizations: Florida Federation of Square Dancers, Round Dance Council of Florida and Florida Caller's Association. After expenses profits are divided equally between these three associations and the Regional Dance Association that put on the dance for that year. There are five associations so, therefore, every fifth year Northeast shares in the work and profits.

WHEN WAS THE CHALLENGERS SQUARE DANCE CLUB FORMED AND WHY?

About 1963 Jake Smith, along with 20 couples, wanted to dance to a variety of out-of-town callers on a regular basis so they formed The Challengers. Their first dances were held in a barn (that's right, a barn) in Marietta, FL. It wasn't all that great when started, no heat or air conditioning in that barn. Dues were \$10 and you had to belong to another club in order to be a Challenger member. Today there is a limit of 70 couples and dues are \$25 per quarter.

LET'S LEVEL WITH EACH OTHER

I recently received a letter from a dancer stating, "Callerlab has killed square dancing with the lists and levels." (i.e., Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, etc.) I disagree for the following reason.....

About 15 years ago the average dancer stayed in the activity for two and a half to three and a half years. I worked very hard to find out why such a short time. I think I found the answer.

Most square dance clubs at that time had a new class each year, sometimes more than one per year. The new dancers were very enthusiastic because they learned new things each week in class. After graduation, these new dancers were in the club and their dancing improved each week. The next year they were still enthusiastic because they brought their friends to class and they enjoyed helping them.

As each class graduated and entered the club, the club level of dance had to revert to the newly graduated dancer's capability. After two years of this, our friend did not become bored with square dancing, but with the situation of not being able to progress with the learning process he enjoyed so much. He dropped out.

This phenomenon is what brought about the need for higher levels, i.e., Plus I, Plus II, Advanced and so on. These allowed John Q. Dancer to continue the learning process he enjoyed so much. Therefore, the different levels were good since they kept many dancers involved for several years longer than they would have been without the higher

levels. I do believe that it was this "dancer demand" that created these higher levels. The last estimate I heard was that the average dancer had been in the activity eight and a half to nine and a half years.

I'm sure we all recognize there are two major drawbacks to the program described above: (1) our new dancers and the more experienced dancers are separated and; (2) this creates an attitude of superiority and inferiority. Thus, it would appear that many dancers and callers who participate in the upper levels of dance seem to have lost their desire to bring new dancers into the activity.

I have heard several people say, "Do away with the lists and levels." I think we would be doing a tremendous disservice to those who have danced for so many years and enjoy those levels.

I suggest that all dancers and callers take a long, open-minded look at the square dance situation. I think you will realize that we have to have classes and new people each year. Let's all return to the social events our clubs used to do, and not worry so much about levels and what list my friend is dancing. Just go out and have a great time.

If you look at the clubs that have classes, a party once a month, happy dancers helping the class and recruiting, you will see a happy group of dancers.

The clubs that do nothing but sit back and complain are losing in numbers and the quality of their fun.

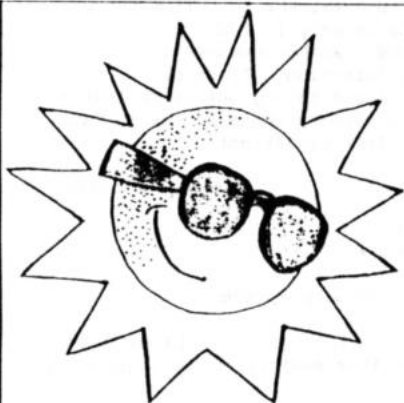

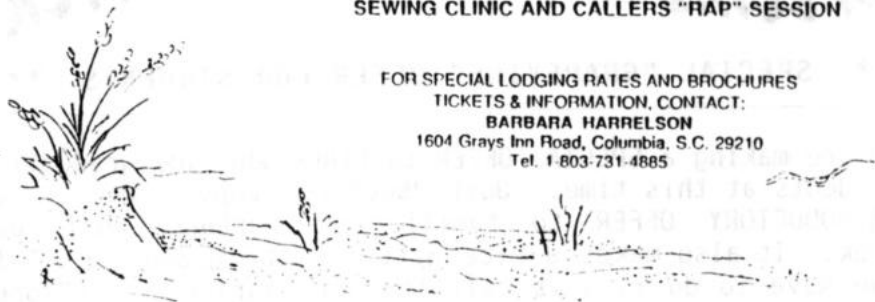

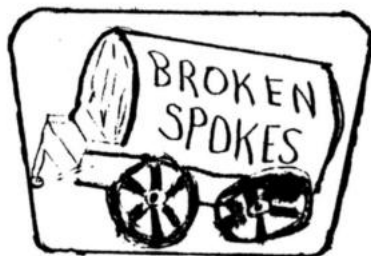
