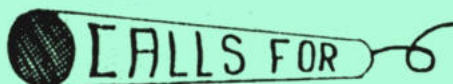

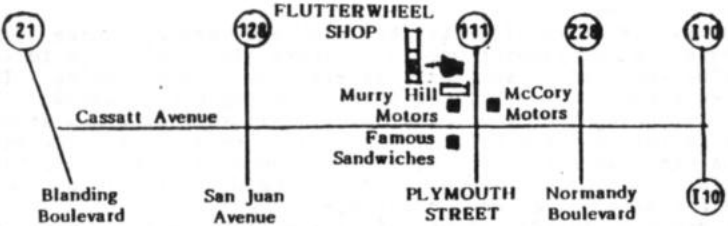

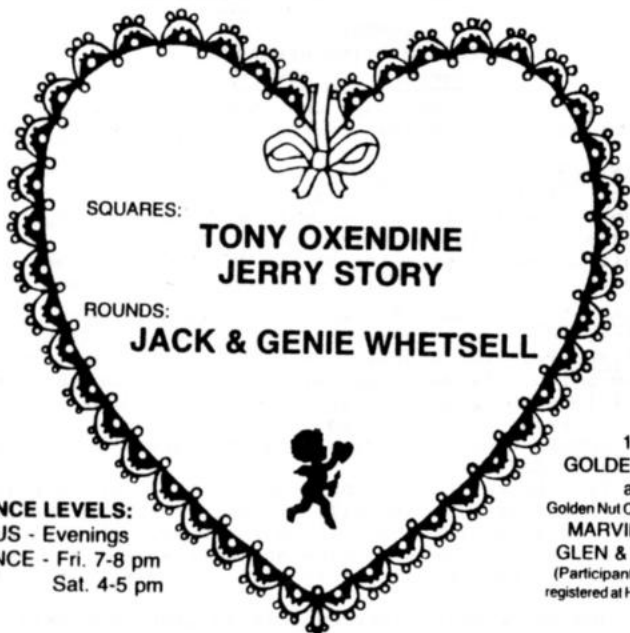

SUMMARY OF GENERAL MEETING-NEFSARDA January 13, 1991

Roll was taken, sixteen clubs were present for a quorum. Minutes were accepted and the Treasurer's report was placed on file.

PRESIDENT HOLLIS set his goals as:

1. Involving more outside area clubs.
2. Examine possibility of becoming a membership organization instead of a club organization.
3. Continue banner stealing at the 5th Saturday Dances.
4. Continue successful Fall Festival and Blood Bank Dances.

5TH SATURDAY DANCES: Chuck & Aleen Breedlove will serve as Chairpersons. Next dance is March 30 at Sandalwood High School.

FALL FESTIVAL: Reported a profit for 1990. Bonnye Bell announced that Lawton Smith will serve as Caller Co-ordinator and John Saunders will be the guest caller. An idea for clubs to exchange club logo stick-ons was suggested.

BLOOD BANK DANCE: Chmn Steve Bigelow stated that blood donations are urgently needed.

GRAPEVINE: Paul Walker stated there was a 43.1% increase in subscriptions during 1990 and will evaluate costs to see if an increase for subscriptions will be necessary. The Grapevine will implement the Northeast policy on membership with the Feb-Mar issue. A new club directory will be coming out in the April-May issue.

INSURANCE: Joe Hardcastle reported only 10 clubs are paid up for insurance covering 648 members. Checking account to be closed and funds to be given to NEFSARDA.

GATEWAY CALLERS ASSOCIATION: Pres. Jerry Reed reported that the winner of the student recruitment will be announced at the Sophomore dance on February 9 at Sandalwood High School.

STATE FEDERATION: Bonnye Bell discussed the possibility of the 1997 National convention being held in Orlando. Shirley Nihart, President of the State Federation, emphasized the necessity of local support and workers. All Florida dancers should sit together at the National convention in Utah during the Bid process.

OLD BUSINESS: Freda Seebacher asked for club rosters now and again after the classes graduates.

NEW BUSINESS: A Motion was made and carried to give 50 pints of blood from the NEFSARDA account to Desert Shield.

Don Bell introduced a proposal for a "FUN WORKING WEEKEND" to be held at a later date. (More on this later).

President Hollis requested delegates to consider nominees for the Dance Couple of the year award.

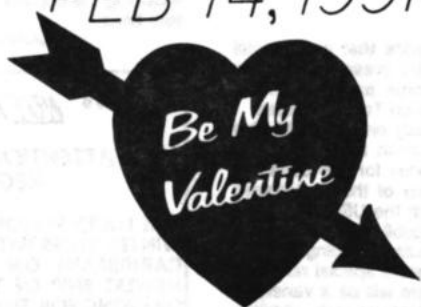

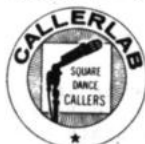

The Grapevine (GV) is the official publication of the Northeast Florida Square and Round Dancer's Association (NEFSARDA). The GV is owned by the NEFSARDA and is published under contract by Paul and Nita Walker, Editors.

Dancers in the northeast area subscribe to the GV at \$6.45 (includes tax) for 6 issues per year and is distributed by the U.S. Mail on the 1st of December, February, April, June, August, and October. We are pleased to report a 43.1% (264 to 378) increase in subscriber members. The Rollaways Square Dance Club and the Gateway Caller's Association provide the GV to members as a benefit of their dues.

There has been no increase in the subscription fee or advertising rates since 1983. We do know that postal rates will increase around 33% in 1991 and of course printing costs continue to rise. During the first quarter of 1991 we will true up the financials of the GV to determine if any increases are necessary. As stated in the contract between the Editors and the NEFSARDA delegate approval is required for any increase in the subscription fee.

Some additional facts concerning publishing the GV are as follows:

- . Pictures cost around \$30 per issue.
- . Average cost per page was \$14.86
- . Average cost per book was \$1.76
- . Complimentary copies provided each issue is 8
 - State Federation President
 - Florida State Callers President
 - Various publications
- . Sales Tax of \$124.70 was paid in 1990
- . Miles driven on behalf of the GV was 1,708

We continue to provide free advertising for benefit dances in the Northeast Area and for official NEFSARDA functions. Our purpose is to promote square and round dancing and to support the State and National Conventions.

Any suggestion to improve this publication will always be welcome.

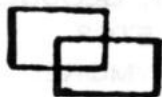

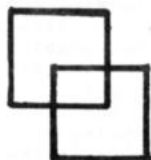
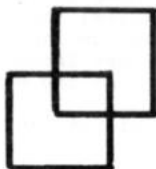

STANDARDIZATION OF CLASSIC DANCE CUES

In response to requests from dancers, Glenn Records and its own membership ROUNDALAB, last June at its annual Convention, created a new committee, Standardization of Classic Dance Cues. Its purpose is to try and arrive at some standard cues for the classic round dances that traveling dancers will encounter no matter where they are dancing.

Over two dozen leaders volunteered to assist the committee which is chaired by Phil & Royna Thomas of Plant City, FL. Other Round Dance Leaders from all over the world, as well as the original choreographer, were also contacted during the summer and fall and asked to submit their cueing words for dances on ROUNDALAB Golden Classic Listing.

All of their replies were then compared and compilations prepared using ROUNDALAB approved standardized cues wherever possible.
