(Editors Note:) Our own Chet Vetter of the Gainesville HHL CLUB is now president of the Florida Federation of Square Dancers. We think this is an appropriate article to print at this time and we will be printing other news from time to time about the Federation.

Your club, association and federation working together help promote Square Dancing.

The clubs or dancers in a given area, meeting together can disseminate more information, form the backing needed for a newsletter and increase the enjoyment of dancing by organizing a larger dance that could be promoted by an individual club. The same is true when we expand state wide and the area groups form a federation.

The Florida square dancers with the exception of the panhandle, use this format as a foundation for area associations and the Florida Federation. Those in the panhandle being closer to Georgia and Alabama meet with them.

We have four Associations in our Federation. The Northeast, Jacksonville area; Southeast, Miami area; Central, Orlando area; and the West Coast covering the Tampa area. The Northeast is by club membership but all the others are by individual dancers. The Central is the only one not having a newsletter, using Bow & Swing for their information source. All have Association dances with the Northeast having a yearly affair, Fall Round-Up.

Representation within the Associations vary but that to the Federation is all the same, The Association President with three other delegates appointed by him. The Federation has the financial responsibility for the State Convention with the organizational function left fully to the Associations.

Without these groups banded together it would be very difficult to put on our large successful functions such as the Fall Round-Up, State Convention and even the Knothead. Just as important among these groups is the Round Dance Council and the Florida Callers Association. Bow & Swing published by the Callers is the State wide Square Dance publication.

The club, association, federation, area newsletters and the state wide publication are all very much a part of the Square Dance picture and deserve your support.

The largest auditorium in the midwest, it is completely air conditioned for dancing comfort, with three large square dance halls, a teen square dance hall, caller's hospitality room, panel rooms, dressing rooms for exhibition groups, and parking facilities for 2,000 cars. Round dancing will be at the Val-Air Ballroom, a beautiful, large, air-conditioned ballroom with a wood floor.

Loren and Florence Long, general chairman, have appointed committees which have been working for several months already to provide one of the greatest National Conventions ever held.

Des Moines has 4,000 hotel and motel rooms plus 3,000 camping spaces, with other spots available within a short driving time. If the crowd overflows, there are still rooms available at Drake University and Grand View College. Registrations should be sent NOW to Advance Registration Director, P.O. Box 2624, S. W. 9th Street Branch, Des Moines, Iowa 50315. One Iowa club, the Dudes and Dames, have registered 100% for the 1972 convention, and there are reports of others close to this goal. Over 1200 square dancers were registered at New Orleans, including one reservation from Saudi Arabia, and if this enthusiasm grows, the old attendance record of 20,000 may fall at Des Moines.

One of the features of the coming convention will be an Education/Recreational Seminar on Saturday morning that will acquaint leaders in every field with the recreational possibilities of square dancing. This seminar will be conducted by leaders in square dancing who will demonstrate how to get this low-cost recreational activity started in community, club, business, or school, and emphasize the desirability of using square dancing in every educational and recreational program. Some of the facets of square dancing to be pointed out are: It is one of the few non-commercialized forms of recreational activity which can be enjoyed by husband and wife (in fact, the family) at the same time, and at a cost well within the smallest budget. It is an activity that promotes fitness, family togetherness and mental health. It is a wholesome activity that is really fun, and can be continued through the years.
