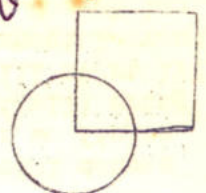

RHYTHMAIRES extend their deepest sympathy to Vic and Helen Fake on the recent loss of Vic's mother after a short illness.

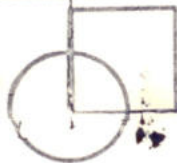

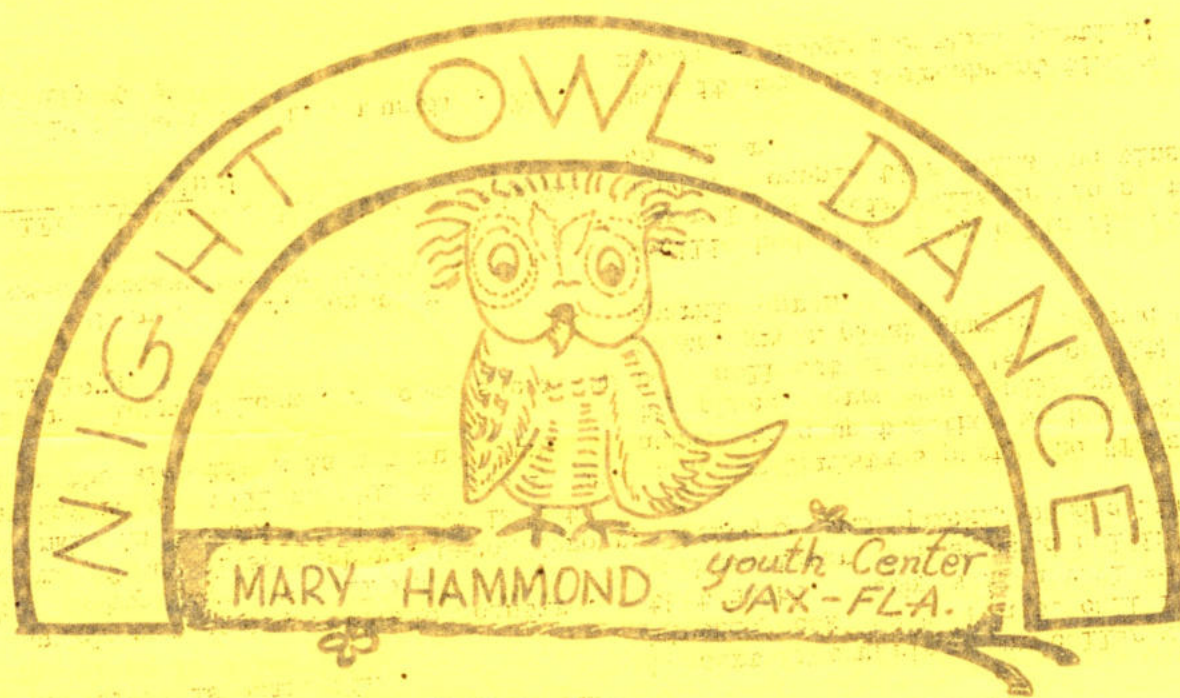
