FROM THE EDITORS DESKS

When is a Delegate not a Delegate?
You can probably get several different opinions on that question. I would like to give you my opinion.



A delegate, whether to a social or to a professional organization, has an inherent responsibility to be the best delegate he/she can be. If you are interested enough to take the job, do so with everything you have.

Every organization has rules that it is governed by. Learn those rules to the best of your ability. Read all you can and ask questions if there is something you don't understand. Rules are there for a purpose. They should apply equally to **everyone**, not a select few. Never hesitate to question something you feel might be incorrect. Remember the old saying "ask a question and appear the fool for the moment - remain silent and be a fool for the rest of your life". If you don't know and don't ask, you will never know.

Our Association has its own Bylaws. They are currently patterned along the same line as those of the Florida Federation Of Square Dancers. Have you read them? Every delegate has a copy of the Bylaws in the Delegates Book passed to you either from the Association or the delegate whose place you took for your club. Please read them.

Did you know that **all** actions of the executive Board is subject to review by the Board of delegates - that's YOU - at the next regular meeting? Little things

lying in the back of the books can be surprising. Did you know the Executive Board members have no vote at a delegates meeting? Only DELEGATES or DELEGATES AT LARGE have a vote. That puts it squarely in YOUR hands.

It takes time to learn everything, but it only takes one step at a time to get where you want to go.

My philosophy is, when joining a group, get to know the rules first. If I feel I can't live with them, I don't join. If I feel I can abide by them, I expect to follow the rules and feel other members should also. Bad rules can be changed, but so can good ones. Be wary!

My main thought here is get to know the Bylaws we are governed by. If something is wrong, or appears wrong, ASK.

As a delegate, you are charged with a responsibility to help govern the Association. Report back to your club as to what is going on. Get their input so you can report their concerns to the Association. If help is needed, the Association is there. It can't run your club for you but there are enough people that have been around that can HELP you help yourselves.

It takes everyone being vigilant to keep this thing called the Association running for the betterment of **all** of its members. WE NEED YOU!!

"ROLLAWAYS MASCOT--WORLD TRAVELER"

In June, 1994, Marsu, a Disney character, adopted by the Rollaways as their mascot, started traveling to various square dance clubs acting as an Ambassador promoting

fun and friendship between all clubs. For two years, Marsu logged in about 18,000 miles going to 42 clubs in thirteen states and Canada before returning home for Christmas in December, 1996. Marsu attended two Square and Dance Festivals and the Canadian National Convention. Afterwards he made trips to Oklahoma and Texas in 1997 and 1998.

In June, 1999 he went to the National Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana and left there with a young 10 year old girl square dancer, Amanda West, from Chattanooga, Tennessee. From there he traveled to Ohio, West Virginia, Michigan and Indiana. Pat Bryant, a round dance cuer, received Marsu at a dance in Michigan and she took him home to her parents in Indiana. In Indiana he visited with Clarence and Marilyn Eifling who have a camper and they invited him to travel with them on a trip through some western states.

Marsu traveled through eight western states before arriving in the state of Washington.

From Washington he traveled to Penticton, British Columbia for the 47th Annual Penticton Jamboree. He was prepared to travel to Auckland, New Zealand, but was not able to pass through customs, so he stayed in Penticton with Shirley Major until August, 2001. Shirley passed him to Jim Baxter of Winnipeg Manitoba, Canada.



Hopefully, Marsu will be able to leave Canada before cold weather because he is really a warm weather person. However, rumor has it that Marsu will attend the National Convention this year in St. Paul, Minnesota. It sure would be nice if many Rollaways and fellow Jacksonville dancers were there to greet him!

announced...**

The press release from CALLERLAB for November 2001 includes the following: As a result of the biennial review, the calls TRIPLE SCOOT and GRAND FOLLOW YOUR NEIGHBOR are added to the Advanced Program. There were no calls removed from the Advanced Program. The definitions for the calls remain the same.

FOCUS GROUP SURVEYS **(A VIDEO TAPE OF THE REPORT)**

The Foundation for the Preservation and Promotion of Square Dancing conducted a series of Focus Group Surveys in three cities last year. These Focus Groups consisted of non-dancers and former dancers in Charlotte, NC; St Louis, MO; and Portland, OR. The extensive research work was conducted as part of Phase One of the Foundation's *Phoenix Plan*. This work will provide helpful information to dance leadership for developing effective marketing programs to revitalize square, round and traditional dance activities on a global basis.

One of the goals of the *Phoenix Plan* is to get information about the marketing research and other efforts into the hands of every square dancer. Toward this end, The Foundation has produced a video tape featuring the information gathered during the nine Focus Group Surveys. This video is approximately one hour long and provides the following information: 1) Basic information about the process of Focus Group Surveys and 2) Video clips of actual Focus Groups to emphasize the data reported in the final report from Star Works.

It is hoped that all organizations will encourage square dancers, clubs and associations to order a copy of the

video for local use. The information in this video is very informative and is designed to provide information about the market research which has been conducted.

We ask for a nominal donation with each video we send. The cost of production, handling and shipping is approximately \$8.00 in the United States. Donations to help cover these costs will be greatly appreciated. Our goal is to get this information to every square dancer.

A brief summary of some of the 'findings' from Focus Group studies is included with each video. A more detailed report of these results, as well as a list of their specific goals and objectives is available to assist any local, regional, national or international dance group interested in working with the Foundation to improve their dance programs. These organizations are encouraged to participate in on-going research projects designed to gather data for different geographic areas and individual dance forms.

WHAT'S COOKING?

By Val Newsome

The recipes for this issue of The Grapevine were all submitted by **Betty Smith**. She is a very good cook and we know you will enjoy trying the Chicken Tetrazzini, and the Savory Italian Rounds. She also submitted a recipe for a Nappa Cabbage Salad and it will appear in the March-April issue.



CHICKEN TETRAZZINI

2 Lbs boneless, skinless chicken breasts	1 cup half & half
2 medium onions, chopped, divided use	1 cup stock
1 bay leaf	1/4 cup white wine
1 cup celery tops	2 Tablespoons all purpose flour
salt & papper to taste	2 tablespoons butter, softened
1/2 cup butter	1 8 ounce package thin spaghetti
1/4 lb mushrooms, sliced	1/4 cup black olives, sliced
1/4 cup parsley, minced	1 cup grated Cheddar cheese
1/2 cup celery, minced	3/4 cup Parmesan cheese

In large kettle, boil chicken until tender with 1 onion, bay leaf, and celery tops. Remove from heat. Cool, strain stock and reserve, discard onion, celery tops and bay leaf. Salt and pepper to taste. Cut cooled chicken into medium size pieces and set aside.

In large skillet, use 1/2 cup butter to saute the mushrooms, parsley, celery and remaining chopped onion until soft. Add the half & half, and 1 cup of the reserved stock and wine. Season to taste with salt and pepper and cook slowly over low heat until heated thoroughly. Make a paste of flour and the 2 tablespoons butter. Blend into the sauce and simmer until smooth and thickened.

Cook spaghetti in remaining stock, adding water if needed. Drain and toss with chicken, vegetables, sauce, olives and Cheddar cheese. Put in a buttered 9x13 inch baking dish and sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Bake for 20 minutes or until heated through in a preheated oven at 350 degrees. Yield: 8 servings

SAVORY ITALIAN ROUNDS

2/3 cup grated Parmesan cheese	1/8 teaspoon garlic salt
1/2 cup mayonnaise*	1/8 teaspoon dried oregano
1/4 teaspoon dried basil	Dash onion salt
1/8 teaspoon garlic powder	1 tube (12 ounces) refrigerated buttermilk biscuits

In a small bowl, combine the first seven ingredients. Separate biscuits and place on two ungreased baking sheets. Let stand for 5 minutes. Flatten biscuits into 4 inch circles. Spread about 1 tablespoon mayonnaise mixture over each circle to within 1/2 inch of edge. Bake at 400 degrees for 10-13 minutes or until golden brown. Serve immediately. Yield: 10 servings. *Light or fat-free mayonnaise may NOT be substituted for regular mayonnaise.

In addition to the Nappa Cabbage Salad recipe we received from **Betty Smith**, the March-April issue will also highlight a recipe sent in by **Doris Raines** -- Baked Beef Stew.

Is Your Attitude Helping or Hindering Your Club

Is your attitude helping or hindering your club? We all have a personality and an attitude. Now our personality stays pretty much the same all the time, we are basically who and what we are twenty four seven. However, our attitude can change like the wind, from day to day and from situation to situation. A square dance club takes on the collective personality and attitude of it's members. We have all visited clubs that were happy, fun loving and joyful people with a good attitude. When visitors arrive they are greeted warmly and made to feel welcome. The members get out on the floor and dance every tip, they have a great time and foster goodwill and a friendly atmosphere at the dance. Guests are always invited to go to the refreshment table first and are never made to feel unwanted. When new dancers are brought in, the attitudes of the club members transfer to these folks in a heartbeat. They are treated as equals, made to feel special and recruited into all functions of the club. This club grows and prospers because of the individual and collective attitudes of it's members. Attitude of this kind helps a club. Is your attitude helping or hindering your club?

Attitude and the perception of attitude is extremely important. Let me chronicle for you some actual circumstances (horror stories) that I have witnessed at dances that I have called. I have waited and watched while club members refused to fill a square that needed one more couple and then ran out on the floor and made their own square after these three guest couples gave up and walked off the floor. Wow, really makes you want to visit that club again. Another club, that didn't have the best reputation for friendliness to begin with, announced at refreshment time "oh by the way we won't have any refresh-

ments tonight because we had a dinner before the dance so you can stop at a restaurant on your way home". Can you believe what a mountain this little mole hill became? Their attitude should have been more caring - simple cookies and punch would have made everything better. We really need to think before we leap. I called several times for a club whose members didn't dance the first two tips because it took all of them to get the kitchen and refreshments ready. The guests felt very uncomfortable and awkward with this situation. Ah, worse yet, they didn't dance the last two tips because it took all of them to clean up the kitchen and refreshment area. Somehow I believe they were missing the point of making guests feel welcome and putting on a good dance, also the perception of their attitude was not warm and fuzzy. One more and then I will leave you to evaluate the structure of attitude and it's influence on people. I was calling the last tip of a dance and the club members began to take the chairs up and put them in the racks. Now, I have had this happen many times and while it is not a good ending for a dance there is more to this story. There were some guest, who were not dancing the last tip, sitting and waiting for their friends. The club members requested them to stand and took the chairs away and put them in the racks. These folks were left to stand for the remaining time and went home with a very negative reaction to their evening of square dancing. Oh yes, there is more, two club members then came and stood beside the table that my equipment was sitting on and waited there while I finished calling the last tip. They were very impatient as I told everyone good by (no, I had not run over the ending time) and thanked them for coming to the dance. As I was packing up my equipment, they actually lifted the table and held it while I

finished. Was their attitude helping or hindering their club?

You may read these occurrences and say "That never happens in my Club!" You're probably right. They are extreme. But look at the smaller things in your club. How does it treat guests? The Caller? His/her partner? The Club

Officers? Think about it. Does your club have a collective positive attitude in all areas? If not, be sure that others will notice. I say again, attitude and the perception of attitude is extremely important. Is your attitude helping or hindering your club?
