KNOW YOUR CALLER

It was June 1961 and Irv Elias was getting a new class started in Waycross, Georgia. Close friends kept pestering Betty and Dick Barker to give Square Dancing a try. Ralph and Ruth Yermovsky managed to get Betty and Dick out to the first Fun Night. That was it!! Square Dancing had begun for Dick and his lovely wife Betty. From then on Dick did the picking up of riders to insure being on time, and staying until the end.

The class consisted of ten lessons. Dick, a traveling salesman by profession, missed two classes and the Graduation Dance. However, Irv and Betty Elias put the students through with determination, and at the end, although Irv and Betty had aged considerably, a class of excellent dancers emerged.

Betty and Dick took their dancing seriously. The Waycross club was growing and Irv Elias was beginning to spread out with his Calling dates. Irv needed local help, so Dick began to study in order to help with classes when Irv was away.

Working with a pre-teen and teenage club, and a group of very faithful friends in garages, living rooms, and on patios or anywhere a square could find room, Dick slowly began acquiring a knowledge and a talent. The hour was never too late nor the location too inconvenient for Dick to help those interested, and improve his own stature as a young and "coming" caller.

The year 1963 was a big one for Dick! That summer Dick helped Irv teach the first Square Dance Class in Brunswick, Georgia. From this class the Golden Isles Swingers came into being. The club was new, the dancers inexperienced, and Dick hardly dry behind the ears -- but they worked together, played together, and have stayed together.

Halloween night of 1963 Dick, as Club Caller, called his first complete club dance and it was for the Golden Isles Swingers. Since that night this club has danced three Saturday nights each month, plus numerous special dances in Brunswick, St. Simons Island, Jekyll Island and various camp sites. Dick was always there to give us a good dance.

In addition to being the club caller for the Brunswick club, Dick has taught classes for five different clubs and his calling engagements have carried him into four states.

In 1966 "Dicks Club", the Golden Isles Swingers, was accepted as members of the

O.A. Fetch, Resident Manager, Fontana Village Resort, announced the appointment of Mr. Al (Tex) Brownlee, Odessa, Texas, as Recreation Director, effective June 1.

Brownlee is one of the outstanding square dance callers in the United States.

He started as professional caller in 1949, has toured the United States 38 times, and has called in many parts of Canada and Alaska.

He is featured on the Blue Star recording label and has twenty-six records to his credit, as well as four long-playing albums.

He has been on the staff of Lighted Lantern 12 consecutive years and has called for many Associations, Federations, Festivals, State Conventions and National Conventions throughout the United States.

He and his wife, Jean, will move from Texas to the sprawling Great Smoky Mountains Resort to assume his duties on June 1st, the climax of the Resort's Spring Fun Fest, a well established Square Dance Festival held semi-annually at Fontana.

Fontana, by far the largest privately operated resort in the Great Smokies, is famous for its well-rounded recreation program. Square Dancing is featured 3 nights per week throughout the Summer season, and there are 8 weeks of Square Dance Festivals during the Spring and Fall.

The resort, with a strong appeal to the family vacationers, has a capacity of 1,600 guests.

This is rather a lengthy editorial, but we hope everyone will have the time to read it, including the new graduates. It is a good one, therefore we are printing this in its entirety:

A recent editorial in the GRAPEVINE touched on the most perplexing problem in square dancing today, that is, holding on to our dancers. We have been able to have fairly large classes, our callers have done an excellent job of teaching them, but we have fallen down completely in holding them. Naturally there are going to be losses due to health, family reasons, work, etc. but these are minute in relation to the losses due to the unhappy experiences of new dancers after graduation. For one reason or another we simply run them off. When they foul up a square, they frequently get the look, sometimes it is unintentional but nevertheless it is there. Sometimes the new dancer imagines he is getting criticized, but all too often he is well aware of how other dancers are reacting to his goofs.

I think it is fair to say that we are lucky to have 10% of our graduates still with us after a few months. Many of them are gone after the first night. If you don't believe that they are gone in a hurry just look around you. How many of your fellow class members are still dancing? It should shock you. If we had been able to hold just 25% of the graduates of the last five years we would not be worrying about having enough dancers to pay the bills at the Association Dances, but we would be worrying about where to put them. Many of us are aware of the problem but the big question is; What are we going to do about it? The suggested area wide class under sponsorship of the NEFSDA may be a step in the right direction. It cannot cure all of our problems but it may start us on the way to better days if it is handled in the right way.

I would think that such a class would have to be set up as a Beginner Club with their own officers and would be able to run their own affairs under the guidance of the caller. The class would require the services of one of our most experienced callers as teacher. He would be required to give the dancers a thorough grounding in the regular basics. A new or inexperienced caller would probably not meet this need. Too many dancers today are able to do some of the fancier basics that are currently popular after they graduate but fall down badly in their basic square dancing. Therefore, a solid foundation in the more basic of the basics is in order. We should not blame the callers in our classes for this problem as we in the clubs all too often will push the caller to graduate the class in a hurry, therefore, he pushes them through in a hurry and throws all he can at them in an effort to get them ready for the club in a few lessons. It fails completely and the result is another class down the drain within a few weeks after graduation. There are so many new so called basic movements today that it is physically impossible to teach the class all that the average club dances in anything short of college course. This must be controlled in some manner.

If the area wide class is to be successful it will be necessary for ALL DANCERS, ALL CLUBS AND ALL CALLERS to get behind it and make it work. Petty selfishness must be put aside and overall good must be put first. A basic rule that will have to be observed by all is that no club member can be invited to another dance until all of the class is ready to graduate. There can be none of the current tendency to invite the fast learners to go here and there before they are really ready for club dancing. This often kills a class and cannot be permitted. Upon completion of their basic lessons, the dancers will have all of the clubs made available to them. Callers will be expected to help them bridge the gap between class and club with workshops designed to fit the dancers into their own club as smoothly as possible. The dancers will be encouraged to shop around. In this event, the club that exhibits the most old fashioned square dance hospitality and friendliness will very likely obtain the highest percentage of the new dancers.

We must go one step farther at this point. The beginner club should be kept open with dancing to stay at the level reached in class but no advancement beyond this point. Many graduates are self conscious and more practice at class level will increase their confidence and they will move on to club dancing later. Others never will want to go farther and this will be their square dance home. It will also be home to those who try other clubs and find out they cannot make it for one reason or another. Now if a dancer feels he is not ready for club level dancing after graduating, he has no place to go but home and all too many of our new dancers do just that. If they have a place where they can dance at class or fun level, whatever you want to call it, they may be kept in square dancing. Those who want or can dance only once or twice a month will have a place where they can go and be comfortable. Many people have other interests that keep them from dancing often enough to keep up with a present day club and a fun level club would suit their needs perfectly. If we keep more of this type dancer in the picture, all other so called levels of dancing are sure to benefit as some of them will naturally find that they will want to dance the more complicated figures and they will drift to clubs that make it available. If the base is strong, the upper levels of dancing cannot help but be the better for it. This includes all levels right on up to and including the closed clubs that feature the newest and most complicated of dancing. There should be a place where those who have the time and ability as well as desire for such things, that they can find the "way out" material but make it possible for such a club to endure for an extended period, we also need a place for the once a month dancer at the other end.

I must repeat however, if such a program is to work, all of us must take a good hard look at ourselves and make the necessary changes in ourselves and our attitudes to make it work. Selfishness, intolerance, excess demands for new names and so called basics, back-biting and criticism of other dancers, clubs and callers will have to be replaced with just plain friendliness and tolerance of one another and their faults. If we can do this, square dancing can grow in Jacksonville to the point most of us have dreamed about but have not even approached yet.

Other steps that can be taken to help square dancing will include encouraging and helping our callers to improve themselves. We should treat them as the professionals they are and pay them accordingly. They should be helped to attend the clinics that are sponsored by the Florida Callers Association. A very easy and painless way to do this will be for every club to cancel their dances on the third weekend in October so that their caller

will be able to attend. They, the clubs, should be able to pay the caller his regular fee if he attends the clinic. It will be to the benefit of all concerned as they cannot help but learn something from the clinic which will be under the direction of a nationally known caller and teacher. Nearly all callers that do attend these sessions report benefits are many. The Florida Callers Association, the Florida Federation of Square Dancers and the NEFSDA all have gone on record as encouraging all clubs to do this and we in the Northeast can lead the way. It will cost little. The dance that is lost can easily be replaced by a general dance, for all who are interested, and have a caller from outside Florida that will not be at the clinic. Remember, it is the THIRD WEEKEND IN OCTOBER.

The Gateway Callers Association should be encouraged and helped in every way possible to provide a place where novice callers can obtain the help they need to get started right and add to square dancing with their calling and teaching abilities as they themselves grow. We, as dancers, must support the local callers and their Association and not be looking for all of our caller leadership from outside the area.

I repeat again that most important of all is that we must remember we are here to have fun, we must be tolerant of others, remember that all dancers may not necessarily have the same dancing needs as we do ourselves but are still worthy of our respect. There must be room for all levels of dancing and each dancer has to decide for himself what level he wants and not be pressured into something for which he has neither the time nor the ability. In short, "Be Kind to One Another, afterall, this is a recreation and not a struggle for survival.
