MEETING OF MAY 4, 1975:

President, Jim Panipinto presided with all officers present. Roll call indicated, 14 member clubs present, constituting a quorum. The normal business I.E. minutes, Treasurers report & correspondence was dispensed with in normal manner. A report from General Chairman - '75 State Convention - Herman Ibach indicated all committees were working & everything looks fine for the State Convention. There would be exposure on TV 17 midday, May 22 by the Dip 'N Dive Kids. VP, Frank Smith, reported progress for the Fall Roundup. He stated the ribbons would be white & gold, the slogan would be "REMEMBER NOVEMBER". dates are Nov. 7 & 8, 1975. Civic Auditorium. George Ephren reported on 5th Saturday Dance. Questionnaires mailed regarding a caller for Nov. was talleyed & Bobby Keefe was selected. The Chair recognized several for discussion. topics were Round Dance Instructors status with reference to callers. Bow & Swing listings & West-ernaires stated they wanted to hold a dance with proceeds going to a bullet proof vest for police officers. A monetary gift was voted in Memorial to Mary Horton. Gift to go to Gateway Girl Scout Council to send a de serving Girl Scout to Leadership School at Green Cove Springs. Mary & her Father, Jesse were killed in an auto accident near Interlachen. They were Square Dancers & the daughter & husband of Phyllis Horton, Square Dance Caller.

A final bit of business was offered by Frank Smith with reference to the Fall Roundup; He & the committee suggested that in order to raise necessary monies for a successful dance, it would be good to have a professional person handle the program & promotion. he was in contact with the necessary person who could take this in hand & if successful, we could recognize definate profit this year. The members after discussion passed this suggestion.

QUARTERLY MOVEMENTS NEWS RELEASE

The Callerlab Quarterly Movements Committee has announced that there will be no movements selected for July, August & September, 1975.

When the Committee was originally formed with Jack Lasry, Miami, Florida, as Chairman, it was decided that no more than 2 movements would be suggested by the Committee for mainstream dancing in any 1 quarter. During the December 1974 to March 1975 quarter the movement "Coordinate" was selected as a single selection. Now, for the first time, because the Committee members who voted were not strongly supporting any 1 or 2 movements, the quarterly movements, clearing house suggests NO QUARTERLY MOVEMENTS for the next 3 months period.

In lieu of new material the Committee suggests that during the summer months workshop on the existing quarterly movements, Recycle, Walk & Dodge, Coordinate, Transfer the Column & Half Tag, Trade & Roll & drill on any of the 75 Basics.

To those who might be disappointed in not having the maximum number of new movements presented each quarter, it should be pointed out that it would be relatively simple for the committee to suggest 1 or 2 of the dozen new figures recently invented. The Committee deserves special credit for its restraint & for adhering to the purpose of the clearing house..to suggest 1 or 2 movements when, in the judgement of a majority of the committee members, there are movements warranting this special attention.
