KNOW YOUR CALLER



This is a space reserved for all callers in the Northeast Florida Square Dance Association who are calling for a square dance club at the present time or have called for one. We want to make all square dancers familiar with the many callers, so, please callers, send us your stories of your calling life!

The Hidding's square dancing career started in 1963 in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida by attending a class taught by Vern Johnson, currently Vice President of the Florida Callers Association. Upon graduation, Tom and Mariann became charter members of the new club Shirts 'N Skirts, later to become the second Presidents of the club. It was during this term of office that the calling bug struck them.

One of the special parties the club had was an "Amateur Callers Night". They each learned a singing call and they were on their way.

Later the same year (1964) the Hidding's were transferred to Jacksonville. They joined the Friendly Frolics and Jubileers to acquaint themselves with the local square dancers and continue dancing. And through the graciousness of Herschel Lee and Harold Pillmore and other callers, they were given the opportunity for much practice.

In the summer of 1965, Lil Tom felt he wanted to learn how to call also, however, Mom and Dad insisted that he learn to dance first. He was enrolled in a class under Johnny Robbins at the Hay-Stack Hoppers. He was learning to call and dance at the same time. By February 1966 Johnny Robbins retired from the club and Lil Tom became their caller. He finished teaching and graduated the class that he was enrolled in.

Square dancing goes back a long way in Mariann's family as her father was a caller some forty years ago and retired about twenty five years ago. Whenever the Hiddings are visiting with her parents in Iowa, of course the conversation has much to do with square dancing. Lil Tom has on tape some of the calls that were used back in the t era.

The Hidding's have traveled to each State Convention, each Knothead Konvention, two National Conventions and most of the Florida Callers Clinics since then. In June the Hiddings will attend their third National Convention in Omaha, Nebraska. Mariann has been invited to model one of her own creations in the CALLER'S WIVES FASHION SHOW. Mariann will also appear on a panel discussion with the topic "The Role of a Teenager in the Square Dance Picture". Tom is to be a panelist also, and his topic will be "How to get Teen Dancing Going and keep it going". Tom will also have a halfhour work shop using the Spin figures (Spin the Top, Spin Chain Through and Spin a Web). All three Hiddings will appear on the program in various calling duties.

Currently, Lil Tom calls for the Teen Star Twirlers, a teen club of approximately 40 members. Mariann and Tom call for the Jax 'N Jills and Mandarin Promenaders, two pre-teen clubs with approximately 40 members in each club. Recently Tom and Mariann were selected to teach the class for the Western Cutters. All this calling amounts to three nights a week and each minute is an enjoyable challenge. In addition Tom and Mariann try to dance at least one night a week.

The Hiddings are each others best critics. When one is calling the other two are trying to find out what they are doing wrong. An interesting side light is the fact that each one has different tastes in music and nobody uses each others records. In fact, if they want to call together they have a hard time to select a suitable hoe-down that all can use.

This is an interesting family and every square dancer should meet them! They are outstanding anywhere on the dance floor.

AN EDITORIAL

For some time now, and this means back a few years, square dance basic classes have been getting larger, and we are still faced with the problem of new graduates not becoming full fledged square dancers, that is, dropping out before they have time to really find out what this form of recreation is all about.

Let's explore some of these reasons and then see if we can delve into some remedies. Talking with the graduates themselves and the Callers who have taught them we have come up with some pretty good interviews.

Usually a square dance class will go through sixteen to twenty weeks of lessons and then turned loose. With their confidence built up and a diploma in their hand they start probably in a club where their former teacher is doing the calling. These are really the trying days of a novice square dancer. If one person of the "team" isn't interested in dancing they will soon drop out. Their "obligation" has been met, and they have learned to square dance. A teacher can pick this kind out before the lessons are finished. With young people there may not be enough of the same age group which means they have nothing in common, or the family may yet be increasing. The caller teaches his class only basics and at a tempo that his pupils can understand. When they graduate they find that he is calling things they never heard of and at a tempo that prevents them from thinking and doing at the same time. The caller and the square dancers themselves don't want the "level" of the club downgraded. Consequently the new dancers wonder what they really have learned in those weeks of instruction.

What is a square dance "level". Some people define it as a dancing perfection. Others as a knowledge of advance steps. However, square dancing is fun and some have more time to practice at it than others.

And then of course, along with all this confusion of tempo, new calls, etc. comes embarrassing remarks from other dancers. The club members themselves sometimes are guilty of discouraging new members by their own reaction toward them.

Now we have looked at some of the more numerous reasons - what can we do? First, during those 16 or 20 lessons the caller or instructor more or less has to prepare his class on the same tempo as he uses for his club. But in several clubs the club dancers are accustomed to dancing more than "basics" and either the teacher has to prepare these graduates for the steps the club can dance or else start the club over from scratch and again teach everyone all the steps over again that he has not taught the class. Get the picture? It is lengthy and complicated and gets plenty discouraging to new dancers.

The association is developing an idea where there would be one class going for basics for 16 or 20 weeks. This would be for all new students in the Northeast Florida area. At the time of graduation they could choose their club or caller and go into another class for beginners or "intermediates". This would be an advanced class for another certain number of weeks. By the time this was over we should have some dancers who really enjoy their dancing and can have lots of fun. Workshops should be more numerous in our field of square dancing. We would enjoy knowing your thoughts on these ideas, so either write to your editors or president of the NEFSDA, Bob Ross at 3931 Bogota Drive North, Jacksonville 32210.

We understand that there is a caller who is mapping out plans to start a club sometime in July in which it will be exclusively for square dancers who have been out a long time, or can't go dancing very often, or new graduates. How he is planning this club we'll have to wait and see.
