Herman Ibach gave a final report on the 1974 State Convention & asked the NE to attend in large numbers. He also gave a progress report on the 1975 convention which will be held in Jacksonville.

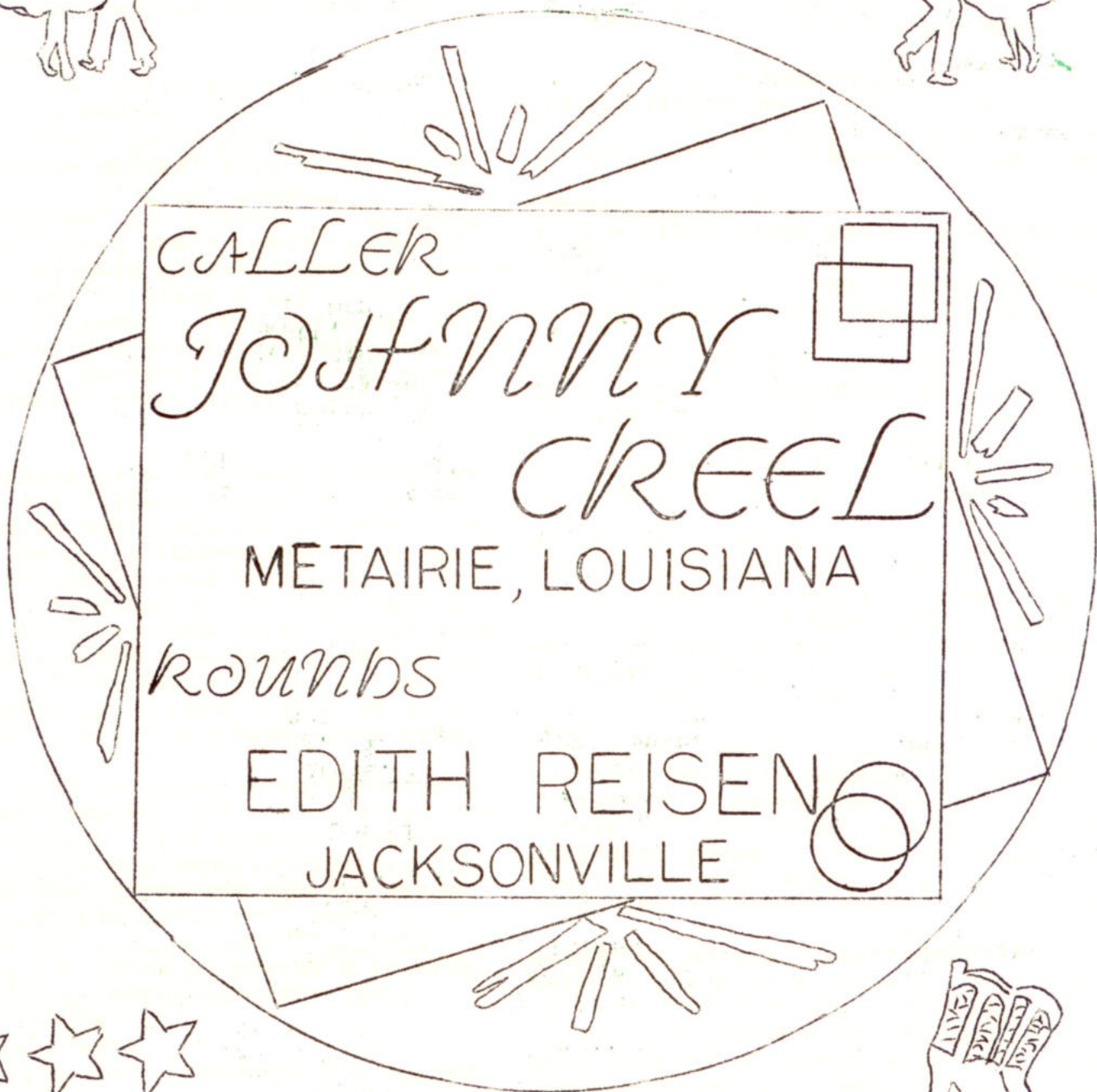

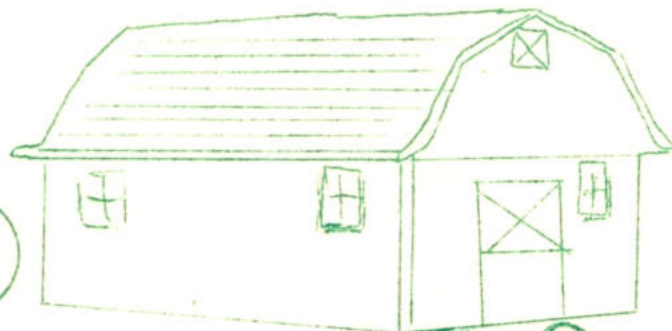

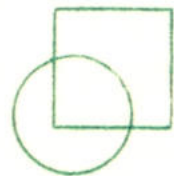
